Editorial:

Prophots of Doom Wrong Again

April 7, 1901, is now history. On that day, for the first time since the founding of the city, Lubbock elected a Black candidate and a Black candidate and a Brown candidate to office on the Lub'ock City Council. Black and Browns are not just observers and petitioners in city government, now. Black and Brown are office holders. Blacks and Browns, for the first time in the history of the Lity, are now represented on the City Council.

IT IS DOTH INTERESTING BOO SIGNIFICANT THAT THE DISCUSA LEST DAMES was one of the best, from every possible standpoint, ever conducted in

In the first place, it was a lawful election, and was conducted in accordance with the law of the land as set forth in Section 2 of the foderal Voting Right Act. It was a single mender district election, the kind of electron Lubbock is going to use from now on. It was an election in which Blacks and Browns, fc. 5:a first time in Lubbock's history, did not have their votes diluted by the old, segregationist at-large system. It was an election that promoted liberty and democracy in the best sense.

In the second place, if was an election that brought out thousands or citizens who wanted to vente, and who did vote For the first time in the history of Lubbock, the voic of Lubbock's Black and Brown citizens meant something. Blacks and Browns, in the April 7, 1984, election, were going to elect candidates for the first time. And that is exactly what happened, when Lubbock's Blacks and Browns knew, really knew, that their votes were going to count, and were going to mean something this time around. That knowledge brought Blacks and Brown to the polls in


Next, it is important to remember that this election was, with one exception, a clean one and was fought out on the issues. For the first time in Lubbock's history, candidates were appearing in the neighborhoods they would represent, in their meighborhoods, and were discussing the real issues that were, and are, of concern in those neighborhoods. This was taking place all over the city, not just in the minority districts, so-called. All over Lubbock, voters were talking with candidates about things that needed to be done in their own neighborhoods, neighborhoods where the candidates themselves live and have their homes. This was good. It was healthy. It will bear good truit for the antire city.

Vie said there was one exception. The exception was the mayor's race. That race was characterized by mud-slinging and animosity on the part of some candidates, although cartainly not all. Personal attacks were made, and personalities became the focus of that race, with the help (not surprisingly) of the Avalanche-Journal. While reading the A-J's pious editorials to "be cool" and "stay civilized," we all noted that newspaper's frantic efforts to damage one candidata's election campaign by trying to play "Let's you and him fight." That tactic on the part of the Avalanche-Journal was unworthy of the good men and women who work on that newspaper, and was a disservice to the Lubbock community. Significantly, the mayor's race is still at-large. That may be as it should be, but it is typical of at-large races in Lubbook, as the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals noted in its opinion printed in these pages over the last four weeks, that they degenerate into personality confests, instead of being fought out on the issues like the single member district races are.

Another point to be made is that there was little, if any, real confusion. That was another thing the Avalancias-Journal wrote anbout endlessly: confusion. Editorials, and "news stories" that read more like editorials than straight news, were printed day after day ensisting that there would be great confusion. Voters, having voted through the years in their regular precincts, would for some strange reason be "confused," and would not know where to go to vote. Having woted for state and federal senators and representatives, and even county commissioners, by districts for years, they suddenly would be all "confused" about what it means to yote for a representative from one's own home district. Well, the poor old A - I to the contrary, there was no confusion. Things worked smoothly at every level of the election.

What agout the dire predictions of renoff elections? It never happoned. There was no need for a runnoff election in any race. The voters were sufficiently interested and informed-to get out in the required numbers and elect the candidates they wanted elected the first time around. All the hype about expensive runoff elections, and gaps in the City Council membership in the process, was just that hypo, the more dire prediction shot down by the actual facts.

Firefighters Hold School Here

again gather this week for classroom and field instruction during the 36th Annual Lubbock Area Fire Protection School, April 9-13 and 12-13 at the city fire

training center at 100 Municipal Sponsored by the Fire Protection Division of the Texas A & M Engineering Extension Service and the Lubbock Fire

Department, the school will

South Plains firefighters will attract some 800 students from more than 45 area towns and communities.

Most of the firefigl ters will be from volunteer units, according to Lubbook Fire Chief Tom Foster.

"This school is taught primarily by volunteer firefighters themselves, so they have the knowledge and experience to understand the needs and requirements of the volunteer line department. This

format has proved to be well received and highly beneficial to the area firefighters," Foster said. The school is held in the

evenings, Foster pointed out, so that participants can better fit the school into their schedules. Classes will continue Thursday and Friday, April 11 and 12 with registration starting at 6 p. m. and the class beginning at 7 p. m. Each session is about three hours Those wishing to attend the

school may take one, all er any number of classes with a onetime \$10 registration fee.

"We feel like for \$10 this is the best opportunity for firefighters to get new information and instruction in firelighting techniques. The fee simply covers our costs for such things as fuel and materials. We think the people attending the school really get their money's worth," Faster

Thursday and Friday nights will involve hands-on instruction with classes rotating every 40 ninutes. Fighters will learn about house fires, spill fires, LP gas fires, safety supervision and a lecture ou firefighting tactics.

On all nights, school members may choose to attend a detailed lecture on the investigation and documentation of a fire, taught by Horace Anglin, assistant chief of the Lubbock Fire Department.

DEAR ARON: I spoke with a urologist who assured me that the problem you and your wife share isn't medical or legal. The problem is psychological. Even though your doctor explained that you were physically capabale of resuming normal marital activities, evidently the advice didn't register with your wife. Unfortunately, your physician wasn't sensitive enough to see that, and to refer you on to the right







It is common knowledge in a divorce or separation situation that one parent usually has custody of the children and the other parent has visitation rights and an obligation to pay child support. But what about the rights of grandpar, is in such a situation? It is not uncommon for grandparents to totally lose contact with a grandchild or to even be denied the apportunity to have access to them by an angry parent. As of January 1, 1974, the Thexas Family Code became offective and provided some right of reasonable visitation of grandparents. Recent changes in this law have been made by the legislature which are more specific in determining under what conditions a grandparent car have access or visitation with grandchildren. Trase changes because effective August

A grandparent can now file a separate lawsuit or become involved in a suit between the parents and can be awarded visitation rights. However, certain requirements must be met

First, one of the parents of the child limits be a natural parent. This, presianably, would not apply to an adopted child of the parent The court must also find that it would be in the best interest of the child that the grandparent have visitation rights. If these two requirements are met end any one of six other situations exists the

judge casy then grant visitation rights to grandparents. The first of these situations exists if the grandparent is a parent of a parent of the child and the parant has been in jail or prison during the thras morth period before the suit is filed or the earent has been found by a court to be incompetent or dead.

Second, the grandparent can get visication if the parents are divorced or living apart for three months or a suit for divorce by the parents is pending in court.

Third, the grandchild has been abused or neglected by the parents. Fourth, the child has been found by a court to be in need of supervision or to be a juvenile delinquent

Fifth, the grandparent is a parent of a parent of a cyhild whose parental rights have been terminated by court decree. Sixth, the child has lived with the grandparent for at least six

months in the last two years before suit is filed. One should remember that a grandparent does not have a right to visitation even if the case fits one of the six situations unles othere is a

finding by the court that it would be in the best interest of the child for the grandparent to have these rights. SUPPLEMENTAL SECURITY INCOME (BSI)

Supplemental Security Income (SSI) is a Federally-financed program of assistance for financially needy apad blind, as essabled persons. SSI is not part of what is commonly referred to as Social Security. It is administered by the Jocial Security Administration and it ficamend by

general rends of the U.S. Treasury, net Social Security trest funds.
Social Security district offices are raspossible for taking applications for SSI. This includes getting information that establis the applicant's identity, ago, incree, resources and other factors readed to evaluate digibility under the program.

If the application is naced on age (65 and over), Co Social Security district office makes the eligibility decision; if blindness or disability is claimed, however, the district office considers only the nonmedical factors. The medical decision of eligibility is made by an agency of the State in chich the applicant lives.

Since eligibility for SSI is based in part on financial used and since applicants may be in immediate need of assistance, the district officer are authorized to make emergency cash payments. More specifically, as advance payment of up to \$100 may be made against the initial payment to an applicant facing a financial emergency if it agrees that the person will eventually be found to be eligible. This advance payment is later deducted from the fature payments due the purson.

If the application is based on what appears to be an obviously disabling condition or blindness, the district office may authorize omergency payments for up to 3 mocths, positing State agency sapreval of disability or blindness. If the applicant is later found not to be disabled or thind under the law, those advances do not have to be rapaid.

Testimony of Congressman Louis Stokes before House Energy and Commerce Subcommittee on Health and the Environment on Szinthurization of Title 10-Family Planning Services

Mr. Chairman, members of the

Subcommittee, I welcome the opportunity to appear before you today in support of the reauthorization of the Federal Family Assistance Program, Title 10 of the Public Health Service Act of 1970. The Congressional Black Cacus, for whom I speak today, is prood to join with Representatives of the Congressional Hispatilo Caucus and the Congressional Caucus on Women's issues in supporting the continuation and the strengthaning of our federal effort to provide accessibility to safe and effective contraceptive services and counseling for all who need and want them.

Mr. Chairman, the Title 10. program has been working to that end, with proper emphasis on the poor and adolescents, and it deserves the support of all members of Congress, especially those Members who have succeeded in denying the option of abortion to the poc: women of

our nation Much has been written about the alarming growth in techage childbearing in the Black community. The sharply growing number of Plack households headed by single women threatens to undo the modest accomic gains realized by Blacks as a group is the past thirty years, indeed the econocaic and social implications of this trend carnot be overstated, and, while the reasons for this phenomenon are many and complex, one very basic and cractical means to help counter it is to make voluntary family planning services available to all without ecoamic barriers and without imposed moralistic restraints.

Chairman. According to the Children's Decense Fund, in 1979, the most recent year for which statistics are available, one is four Black babies were born to a teenage mother, as against one in seven among Whites. From 1960 to 1982, families headed by Black women as a percentage of all household with children rose to 47 percent from 21 percent. Today, that figure is 50 percent.



The Lieswers will be as complex as the problems; but one very real way to begin is by insuring that women and men have some control over the number and timing of their children.

Mr. Chairman, another matter

which must be addressed here today is the manner in which the Little 10 Family Planning Program has been administered by the current Administration. Despite the fact that the Congress took what I felt to be pecisive action in 1983, by ordering the Donartment of Health and Human Services to return Its Office of Family Planning to the career professionals of the Public Health Service, the Department has refused to comply and has said that it will not comply. Leaving the day-to-day administration of the program is the hands of a political appointer is repasentative of the tanor in which this Administration has approached family planning. For an Administration that is so committed to scak g an end to the right of American women to seek safe and legal abortions to work to Chwart the delivery of family planning services is beyond comprehension. For an Administration that does deny abortion rights for poor women who rely upon Medicaid to also seek to deny them access to contraceptive services is sheer tolly. And for the women, single and married, who choose to bear children, what has the administration proposed? Cut after cut in the very lifeline programs such as Maternal and Child rlealth and the Women's Infant and Children(WIC)

Supplemental Food Program. This Administration has attempted, through its proposed "squeal rule", to discourage teenagers from seeking

contraceptive services and counseling. The Administration has subjected family planning clinics to an unprecedented number of audits. And most recently, Mr. Chairman, the Administration has managed to

furn last year's \$18 million natiogwide funding has managed to turn last year's \$16 million nationwide (anding increase into level funding, and in some cases, reductions by diverting funding away from vitally needed

I urge this Subcommittee to extend the Title 10 Family Planning Program, to increase its funding authorization, and to reject amendments designed to hamper the delivery of services to tiose most in said.

It proved the hunger for real participation in city government, on the part of Lubboch's Blacks and Browns. It showed the deep interest that all of Lubbook's citizens have in the affairs of their city government. 
