THE PROBLEM WITH this type of rhetoric is that there are unbalanced types in our society who usually are the very ones who want to believe that all their problems in

very ones who want to believe that all their problems in life are someone else's fault—most likely someone who doesn't deserve to be here in the first place. So could I have seen someone take Peck too literally? Of course. There are some people who like to send me anny-mous messages who I could easily envision taking Peck's talk seriously; and who are probably seriously upset now

that he issued an apology.

This is the ugly mood that our society has sunk to in the past couple of years, and the mood to which some politi-cians are more than willing to pander with their political rhetoric when it comes to the upcoming election cycle.

In short, the problem isn't that Peck made a tacky joke (I make grotesque comments all the time myself, sometimes even in my copy published by this weblog). It's that some people are more than eager to accept such humor with a

straight-race.


