

How Uncle Sam Measures Snow

Following snows of this winter, when the depth of snowfall as measured at the Big Spring bureau of the U. S. weather service was published a number of people were of the opinion the measurement was incorrect.

ncorrect.
The snow, as measured, "in the paper" was not "deep enough."
John A. Cummings, sperintendto outline the methods used in computing depths of snowfall.

His statement follows: The accurate measurement of the depth of snowfall is very diffi-cult unless it is possible to make he measurements in a large open

lield. "Even then it is necessary nake several measurements, disarding those that obviously are eroneous, and taking an average of

hose that seem nearest correct, "On a small town lot the nearby buildings, fences and trees make an accurate reading of the snow impossible. Contrary to popular ba-lief the snow drifts on the leeward instead of the windward side of an obstruction, Because of this the average person will, when he makes n attempt to mea e the snowfall select a place to the leeward of a fence or building and the resulting

measurement is too great.
"The reason that snow piles up n the leeward eide of an obstreuion is easy to understand. If the vind is from the north, passing over a board fence running east and west, it will create an area of dead or calm air immediately to the south of the fence. As the snow is borne over the fence it settles into the spot of calm air and forms slight drift.

The average person will make his measurements in such a spot and this accounts for the fact that the official measurements are al-ways less than those made by the nan in the street."




