
# SHELL DEDICATES FIRST **CO<sub>2</sub> FLOOD OF NEW OIL-RECOVERY EFFORT**

Shell Western E&P Inc. in Denver City, TX. kicked off its first CO2 flood in the Wasson Field area in nearly 10 years at dedication ceremonies June 19.

"This flood at our Bennett Ranch Unit is very significant," said Steve McVeigh, Central Asset Manager for Shell Western E&P Inc. "Our studies show that this enhanced oil recovery technique should nearly triple production in the affected area and extend the life of these wells by 30 years.. Even more significant is that the, flood design makes smallscale projects economical even small producers should find CO<sub>2</sub> flooding feasible. **WASSON FIELD** 



Shell's Bennett Ranch Unit, just north of Denver City, Texas, was formed in 1964. Located within the Wasson Field, Bennett Ranch Unit's current production is approximately 3,000 barrels of oil per day. The Wasson Field, discovered in 1935, was the first for Yoakum County.

Phase 1 is comprised of eight "patterns" with each pattern including a single either two or four oil-resional computer simulation study of the entire Bennett ranch area. The study helps ensure the profitability of the venture by identifying the best prospects for CO<sub>2</sub> recovery.







Several of the Shell engineers stated the CO<sub>2</sub> flood project is not a quick payout proposition. The initial investment could be recovered in four to seven years, depending on several unpredictable factors.

The tour group also visited the Denver Unit CO<sub>2</sub> Recovery plant, the largest of three in the originally planned to handle substantially more gas recovery plants are now at their maximum capacity. 





which virus has infected an animal. We are always on guard against foreign animal diseases, and that's why it is very important to know which disease has affected a herd." said Dr. Coats.

In New Mexico, state and federal personnel are investigating 37 reports of affected animals. The team is advising livestock owners to avoid congregating animals, to prevent the spread of infection. A number of horse shows, rodeos and livestock exhibitions in southern New Mexico have been canceled.

"Animals with any Vesicular Stomatitis symptoms should not be moved from the premise, as this could spread disease to other farms and ranches. The owners or veterinarians should call the TAHC or USDA immediately for diagnostic assistance," said Dr. Coats. "To aid in preventing infection, flies should be controlled, and persons should remember to use rubber gloves if they handle any animals that appear to have been infected."

Members of the Forrest W. McCargo American Legion Post 585 gathered June 15 for their annual business meeting and cookout.






