Kate Bond, an information specialist at the American Humane Association, the acknowledge leader in the collection of child abuse data, told Weekly Report that the AHA has no developed any reports on Hispanic child abuse exclusively
"Child abuse is no bigger problem among Hispanics than any other group," she said. Bond said that one reason the apparent child abuse rate for
Latinos appears high is that those who make up large portions Latinos appears high is that those who make up large portions
of the nation's poor are going to be overrepresented in the reporting of cases. She said that those who are poor come in requent contact with hospitals and social workers and entities that have a higher reporting rate. "The always more visible," Bond said.
