## A.G. Bus Opinion Creates Huge Problems For Texas Schools

If Unchanged, Transporting Students Will Be Next To Impossible

At some point of time in the past, former Commissioner of Education, Texas Education Agency Skip Meno wrote Agency, Skip Meno, wrote posing the question "Can osing the question, "Can a school district purchase, transportation of students 0 and from school or school activities a motor vehicle that does not mee federal and state schoo bus safety standards, and related questions". Meno was referring to the above mentioned car and van ype vehicles.
On August 25 , the A G dropped a bombshell lega pinion in the lap of Mike Moses, the current Comm issioner of Education. In a ten page reply, his opinion could be summed up with one word - NO.
$\qquad$ governing the issue, and admits federal provisions apply only to the manufacture, sale, introduction or delivery for introduction in school buses".
The lengthy and often confusing and ambiguous report rambles on, but does manage to convey the only regulations governing what constitutes a school bus; hey shall be yellow, have onvex mirrors for better visibility of students, and P.I.S.D Superintenden ete Simmons furnis Pete Simmons furnished a copy of the controversial uling to us. He readily admits to frustration be cause of the consequen es forced by the lega pinion. He reports he has alked to dozens of schoo administrators around the state, and all share his state, and
frustration.
Here are some of the ways he ruling will affect the transporting of PISD stuents;
Next Friday, in order to keep the scheduled footbal game with Seagraves, it may be necessary to le school out early. Why? Be cause the current supply of six conventional yellow school buses must first deliver students to their rural homes, return, and then be loaded with some forty football players, plus
band instruments, the players mounds of gear on he small buses. How is it o be transported? The Yellow buses will then proceed to Seagraves, bu only at the 50 mile per hour speed limit they operate under. This scenario gets even darker if a sporting event is scheduled in the evening at a really distant ocation. It could be necessary o dismiss school at noon o handle the long distance run.
The yellow buses would have to be used to carry just a small number of students to U.I.L. competitions. FFA Could notor Joe Pierce would not be allowed to hansport ag students to heir show animals in the chool pens just west of own, and no students ould ride with him in th ig double cab ag pickup o stock shows out of town. There are other problems contend with. If a child get sick or injured at school gain, one of the big yellow buses must deliver the child home or to a medical acility. If an administrato allows the childs transportation in an unauthorized private ehicle, the ugly specter of lability arises. If an unfor unate accident occurs, he entire school system could be the subject of very expensive civil, possibly riminal lawsuits. The defendants could include TURN TO PAGE 2
