Corridos: Portraits of the Revolution

Reflections of the Mexican and the history of Mexico are mirrored in the lyrics of the corrido, whose popularity escalated during the Mexican Revolution. Praising the heroes and the heroines of the Revolution, immortalizing the ideals of the Indian and mestizo population; the corrido became closely associated with political events as well as social unrest. The corrido has its roots in the copla, the traditional folk song of Mexico which became popular because of the traditional themes found throughout its verses. Differing in subject, as well as in length, and usually no longer than eight verses, the copla frequently expressed disillusionment. From this popular folksong the corrido with its own distinct traits developed, emphasizing the disenchantment of the people and characterizing the Mexican Revolution. The lyrics in the corrido are sung epically in first or third person by a participant, witness, or a very well-informed person. (1)

Corridos flourished during the Revolution using many old melodies with new lyrics varying throughout the countryside. "La Cucaracha", one of the most popular corridos from the Revolutionary period is a modification of a folk song from Spain and is a good example of these variations. (2) "La Cucaracha", although light in spirit, voices the displeasure of the people over the escalating prices of food and goods throughout the Porfiriato. This ballad had its debut in 1914 in Monterrey, Nuevo Leon when it was sung by a Spanish newspaperman, Sanchez Escobar, during a party at the home of Pablo Gonzales, a Constitutionalist. (3)

The corridos such as "La Cucaracha" echoed the many changes Mexico had undergone in the thirty-four years prior to the Revolution. These changes achieved at the expense of the poor in the rural and urban areas,

were the product of Díaz's dictatorship. In the rural areas prices continually rose, keeping the peones continuously in debt to the Tienda de Raya, the country store found on all haciendas. This debt peonage prevented the peón and his family from leaving the *hacienda* and improving their way of living.

In the urban areas the lower classes survived on a meager diet and living conditions were unsanitary resulting in a life expectancy of about thirty years, with an infant mortality rate of thirty percent. (4) Regardless of the poverty, starvation, and illness, a middle class emerged. This younger generation of young intellectuals recognized the price Mexico had paid for the progress that occurred during the Porfiriato. The conditions in Mexico and Díaz's ill treatment of the people and their desire to instigate a change terminating Díaz's dictatorship formed the lyrics of corridos which became prevalent in Mexico.

(7) For the next five years Huerta would use assassination to silence those who protested his dictatorial actions. These incidents are all included in corridos. (8) Huerta's government was opposed by the northern Constitutionalists: Coahuila Governor Venustiano Carranza, Pancho Villa in Chihuahua, and Alvaro Obregón in Sonora. In the south, Emiliano Zapata was determined to continue his rebellion dedicated to agrarian reform. Huerta's dictatorship ended due to United States intervention during Woodrow Wilson's term in office as President. So angry were the Mexican people over the bloodshed caused by the United States at Veracruz that American businesses were ravaged and tourists threatened. Following the intervention, social unrest and violence permeated Mexico once again when the northern and southern delegates meeting in Aguascalientes to implement a provisional government

Bernardo Reyes and his Registas, the Vasquistas led by Emilio Vasquez Gomez and finally Pascual Orozco and his Plan Orozquista dated March 15, 1912. Madero would lose control of the government following the Decena Trágica, a ten day battle fought inside Mexico City resulting in thousands of civilian casualties.

(6) The final blow came when Victoriano Huerta, appointed by Madero to defend the National Palace against the insurgents, decided to change sides, joining the rebel forces against Madero. The American Ambassador, Henry Lane Wilson was present during the negotiation of this agreement which is known as the Pact of the Embassy. Shortly after the negotiations Huerta ordered General Aureliano Blanquet to arrest Madero and vice-president Pino Suarez and secure their resignations. On February 21, 1913, while being transferred to federal prison, Madero and Suarez were assassinated.

In October of 1910 Francisco Madero met with his supporters in San Antonio, Texas, to formulate the Plan de San Luis Potosí and November 20, 1910, was designated as the day the Mexican Revolution would begin. The Revolution acutally began two days earlier in Puebla where Aquiles Serdan would be surprised by Diaz's police at his home where ammunition for the Revolution was stored. Other confrontations and various battles took place before Madero's successful onslaught on May 10, 1911, which is the theme of the corrido "La Toma de Ciudad Juarez". (5)

Madero's victory was short-lived when the Plan de San Luis Potosí supported economic and political reform but neglected the social reform the masses called out for. Madero would come under attack during the next two years by Zapata who demanded agrarian reform in his Plan de Ayala, General

failed to unite.

There has been much written on the revolutionary forces of the Northern and Southern armies, their leaders and the great loss of life that occurred during these years. The Mexican Revolution was the most important force in Mexico existing in the core of the society and in the hearts of the people, it was an instrument of change. The revolutionary armies attracted husbands, father, and sons, which left the women to tend to their families, manage family business affairs, and struggle for survival. These women were left to cope with starvation and abuse of the rebel armies moving throughout Mexico.

One phenomenon that occurred in the rural and urban lower classes made the Mexican Revolution unique. The Revolution of 1910 gave women new roles in Mexican society along with the right to bear arms. Women in the rural areas had seldom been out of their villages or away from their families. They were uneducated but determined to end the anguish they were experiencing in their villages. This determination resulted in a move to free themselves and join the revolution. Women soldiers, assuming various roles, came to fight alongside men in the revolutionary and federal armies.

Women warriors were generally termed *soldaderas* (female soldiers) or *galletas* (cookies); however, the women who assumed the role of nurses were called *Adelitas*. Women also worked as clerks and secretaries, scouted for military intelligence, and smuggled in ammunition. Advances in technology associated with the industrial revolution rendered women as capable as men. The major weapons used in the Revolution were German Mausers and Winchester .30-30s smuggled in from the United States and very effective at short range, even in the inexperienced hands of women.

Justice Is Still a WHITE Male Preserve

There's a scene in "The Life and Times of Harvey Milk" -- the Oscar-winning documentary about the openly gay San Francisco supervisor killed by Dan White -- in which a black teenager, musing about White's fluff sentence, asks:

"Can you imagine what I'd get, if I'd done that?"

In another scene, one that might have been scripted for the theater of the absurd, White's lawyers pleaded diminished mental capacity because of a steady diet of junk food. The press dubbed it "The Twinkie Defense," and improbably, it worked.

Dan White (his name like a reading primer archetype) got seven years for voluntary manslaughter instead of first degree murder, the original charge. Although he pleaded a psychiatric defense, White received no counseling in prison, and five years after walking into Soledad, he walked out free on parole.

Imagine that black teenage in White's place, his trigger finger the reason for the death of the mayor of San Francisco and a supervisor. Imagine a lawyer representing him so creatively that "The Twinkie Defense" might inspire him to new legal lows...that a jury would buy it... that the charges would be reduced...that he'd be free, without public apology, remorse or counseling, in five years time...

Gary Dotson is a conspirator of sorts with Dan White. Everybody's favorite celebrity rapist, Dotson's accuser recanted. Illinois Gov. Jim Thompson held much-television hearings and, although (by the guy's own admission) the evidence against Dotson was stronger than before the recantation, the sandy-haired white boy from the suburbs was set free. The conviction stands, reasoned the governor, but the poor man had served enough time for violent rape (six years).

Now Dotson is feted by the networks and furnished his home, paid for with a gift from his former accuser -- an advance check for her story "in the low five figures."

Imagine that black teenager accused of rape getting only six years jail time. Imagine his accuser recanting...and anyone caring enough to listen...the authorities moving with such speed to release him...that same guv, finding him guilty,

commuting his sentence to time served...

If this weren't enough, listen to this story, recently reprinted in Ann Landers' column: Kentucky Gary Pearl, 39, is receiving workman's compensation and state subsidized medical expenses for work-related strain and stress caused by working with black people. Furthermore, the state of Kentucky claims that Pearl should be given a new job, if necessary, in an all-white environment.

Now imagine that black teenager asking the state to provide support while he got over fear of violence by white people. Or asking for medical expenses from strain caused by institutional racism and prejudices...or compensation for lack of equal opportunity...or damages for always being in a culturally white-dominant society...

How would that black teenager fare?

There is a kind of justice, it seems, that is done with mirrors. Yes, Alice, The White Knight is talking backwards.

In this world, where reality is, like the Red Queen, on its head, then the sentence fits the crime: White after all, shot a queer who frustrated and threatened him; Dotson, if he raped Cathleen Crowell Webb at all, gave her what she deserved -- she's pretty flaky anyway; and Pearl, poor man, obviously just got fed up.

In the meanwhile, George Moscone and Milk are dead, the evidence against Dotson mounts and more than a quarter of the nation's population is accused of causing mental illness by its mere existence.

After Dan White was released, Scott Smith, Milk's former lover, said of White, "He'll always be looking over his shoulder; he'll always sit with his back to the wall."

White was finally overwhelmed. He took his own life a few weeks ago, poisoned by carbon monoxide in his San Francisco home.

That black teenager lives and endures -- like the rest of us: Hispanics, Asians, Jews, American Indians, women, gays, the disabled, the poor -- forced sometimes to look over his shoulder, on a different kind of parole, the one that requires no crime or conviction. Just hate.

Además, el Estado de Kentucky alega que a Pearl debiera proporcionársele un nuevo empleo, deseo necesario, en un ambiente completamente blanco.

Ahora imaginense a aquel adolescente negro vive y aguanta - como el resto de nosotros: Los hispanos, asiáticos, judíos, indios norteamericanos, mujeres, gays, desventajados, pobres - a veces forzados a mirar por encima de su hombro, en una clase distinta de libertad condicional: La que no exige delito ni declaración de culpabilidad, solamente odio.
