## EL REBOTE REPUBLICANO TRAS LA BOMBA ESTALLADA POR JASON RICHWINE

La Reción va inmediatamente el rebote del partido republicano tras la bomba estallada por Jason Richwine.

Un indicador fu la renuncia de Pantoja como director de relaciones comunitarias del partido republicano en la Florida. El rebote, en términos políticos, son las consecuencias imprevistas para una parte responsable de discursos y demandas politicas. Richwine, para hacer memoria, fue el investigador de la Heritage Foundation, quien renunció después de colaborar con la autoría de un análisis político, desacreditado ampliamente por liberales y conservadores, que profirió alegaciones descalabrosas sobre el costo de integrar a la población de inmigrantes indocumentados.

Lo que es más revelador es que el periódico, The Washington Post, develó que Richwine anteriormente había escrito una tesis doctoral en la que se averó -de manera bastante tonta, digo yo- que "Nadie sabe si los hispanos llegarán a tener paridad de coeficiente intelectual con los blancos, pero es difícil discutir contra la predicción que los nuevos inmigrantes hispanos tendrán hijos y nietos de bajo coeficiente intelectual".

Primeramente, "hispano" es un término genérico, originado dentro del gobierno de Nixon, para identificar políticamente a un importante grupo "de herencia"

comunidades con posibilidades a largo plazo para los republicanos. Lo hispano no es una raza, sino está compuesta por muchas razas, naciones, culturas y niveles socioeconómicos.

Segundo, los republicanos anticiparon, que o sea, mucho más de lo que cuestan un tercio del grupo hispano se casaría con personas que no forman parte del grupo, lo cual quedó verificado al año pasado por investigaciones del Centro Hispano Pew.

La que esto implica, es uno le hace a aquella organización se distanció de las aseveraciones de Richwine y crece en cómicas extrapolaciones atribuidas a las calificativas del coeficiente intelectual -un 28 por ciento de la población de los EE.UU. se han menos inteligente por selección- parejas hispanas. O, puesto de otra manera, se volverá más inteligente a través de la prole, cuando los hispanos se casan con personas de otros grupos.

No obstante, ésta no fue la intención de la investigación. De lo contrario, se estableció cauto pretexto para discriminar contra los inmigrantes hispanos sin autorización. No es difícil percibir. Añadió Pantoja, distó la cultura de la intención.

Pantoja no solo renunció a su cargo como director republicano de relaciones comunitarias, sino que lo hizo público y anuncio que se unió al partido demócrata. En una carta dirigida a un "Amigo" el día después de renunciar, explico lo que lo hizo porque "No cuenta mucho

ver la cultura de intolerancia que rodea al partido republicano".

La Heritage Foundation (referida como "una organización muy conocida") orientó su estudio analítico para ocupara "el centro del debate sobre la inmigración". La intención de la investigación era presentar a unos seres humanos como "absolutamente inaceptables" por causa de su estatus migratorio.

Aquella organización se distanció de las aseveraciones de Richwine. No obstante, ésta y otra investigación relacionada esta formada de "insinuaciones racistas, con base en la eugenética", escribió Pantoja.

Pantoja dijo que las "estudio-disciplinas" utilizadas como "solución rápida" causan daño cuando se usan para perdonar y olvidar el problema republicano tan arraigado. Incluso con distanciamiento perturbadoras, los dirigentes republicanos son cómplices "y no quita la cultura de intolerancia al interior del partido".

La lección para los demás no es que los republicanos se han metido en problemas por desbaratado hacia una nueva marca de prejuicio basadas en un racismo que canta canciones del su estandounidense. La lección es que alguien los dañó con base en su propia experiencia.

Escribió Pantoja: "Mi abuelo sirvió en una unidad del ejército segregada, compuesta por enteros de puertorriqueños, el Regimiento de Infantería 65. Després, junto con mi abuela, ayudó a tratar

los crudos rasgos de vidrio para las mujeres portuquerqueñas, al criar a mi tía quien llegó a ser la primera mujer puertorriqueña astroturista con un doctorado en la astronomía (con coeficiente de genio, diría yo). Los puertorriqueños, como muchos estadounidenses del dia de hoy, deben enfrentar la discriminación cuando votan y cuando exigen sus derechos civiles".

Mi único pesar es lo rápido que Pantoja fue a unirse al principio demócrata, desdén, principios comprometidos, conjunto de intereses empresariales y mala interpretación al estilo Hispano de las concepciones estilo Lincoln cuando lo necesario es adherirse al principio.

Una cosa que dejó en claro Pantoja es en su carta que "no contribuyó hoy a una contribución modesta a la American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) por sus esfuerzos por ayudar a proteger los derechos de los inmigrantes y las libertades civiles en general".

Si es que poner la mano al fuego y es éste el tipo de rebate que necesitamos.

### Immigration State of Play:

#### Five Things That Matter Moving Forward

Washington, DC - After several productive weeks for immigration reform in the Senate Judiciary Committee and ahead of a busy legislative push in both chambers in the coming weeks and months, this week's congressional Memorial Day recess offers a chance for pause and reflection about immigration's legislative state of play.

Here are five observations about the prospects and process ahead for immigration legislation, from Frank Sharry, Executive Director of America's Voice:

For Democrats: 60+ Votes for a Bill to Be Proud of Beats 70+ Votes for a Watered Down Senate: Both sides from both sides of the aisle have been vocal in claiming that the Senate is capable of seeing that over 70 votes in favor of the Senate legislation. This is a welcome reminder of the fact that there is now a paradigm in the politics of immigration reform and that both Democrats and Republicans have strong incentives to pass reform in 2013. With that acknowledged, some members of the Gang of 8 seem willing to trade a bit too much in order to reach up a high vote count. We would remind them that it's far better to pass a good bill than 60-70 votes without a hopelessly compromised bill with 70-80 votes. The Senate bill is already a carefully balanced compromise between the right and the left. Democrats have already come under fire for provisions like border security "triggers," and for failing to include immigration sponsorship rights for Americans in same sex marriages. Driving the bill further to the right in pursuit of a few additional Republican votes won't determine whether the bill passes the Senate or not, it will determine whether the bill retains its broad and intense support from the base.

For Republicans: Piling On Anti-Immigrant Concessions Reinforces Poor Political Brand Image: Many Republican senators, such as Orrin Hatch (R-UT) and Dean Heller (R-NV) and Rand Paul (R-KY), have been fighting their potential support for the Senate bill... but only if the bill includes an array of policy concessions and additional changes that would largely weaken the legislation. While the Senate will continue to make changes to the bill in the weeks ahead and while some of these Senators' proposals are serious good faith efforts to improve the bill, the majority of the changes involve throwing more money at the border, and most disturbingly, making the earned legalization program for immigrants even more arduous. Not only would these changes weaken the bill from a policy perspective, by upsetting the delicate balance that makes the Senate bill a policy breakthrough, but they also would reinforce the Republicans' problematic brand image among Latino voters. As Marks of Daily Kos assessed yesterday, "If Republicans are genuinely trying to present a less hateful face to Latinos, continuing to push these policies through their normalization process doesn't exactly get that done. Instead, it only increases the kind of resentment and hostility that the GOP is supposedly trying to combat. They need to decide: are they actually going to compete for Latino votes, or will they doom themselves to permanent minority status by catering to their nativists."

The Senate Bill Includes the Single Largest Increase in Immigration Enforcement in American History: Leading opponents of the bill have been trying to breathe life back into their decades-old "enforcement first" talking points, portraying the Senate immigration approach as "legalization first" and raising serious enforcement at the border and in the nation's interior. This is a red herring - not only does the Senate bill devote unprecedented resources toward a southern border that already has met most of the security metrics for the 2007 Senate immigration bill, but the legislation also includes the mandatory use of an electronic employment verification system to hold employers accountable and end illegal hiring in the workplace. Together, these provisions represent the biggest increase in immigration enforcement in history. And instead of the "enforcement only" approach that has been our default immigration policy for over two decades, the reform package includes a legalization process so we can start with a clear policy and have new visa channels so we can have a future immigration system that actually works. Of course, bill opponents' claims about enforcement aren't exactly being made in good faith - as the Wall Street Journal editorialized recently: "Republicans who claim we must 'secure the border first' ignore the progress already made because their real goal isn't border security. It is to use border security as an excuse to kill immigration reform."

Time is Not on the Side of Republican Leaders Like Speaker Boehner: He Knows He Must Pass Reform: With many expressing confidence in the Senate's path to passage, attention is shifting toward the important question of how reform passes in the House of Representatives. And given the renewed pressure from House leadership for quicker passage of a bill, Republicans should be on notice: the longer immigration reform waits, the more opportunity the anti-immigrant extremists have to define the party. Speaker of the House John Boehner (R-OH) told last week, "The House will work the bill. I don't ask me how, because if I knew I'd certainly tell you, but the House is going to work its will." Despite the lack of specificity from Speaker Boehner, he knows that he will be the key to the House legislative passage in the months ahead. As Jonathan Bernstein recently wrote in the Washington Post, "the math of the House will require leaders of both parties to be on board for any House-authored bill to succeed." And Speaker Boehner clearly grasps the importance of the opportunity for reform as he said in November regarding immigration: "This issue has been around for too long... A comprehensive approach is long overdue, and I'm confident that the president, myself and others can find the common ground to take care of this issue once and for all." More recently, Boehner vowed support for the Gang of Eight immigration reform effort: "Personally, I'm in the camp of if we fix our immigration system, it may actually help us understand what ally's here, why they're here and what legal status they have." The choice before Boehner is clear: the man who makes a fundamental policy change and improves his Party's electoral competitiveness or be the man who lets his party get overrun by the extremists and devolve into irrelevance.

Not Only is the Political Imperative Clear, but the Policy Has Broad-Based Support and the Process is Moving Along Fairly and Well: Earlier this year, one of reform's opponents' legal arguments was a process one - that moving too quickly and advancing legislation "written behind closed doors" - was to be avoided. While this talking point was a transparent attempt by opponents to stall and eventually kill the bill, it is notable how the open Senate Judiciary Committee process overseen by Chairman Patrick Leahy (D-VT) has defused this argument from the other side. Even Senator Chuck Grassley (R-IA), a vocal opponent of the reform legislation and one of six signers to a March letter seeking to slow the pace of the legislation, noted the strength of the Judiciary Committee's work unfolded. Said Grassley: "I appreciate the way the process has gone... It is a productive conversation..." The message in the Senate is further bolstered by a growing and diverse coalition that includes faith leaders, ethnic organizations, labor unions, business owners, law enforcement, teachers, veterans, and civil rights leaders. As Americans for Tax Reform Founder Grover Norquist noted, "Where is the power of the anti-immigrant group? It is not in the news, not in the churches, not in the media community. Every free market group in this town is against them except for [the Heritage Foundation]. As the bill moves forward, the fact that immigrants is one of the rare example of a serious, transparent, and bipartisan legislative effort is one of its important sources of strength."

## BLOWBACK AFTER THE REPUBLICAN BOMB

The Republican Party blowback from the Jason Richwine bomb is just beginning. One indicator was Pantoja's resignation as the GOP's Florida Hispanic outreach director.

Blowback, politically speaking, is the unintended consequence to a party responsible for speech and measures taken.

Richwine, you might remember, was the Heritage Foundation researcher who resigned after he co-authored a widely discredited, by liberals and conservatives alike, policy analysis that made wild claims about the cost of integrating the undocumented immigrant population.

Most tellingly, the Washington Post disclosed: Richwine had earlier written a Harvard Ph.D. dissertation asserting - rather dumb, if you ask me - "No one knows whether Hispanics will ever reach IQ parity with whites, but the prediction that new Hispanic immigrants will have low-IQ children and grandchildren is difficult to argue again."

First of all, "Hispanic" is a generic term, begun during the Nixon administration, to politically identify a large "heritage" group and communities with possible long-term potential for Republicans. Hispanic is not a race but made up of many races, national origins, ethnicities, and socioeconomic levels.

Secondly, Republicans foresaw as happened what way more than a quarter, nearing a third of the Hispanic group would marry outside the group, verified last year by Pew Hispanic Center research.

If implies, if you follow Richwine and you believe in comical extrapolations given to IQ scores - probably 28 percent of the U.S. population is likely to become dumber for selecting Hispanic partners. Or, another way, brighter through children when Hispanics marry out.

But that's not what research was intended to do. Instead, it was set up as a phony pretext for discriminating against unauthorized Hispanic immigrants. Not is hard to see that Republiano Pantoja did, and he blew that cover. Enough is enough.

Pantoja not only quit his post as Republican outreach director, he did so publicly and announced he was joining the Democrats. In a letter to "Friends" the day after he resigned, he explained he did so because, "It doesn't take much to see the culture of intolerance surrounding the Republican Party today."

The Heritage Foundation (referred to as "a well-known organization," gared its study

to be "at the center of the immigration debate." The research intended to make human beings to be viewed as "outright unacceptable" because of their immigrant status.

That organization distanced itself from Richwine's assertions. Yet, it and other related research is padded with "racist and eugenics-based nuances," he wrote.

Pantoja said that "pseudo-apologies" used as "a quick fix" really hurt when used to forgive and forget the deep-rooted Republican party problem. Even by blandly distinguishing themselves. Republiano leaders are still complicit and "doesn't take away from the culture within the ranks of intolerance."

The lesson for the rest of us is that Republicans are in trouble for slouching toward a new-brand prejudice based on a Sweeney-River singing racism. It is that someone called it on them life experience.

Pantoja wrote: "My grandfather served in an all-Puerto Rican segregated Army unit, the 65th Infantry Regiment. He then helped, along my grandmother, shatter glass ceiling for Puerto Rican women raising my aunt to become the first Puerto Rican woman astronomer with a PhD in astrophysics (an IQ of a genius as far as I'm concerned)." Puerto Ricans, as many other Americans still today have to face issues of discrimination in voting and civil rights."

My only regret is that Pantoja was so quick to join the Democratic Party, with its own set of delays, denials, compromised principles, set of corporate interests and Obama style misreading of Lincoln's compromise when principle should stand.

The one thing Pantoja did make clear in his letter was that "I am also making a modest contribution to the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) for the efforts in helping to protect the rights of immigrants and civil liberties in general." Now that is putting his money where his mouth is. That kind of blowback is the needed proof.


