Gray fox rabies is readily transmitted to raccoons and livestock, especially cows
of Health (TDH) is planning an air drop of coyote bait cine in hopes of stopping the spread of the South Texas epizootic. The air drop follows extensive development of the oral vaccine and delivery system. Set for next month, it is unprecedented in this state.
In 1994, a fox rabies epizootic in Central Texas resulted in 270 cases of this virus, primarily in foxes. Another 247 cases were reported from 1987 through 1993.
