

Boy, I still wouldn't trust these little slant eyed things far as I could throw a bull by the tail. I always keep my rifle loaded and a shell in the chamber. However, I don't think there is any real danger. They were sure afraid of us at first until they found out we weren't going to hurt them. I guess they could expect to be to the American Heart afraid, after treating our prisoners Association like they did ....

Your loving son and Bud, PFC. Johnnie Fitzgerald"
