Don Hill Plans to Appeal in Dallas City **Hall Corruption Case**

Dallas -- Federal prosecutors say that public outrage over the selling of votes at Dallas City Hall led to near-complete con-victions Monday in a historic corruption case that brought

victions Monday in a historic corruption case that brought down former Mayor Pro Tem Don Hill and his cohorts.

Acting U.S. Attorney Jim Jacks called the verdicts a "resounding decision" showing that the public doesn't want a government "where the game is rioged."

Hill, whose eight-year sti on the council ended in 2007 with a failed mayoral bid while he was under indictment, expressed disbelief with the verdicts and vowed to appeal.

"We wanted to be able to say

that the dark cloud has been lifted from City Hall," said Hill, who faces a maximum of 95 years in prison when he is sentenced on seven counts in the coming months. "We won't be able to say that today. In my heart, I didn't have a corrupt in-

rent.

"As a lawyer, trained by the system, I have to accept the system and believe in the system," he said.

In schemes that prosecutors

alleged netted the defendants hundreds of thousands of dollars, Hill and the others were accused of funneling bribe money from developer Brian Potashnik through sham contracts.

Car dealer and amateur home builder Rickey Robertson was acquitted in this scheme. But he was convicted, along with Hill and the others, of putting pressure on developer James R. "Bill" Fisher for hundreds of thousands in extortion money.

Fisher blew the whistle on the scheme in fall 2004 and became an informant. He recorded 100

an informant. He recorded 100 conversations for the FBI, which also collected more than 30,000 wiretaps in the case.

During the three-month trial, jurors heard from 44 witnesses, including eight called by the de-

They were barely a half-hour into their sixth day of delibera-tions Monday morning when the tell-tale knocks came from in-side the jury room door just after 9 a.m. A court security officer spoke to one of the jurors briefly and radioed that a verdict had

Barbara Lynn cautioned the au-dience not to make any outbursts as she began reading the 12-page verdict form. A hush fell over

After nearly five years of in-vestigation and three months of testimony, it took less than 10 minutes for the judge to deliver the news: 23 guilty verdicts and six not guilty verdicts.

As Hill heard his fate, his nor-mally animated expression and

mally animated expression and toothy smile faded. He stared blankly while standing and fac-ing the judge. His wife, Sheila Farrington Hill, was expression-

less by his side.
"Justice was not served today," she said later. She faces up to 65 years in prison for convictions

"My husband and I are inno cent," she said. "We're not guilty of what we're charged of. This verdict is not a good verdict. ...

SPC Receives \$2.87 Million To **Launch Training Programs**

LEVELLAND - South Plains College has been awarded a five-year \$2.87 million federal grant from the U.S. Department of Education to develop three new high demand technical and

gree programs.

The grant project, titled "Strengthening High-Demand Technical/Health Occupations Programs," was awarded from the Office of Postsecondary Education's Developing Hispanic-Serving Institutions Program (Title V HSI). The grant will enable SPC to develop, pilot and implement new associate degree programs in alternative energy technology (wind/solar), physical therapy assistant and engineering technology and expand its delivery of high demand training to its Plainview Extension Center.

sion Center.

SPC officials received notification of the grant from U.S.
Congressman Randy Neugebauer, as well as Department of Education program officials.
"I am pleased that South Plains College is the recipient of the Title V grant that will enhance and expand their workforce development and technological

training programs," said Neuge-bauer. "During these difficult economic times, it is even more important that we invest in technical training programs that will train and re-train individuals with skills to advance their ca-reers and provide new academic

reers and provide new academic and technical opportunities."

The award is the single largest competitive grant ever received by SPC. A total of 24 individual grants and five cooperative arrangement grants were awarded in this competition.


arrangement grants were awarded in this competition. SPC will receive \$574,767 in the first year of the award.

"We are very fortunate because the Title V funds will allow us to expand our offerings in different areas where we have identified needs," said Dr. Kelvin Sharp, president of South Plains College. 

He also noted in July Perry was forced to ask the federal government for a 170 million loan to cover unem-ployment insurance and the state was expected to request a total of \$650 million, around 100 mil-
