
Attorney added, "We want the public to be aware of this provision of the law. We want to send a strong message to those people who continue to drink and drive. This provision gives the law bigger teeth in trying repeat offenders." He said the SAFPF sentence is in a true lockup type facility, not in a halfway type environment. In some cases, a repeat DWI conviction in the SAFPF program can result in more actual time being spent behind bars than a normal jail sentence.

Clark also outlined provisions in the Administrative License Revocation (ALR) process which became law January 1 of this year.
