## HOW POOR IS POOR?

In 1994, a family of four
In 1994, a family of four: Today's poverty measure was considered to be living is based on the 1950s in poverty--by the federal notion that an average government's definition--if family of three spends onetheir annual income fell third of its income on food. below an estimated $\$ 15,141$.
The government applies the same threshold no matter where the family lives, even though the cost of living varies widely around the country. Texas ranks among the lowestcost states, along with Mississippi, West Virginia Arkansas and Louisiana In contrast, living costs are significantly higher in California, Alaska, Hawaii and the northeastern states. The use of a single income level to define poverty has come under fire. Some observers maintain that the official level is too low, and others that it fails to account for cost-ofliving differences. High cost states would like to see the poverty threshold revised to reflect thei higher living expenses
Now, federal auditors are studying ways to revise the poverty threshold form-ula--a change that could affect the distribution of about $\$ 22$ billion a year in federal grants to state and local governments.
If the poverty threshold were changed, as proposed in pending legislation, states like New York Massachusetts and California would gain federal funds due to their high cost of living. States with percapita incomes below the national norm--like Texas-would likely end up losing money.

Texas receives $\$ 1.5$ billion year in federal grants directly tied to poverty; at the same time, it leads the 10 largest states in the percentage of residents considered poor. Almost 18 percent of Texans live below the federal poverty line.
The
The poverty threshold has been uniform throughout the U.S. since 1965, when the Social Security Administration officially defined poverty. The threshold is based on pre-tax income and excludes capital gains and the value of non cash benefits such as food stamps, Medicaid or employer-provided health insurance.
