

unds for the free or reduced price school lunch program are supplied by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, matched by state funds and distributed to Texas public school districts by the Texas Education Agency.

▼ The cost of the school lunch program in Texas was \$531 million in 1993-94, with \$518 million in federal aid and \$13 million in state matching aid. The Texas Department of Human Services also contributed more than \$80 million in commodities to the program during that time period.

▼ Of Texas' 1,058 public school districts, 1,029 or 97 percent participated in the lunch program in 1993-94. That's the highest percentage of any state.

▼ More than 1.6 million school children in Texas received free or reduced price lunches in 1992. Texas ranked fifth in the nation that year in the percentage of children needing lunches, at 45 percent of those eligible. More than 15

A diabetic person can determine the proper amount of food, insulin and exercise for each day and control the blood sugar with considerable accuracy at home.

> This is especially important for a pregnant diabetic woman where strict control of the blood sugar helps prevent the complications of diabetes in pregnancy such as malformations, stillbirths and overweight babies which present many problems.

> Several different models are available, but all work alike. A finger is punctured for a small drop of blood which is applied to a chemical strip which is then read by the device. It gives an actual number, like a digital clock, for the blood sugar.

If the same finger is used all the time, a callus will form which will decrease the discomfort of the prick. Even so, the small amount of pain from the prick is minimal compared to the benefit of controlling the diabetes and decreasing the number of complications and hospitalizations over the years.



operate W.L. KIDD Oil Field Services, and have no interest in Five Star.


In 1993, I was appointed a Director of the Brazos River Authority, the governing body administering the Brazos River watershed area covering some 45,000
