Congratulations Mayor Robertson!

Our guess is that Mayor Tom Martin woke up on Sunday morning with a lot of questions about why he had lost his bid for a third term and especially why he had lost by such a wide margin

Perhaps we won't ever learn the answers to those questions, but it is pretty clear to us that Lubbock voters, at least the ones who took time out to cast their vote, were just not happy with the Mayor and did not want to follow him in the direction he was intent on going.

In post election interviews on local television stations, it seemed that Martin was

reluctant to state the obvious; that Lubbock voters had rejected his insistence that he knew best what the city needed and he wasn't going to change a thing. He spoke about how the city was well positioned for the growth it has experienced

and will experience in the future and how he wasn't sure what new direction residents had voted for.

But that wasn't why he lost, perhaps he lost because the electorate saw the city grow

ing too fast and having to pay dearly to accommodate that growth?

There are always a couple of main issues or hot buttons that motivate people to vote for or against a candidate. In this race, it seemed that Robertson hit upon both when he targeted the issues of one billion dollars worth of city debt and rising water rates

Those two issues seemed to capture the voter's attention allowing Robertson to gain the momentum and never look back

the momentum and never look back.

For our Hispanic community, we think that it was the high water bills and the Mayor's disregard for the needs in the community. Glen Robertson attended the Tejano Democrats Forum; Martin did not. Robertson also attended an Arnett Bens ighborhood Association meeting last year to discuss the possible closing of the city health department; Martin did not

What is interesting to note here is that even though he must have been exhausted the Sunday morning after election night, he still made an effort to attend the $10.00~\mathrm{AM}$ Mass at San Jose Catholic Church to show his appreciation to the community for their

This week, Robertson will attend another Arnett Benson Neighborhood me the new Mayor Elect.

Robertson also seemed to spend more time and gave more thought to answering the juestions related to the Hispanic community in our Candidate Q&A that we published before the election. In our endorsement of Robertson we noted how Martin's nswers seemed robotic and preprogrammed.
While we don't have the complete voting data to show who Hispanics voted fo

predominately Hispanic voting precincts show winning margins ranging from 79% to 85% for Robertson.

And for whatever it means, we also remember that in the 2006 election which Tom Martin lost to former Mayor David Miller, the Hispanic vote also went overwhelmingly for Miller. It also didn't hurt that Robertson had some name recognition in the community

since he had run for the District 1 seat against District 1 Councilman Victor Hernandez in 2010 and almost won that race in a runoff election.

But for the new Mayor, the old adage about being careful what you wish for may ap-

While the city may be weathering the economic downturn better than other cities, we still have our share of problems. We still need to deal with significant infrastructure needs. We need to find a way to address the needs in less affluent areas of the

city. A growing population requires more and more economic and physical resources; resources that do not come cheap. And he must also deal with a city management team that in our opinion has fallen way short when it comes to handling certain problems; the city health department

And then there are the two issues he ran and won on, the debt and water rates. The

debt issue is a long term fix-it project and we hope most people realize that and will be patient and give him time to develop a long term plan to address it. The water rates need a more immediate fix. Month in and month out, residents are getting impatient and grow tired of having to borrow from Peter to pay Paul. As the new Mayor goes forward in developing his plans on how to address the needs in the new fixed part of the project of th

in the community we hope he doesn't forget or disregard the Hispanic community and the needs in the barrios and those of Hispanic small businesses. We hope he does not disregard the need for economic development and rezoning in some areas that are always seen as easy neighborhoods to put environmental hazards

like cement plants in. We hope he does not disregard the deterioration in the neighborhoods and that he makes sure that city management becomes more accessible to the Hispanic commu nity when it comes to listening to their needs and communicating what is going on at

We feel that the new Mayor already understands the needs in the community and

look forward to working with him in different capacities to keep the community in formed about the important decisions made by the Lubbock City Council.

Dwight Fullingim, a retired petroleum engineer who had run for Congress in 2008 against Randy Neugebauer for the 19th Congressional Congression 2008. for the 19th Congressional seat, won 13.3% of the vote just enough to force a runoff in this year's race. In May 2010, Beane was also

In May 2010, Beane was also involved in a 2010 Runoff with Gary Bell who won 32% of 6,836 votes to Beane's 45% of the vote and Tom Kiesling's 23%. The highly competitive nature of the 2012 race, caused a 21.7% turnout of the 24,754 voters registered in District 4, nightest turnout of any race in the city and county. In District 6, attorney Latrelle Joy garnered 1,381 votes (53.6%) to 1,194 (46.4% of a total 2,576 votes cast or 14.0% of 18,425 registered voters.) Ybarra Handily Wins over

the Lubbock School Board winning 714 votes (\$4.6%) to Oralia "Lala" Chavez's 321 votes (24.6%) and Gwen Reyna's 271 votes (20.8%) out of 1,304 votes cast. Reyna carried Precinct 8 (Ramirez neighborhood) with eight votes (44.4%) out of only 18 votes cast or 1.7% of the registered voters. The overall School Board District turn-out of 8.3% of 15,041 regis-tered voters was the lowest of any in the city. One appeal-ing note about the election ing note about the election in the Guadalupe neighbor-hood was the 23.7% electoral Mexican American precinc but the 84.7% support for Robertson and 62.3% sup-



Pero una encuesta difundida en abril del 2011 por el Consejo Nacional de La Raza, la organización defensora de los derechos civiles de los hispanos más grande de los Estados Unidos, y Social Science Research Solutions, una firma que sondea la opinión pública, reveló que, por más que el 66% de los consultados se identificasen como católicos romanos, el 49% de ellos estaba a favor del matrimonio entre personas del mismo sexo y un 59% dijo que las parejas gays y lesbianas deben tener los mismos derechos que las parejas heterosevuales.


