## Importantes Arrestos

TIJUANA, MEXICO.- Moviéndose de prisa para acallar las acusaciones norteamericanas sobre colusión de funcionarios mexicanos en la fuga de un sospechoso del secuestro de un agente norteamericano anti-narcóticos, la Policía Federal Judicial mexicana anunció el arresto de cuatro sospechosos.

La Policía Federal dijo que uno de los sospechosos, Tomás Morlet, es un sospechoso importante en el caso. Los otros dos sospechosos fueron identificados como Eduardo Ramírez y Enrique González.

Un vocero policial dijo que fueron arrestados en un camino entre Tijuana y Mexicali. El anuncio de los arrestos se hizo después de que el jefe del Departamento Norteamericano de Control de Drogas Francis M. Muller Jr. afirmara en Washington que Rafael Caro-Quintero, un importante sospechoso del secuestro de Enrique Camarena Salazar, pudo abordar un avión que salía de Guadalajara a pesar de

## Fin de Chequeos en la Frontera

WASHINGTON, D.C.-El Grupo congressional Fronterizo, formado por legisladores norteamericanos de partidos, escribió al Presidente Ronald Reagan demandando el final de la inspección de los autos que está "paralizando la frontera".

El embajador mexicano Jorge Espinosa de Los Reyes se reunió con el subsecretario de Estado Kenneth Dam y le entregó una nota de protesta expresando "profunda preocupación" por los registros de cada auto que llega a la frontera.

La nota de protesta mexicana se queja de que los registros, fueron iniciados "sin consulta o aviso previo" a México.

"Medidas unilaterales como éstas sólo causan irritación innecesaria para los residentes de las ciudades fronterizas en ambos países y no resuelven el problema", añade.

El portavoz de Estado Edward Djerejian dijo que "claro, se dará gran atención a la nota del embajador".

## Hablan Reagan y de la Madrid

MEXICO, D.F.- El Presidente de México, Miguel de la Madrid, se entrevistó telefónicamente en días pasados con su homólogo de Estados Unidos, Ronald Reagan, sentaron las bases para llegar a un acuerdo sobre la vigilancia en la frontera que está ocasionando serios trastornos a los dos países.

De la Madrid dijo a Reagan "que la sobre vigilancia extrema en los puntos fronterizos estaba dañando seriamente la relación en ambas partes de la frontera", según un comunicado dado a conocer por la presidencia.

La Aduana norteamericana puso en parte fin hace unos días a la exhaustiva revisión -- en 21 puestos fronterizos desde California a Texas -- de autos que han entrado a Estados Unidos en un intento por intensificar la búsqueda del agente del Departamento de Represión de Drogas secuestrado hace dos semanas en Guadalajara, al noroeste de la capital mexicana.

## Discriminación En Viviendas

### Hispanos y Negros Segregados

DALLAS.- A pesar de las leyes federales contra la discriminación, la mayoría de los 10 millones de personas que viven en casas financiadas por el gobierno son segregadas por razas, con los blancos en mejor situación que los negros y los hispanos, de acuerdo a una información publicada en el Dallas Morning News.

Casi todos los proyectos visitados por los reporteros y que estaban ocupados por blancos, tenían mucha mejor situación, incluyendo servicios y amenidades, que aquellos en los cuales viven negros o hispanos.

El Dallas Morning News señaló que había conducido una investigación visitando sus reportes.

El News afirma que sus investigaciones, basadas en el documento federal, entrevistas y documentos obtenidos mediante el Acta de Libertad de Información, muestra que el propio gobierno patrocina caminos de discriminación.

Igualmente se afirma que duante la investigación no encontró un solo proyecto que estuviera completamente integrado en donde las condiciones fueran las mismas para blancos y negros que vivieran en proyectos separados.

El periódico afirma que el Departamento de Viviendas y Desarrollo Urbano es responsable por ignorar casi constantemente las denuncias de segregación ilegal en los proyectos administrativos por los gobiernos locales.

El periódico explica que los blancos ocupan cerca del 63 por ciento de todas las viviendas subsidiadas por el gobierno y el 45 por ciento ocupadas por ancianos.

Según el periódico, la Agencia Federal de Viviendas ha reducido considerablemente el dinero y el número de empleados para investigaciones sobre discriminación y que en 1984 sólo se vieron cinco casos de discriminación, n descenso del 90 por ciento en relación con el año anterior.

Denuncian Informe Sobre Derechos Humanos:

## Represión, Desapariciones y Crímenes Político en Mexico

WASHINGTON.- Las desapariciones, crímenes políticos y torturas se citan como elementos preocupantes en el apartado que dedica a México el informe anual del Departamento de Estado norteamericano sobre los Derechos Humanos en el mundo.

El informe, recoge la "Preocupación" de Amnistía Internacional y el Comité Nacional de Defensa de Presos, perseguidos y Desaparecidos, que presentó en junio pasado una lista de 455 personas desaparecidas entre 1969 y 1982 y otra con 40 supuestas víctimas encarceladas clandestinamente en prisiones estatales en los últimos años.

El gobierno de Miguel de la Madrid dice el informe ha negado las acusaciones y realirado que no permitirá que se cometan atropellos de este tipo.

El documento norteamericano afirma también que el Comité alegó que el número actual de presos políticos en ese país es de 315 de los cuales 258 han sido encarcelados por el actual gobierno, en su mayoría campesinos envueltos en disputas de tierras.

También dice quevarias organizaciones de derechos humanos siguen haciendo eco de arrestos arbitrarios, especialmente de opositores al gobierno, organizaciones sindicales y campesinas.

"El gobierno se esforzó en 1984 para frenar el mal uso de la autoridad policial", señala el informe, pero agrega que muchos dirigentes locales no parecen compartir el rigor y acción de crímenes políticos "perpetrados por fuerzas de seguridad locales y civiles armados, contra campesinos envueltos en disputas de tierras".

Varias organizaciones denunciaron que al menos 69 campesinos fueron asesinados en 1984 en enfrentamientos ocurridos en los estados de Chiapas, Veracruz, Puebla, Hidalgo, Sonora, Oaxaca y Guanajuato.

El departamento de Estado menciona también el asesinato de nueve miembros de una organización agraria de izquierda y el de cuatro afiliados al Partido Socialista Unificado.

Además, se hace eco de las denuncias de tortura que alegan organizaciones humanitarias, contra presos políticos y delincuentes comunes.

When President Reagan announced that one of the first civilians in space would be a teacher, I gave the news no more than a passing nod.

I'm one of those people singularly uninterested in space, especially the space program. If little green men came down and told me I had just won an all-expenses paid trip to Pluto, I'd turn them down, not out of fear, but out of indifference. Space, big deal.

So imagine my surprise when my mother—whom I always perceived as a peer as far as interest in space—informed me that she'd written a letter of intent to NASA. ("Dear Mr. President: I want to fly.") She has been a teacher for more years than I care to count.

I confess, the thought of my roly-poly mom bouncing around in zero gravity on the screens of zillions of televisions worldwide did not go down well. Though it might have a certain "homespun" value for NASA publicists, I worried about more

mundane things: Could they powder black beans and rice? What if she couldn't get her sugar quota? We're Cubans, after all, and sugar is god and devil in one.

Besides, after Tom Wolfe's "The Right Stuff" and Jack Nicholson in "Terms of Endearment," I've never been too trusting of astronauts.

But I did try to be supportive ("¿Pero, Mami, tú estás loca?"). It tried to view it as a special adventure and milestone for her as a woman ("¿La menopausia?").

But still it bothered me. It bothered me even more when it got out to my friends.

Once, in a discussion on a vaguely scientific topic, a friend suddenly exclaimed: "Call your mother, the astronaut. She knows about these things."

On another occasion, I was playing Trivial Pursuit when another player started giggling as he answered. "Your mother's colleague," he laughed as he responded, "John Glenn!"

Let me quickly add that I'm not the only one in the family with doubts about all this. My father, for example, thinks it a mad scheme. He expressed his thoughts in a recent call, a marvel of communications in which my mother position themselves at different phone extensions at home and talk to each other while I listen, long distance. An expensive way to fill in the space between my hello and good-bye, but my mom's into space. What can I say?

"Alicia," my father said, "this is crazy. You're a Spanish teacher. They're going to pick somebody who knows about science, like a physics or chemistry teacher."

"Don't be silly," replied my mother. "What physics or chemistry teacher is going to know more than an astronaut? They're going to pick somebody for public relations. They pick me and all of Latin America will be happy. That's most of the Third World. It'll keep some of

those rebellions down for awhile."

"Alicia, you're 54 years old."

"Imagine the delight of the senior citizens," my mother continued.

"You have arthritis."

"Think of the experiments they can do."

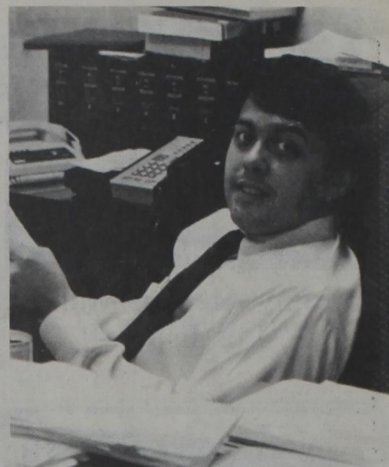
Needless to say, she's undaunted.

Now don't get me wrong. I'm not against my mother in space because I think she should be home sweeping and dusting. Long before it was popular, my mother was bringing in half—and sometimes more—of the family's slice of American bacon. This is old hat with her and us.

To tell the truth, I'm not really against my mother in space as much as I'm just uncomfortable with the idea.

I worry about her. I mean, how would you feel if your mother (if you're Hispanic, make that your saintly mother) spent a couple of nights with three complete strangers thousands of miles from home?
