Rental rates for all modified and extended CRP contracts will be reevaluated. Some participants may be offered higher rental rates, while others may be offered lower rates.

Participants would be able to request adjustments in the acreage covered by contracts. They can chose to keep all or a portion of the current contractual acreage under the extended contract. They will also be able to shift acreage from the same farm into the CRP contract. Any new acreage, however, must be more environmentally sensitive and provide greater soil erosion, water quality, or wildlife benefits than acreage previously in A guest speaker for the contract. Total CRP acreage cannot increase beyond the current contractual amount.

CRP participants will be place conservation easements on high priority acreage. Both existing and new high priority acreage would be considered. Purchase of the conservation easements will ensure that the most environmentally sensitive lands remain protected.







Recently, we were pleased to see that the Sunset Advisory Commission confirmed what we have been saying about the ability to lower the state's contribution to the TRS fund and still give a historic benefit increase.





#### EATING RIGHT DURING PREGNANCY

When a woman becomes pregnant she usually decides that it is time to "improve" her diet. This is truly is "eating for two," but long it is even better to begin a nutritious diet long before the baby is conceived.

The health of the baby depends on the nutrition he or she receives before birth and also on the health of the mother. Good nutrition will help the mother fend off infections and other illnesses during pregnancy.

Good nutrition during pregnancy requires eating proper amounts of food from the four groups of foods--milk, and dairy, meats, fruits and vegetables, and grains and cereals.


