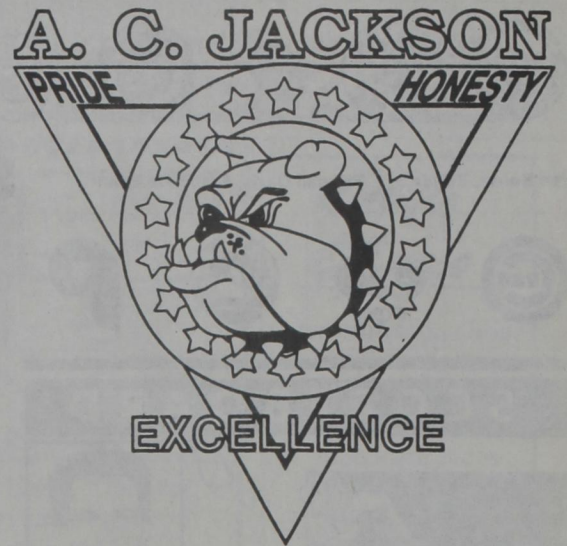

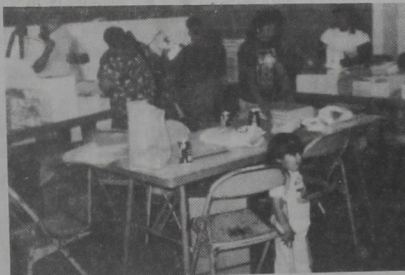

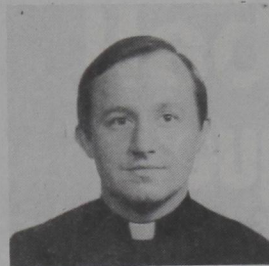

Slaton Takes On Soviets--In Phy Ed

Students at O J Slaton are competing against the Soviet Union.

World War III? A junket to sunny Moscow in the summertime?

No.

But the physical education students at 32nd Street junior high school were selected by officials of the Lubbock Independent School District to compete against physical fitness achievements of Soviet students.

The competition consists of running, jumping, throwing, swimming and specific exercising. Records of the students, individually and collectively, then will be compared with those of Soviet students.

"We've already started the competition," said Slaton physical education instructor Larry Barker.

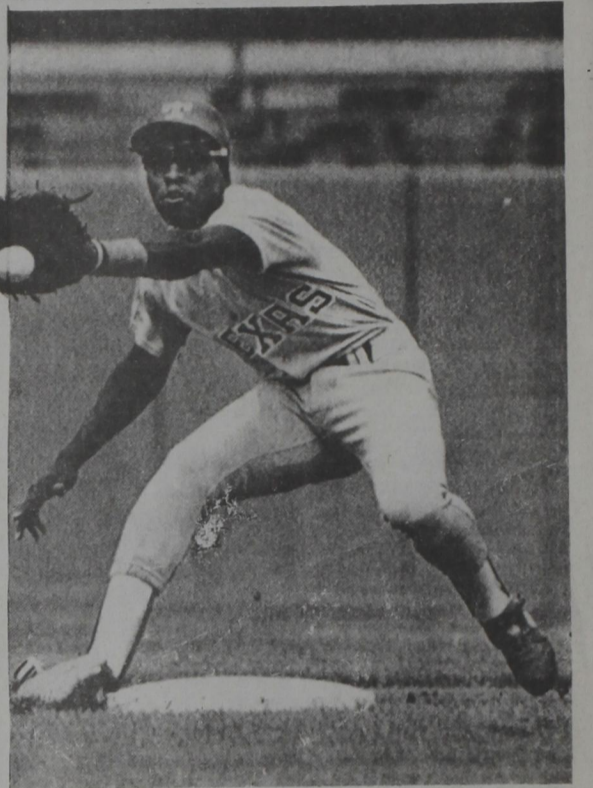
"So far, some of our performances are not up to par. They (the Soviet students) have better times in the dashes, like the 60 meter run. But I'm sure we can catch up."

The tests, Barker said, will end April 26.

In essence, the competition is a physical fitness exchange program.

Thirteen Texas schools districts are participating in the program, which is part of an agreement signed in February by the President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports and the Soviet counterpart.

The exchange program provides for an exchange of physical education literature, teachers, youth delegations, sports medicine and physical fitness research data.

Jayhawks Upset Winners

All America Danny Manning scored 31 points, grabbed 18 rebounds and made two crucial late free throws to lead Kansas to an upset 83-79 victory over Big 8 Conference rival Oklahoma and win the 1988 NCAA basketball championship.



The game was the third championship game played between two teams from the same conference, and the result marked the third time in the 80s that the underdog won.

Oklahoma, eight point betting favorites, beat Kansas twice during the regular season.

The game was played before a national television audience in Kemper Arena in Kansas City, Missouri, only about 35 miles from the Kansas campus.

Another SWC Scandal?

When are the powers that be in the Southwest Conference going to get serious about their schools' scandal plagued athletic programs?

The latest muddy boot fell Tuesday when the National Collegiate Athletic Association, the nation's intercollegiate sports governing body, alleged that Texas A&M committed 31 rules violations and seven procedural violations in its football program.

The allegation bring to nine the number of SWC schools whose football programs have been investigated. Only Arkansas, Baylor and an academic institution, Rice, have not been subject to football violations.

The most serious charge involves an unnamed Aggie coach who allegedly lied to NCAA investigators.

The usual suspects of SWC recruiting violations were alleged by NCAA investigators--recruits

or recruits' family members received or were offered cash, loans, clothes, medical services and legal services by recruiters associated with the Aggie football program.

Since hiring Athletic Director and Head Coach Jackie Sherrill in the early 80s for a reported million

dollar plus annual salary, the Aggies have risen to SWC football prominence.

John David Crow, the only Aggie who ever won the Heisman Award and an A&M associate athletic director, said "I'm embarrassed that any of the allegations are true, but I guess I've got to accept that."

The NCAA began investigating the Aggie football program in the fall of 1985.

In December of 1985, the Dallas Times Herald reported widespread rules and recruiting violations in the university's football program, but an internal investigation by school officials uncovered only three minor NCAA rules violations.
