

Mattox Announces Major Indigent Health Care Study

Attorney General Jim Mattox Thursday announced that his Jerusalem Temple COGIC, St. Luke office has undertaken a major study regarding indigent health care in Texas.

"Many of our poorer and more rural counties are facing a crisis situation today concerning adequate health care for indigents," Mattex said.

"My State and County Division receives dozens of phone calls and latters each month from county officials across the state expressing confusion and concern about solutions to this problem," Mattox said. "Therefore, several months ago, I instructed my Planning and Reasearch Division to look into the matter. For ever answer, we have found two more

questions. "The lack of resources for such health care also is creating

problems for public hospitals in urban areas, such as Tarrant and Dallas count of, where the large public hospitals are creating ndigents from sorrounding curr countres without compensation." Mattox announced the study in Fort Worth Thursday, prior to his

addressing a meeting of the West Texas County Judges and Commissioners Association. Mattox noted that a 1948 federal program which gave grant.

for construction of hospitals required those hospitals receiving lunds to provide a certain amount

such services in return for federal loans and loan guarantees.

Since the Hill-Burton Act was passed, health care facilities across the nation have received about \$5 billion through the program, Mattox said.

Yet, he noted, a 1982 report by the U.S. General Accounting Office (GAD) estimated that only about half of the required services have been provided to those whom the Hill-Burton Act was intended to Cover.

"These are the reople that the counties are finding it deficult to provide for because of a lack of funds," Mattax said, "I fully believe that we can tap these unused Hill-Burton obligations in Texas to aid our counties in providing services.

"The current administration in Washington has turned its back on the roor," Mattex said. "With tuday's unemployment, many working-class Americans have lost their health care benefits because they have lost their jobc House are people who are not on writtare but who cannot afford the sky-rocketing costs of health Chiel.

This, in turn, has placed an incredible burder so many county governments which do not have the financial resumces to most the burden," he said.

Mattex said his office plans to work closely with county



In San Francisco last month two men made arguments for their points of views on victimized Lebanon. First, Dr. Clovis Maksoud, chief of Mission and Ambassador of the League of 7-ab States to the United Nations and the United States, the Permanent Observer to the U.N. and Special Envoy to the U.S. for the Lague, which includes 21 nations of the Arab World. Dr. Maksoud is a professor of Political Scrience and International Law, a Lebauese citizen who is committed to his raped country and the idealistic Arab cause of a homeland for the Palestinian People with the right of self-determination. His Excellency's kideas of the immediate need of the type of scrvices the U.S. could provide for his country sharply contrasted to those of of Commonwealth Club of California speaker in San Franciso representing the II.S. State Cepartment

Richard M. Fairbanks, III, is Ambassador and Special Advisor to the U.S. Secretary of State, whose lead he follows in "the cuest for peace in the Middle Fast." Peace or no peace, however, it is clear that this administration does not expect to "stand by idly when others take actions which threaten our interests, as well as, the interests of our friends and allies." Ambassador Fairbanks' position does not place a higher priority or the Palestenian homeland issue, than the protection of Israel's latest land yrabs. Getting the Israelis to reduce its armed guards "inside" refugee camps is as close as the Camp David Accord could consider asking Israel to step off the backs of the Pale. Unians. Petroleum from the Middle East corridor is the political justification for he U.S. being an Israel patsy

Placing the block for the troubles in the Middle East on the big bad, red best and/or her cub Syria seems to be the brunt of the State Department foreign policy. People without a humeland have very little "interests" for this administration. Ambassador Fairbanks quotes the President for his position, 'Our view on the extent to which Israel should be asked to give up togritory, will be heavily affected by the extent of true peace and normalization and the security arrangements offered in return." In short, Israel shail say when it "feets sais" before the U.S. will exercise its influence to end the occupation of stolen territory from a war torn Lebancsc or Palestenian peopre. It is to Israel's advantage to ceize as much land in Egypt, Lebanon, Jordan ur even Syria in order to swan particles of these ill gotten gains for a rool's peace. Anbassador Maksoud, when speaking before the International Trade Council of the San Francisco Chamber of Commerce, under the auspice of the U.S. Arab Chanters, called upon the U.S. to work with the poor in these "rivh nations" in the Middle East. Dr. Maksourl says the Arab world is made up of "rich nations of poor people." The problem is that the U.S. is dealing only with an "elite" few while ignoring the poor. Populist movements is Iran and Iraq crushed relationships with this country. Obviously the Permanent Observer has raised the real issue of interest for both citizens of the U.S., as well as, of the Arab nations as to whose dest interest is being served by the crumbling current administration policy which purports to protect "our" petroleum interest in the Middle East.

Weich up on Civit Rights (From the Pecos, Texas Daily Enterprise).

"From the start the Reagan administration has been resistant to the civil rights aspirations of Black Americans. But in reneging on its own court approfed agreement to undo widespread discrimination in Birmingham's police and fire departments, it has outdone itself.

Nearly a decade ago, the Justice Department sued Birmingham, a city descirbed by its own mayor at 'steeped in discrimination' for its 'pattern and practice' of mistreating black and female police and fire department candidates. After a lengthy trial, the department-significantly, Roaald Reagan's Justice Department-negotiated a remedy which included setting numerical goals for hiring blacks and women in order to make up for past discrimination. The Justice Department attorney who negotiated the settlement in 1981 praided the planes "foir, reasonable and lawful".

Now the administration has changed its mind. It is going to court ogain-this time to argue on the side of 10 white police officers and firefighters who are opposing its own scheme. So what's new? This government has been known to undercut its own modest civil rights initiatives before.

In Chicago, for instance, il negotiated a voluntary desegration plan whose slim hope of success rested in the development of special 'magnet schools, then eliminated the Emergency School Assistance Act that was to have provided funding for that program.

Inc. association of Minority Hrolth Professional Schools, or lined in a study last summer that significant professionals were lidely to become more acute in the 1980s unless action was taken by the Presidant of the United States.

Federal legislation to address these severe shortages were intorduced recently in the House of Representatives which would establish a health protessions loan program for migority students and institutions serving significant numbers of minority students. It is critically important to the black community that this legislation be quickly passed.

When there is a lack of black health professionars, there is also a udficiency in the quality and amount of health care rendered to the black. community. This translates into shorter life expactancies, especially among black males, as well a slowocketing infant mortality rates.

Under the legislation, which was introduced by Congressman Louis Stokes, student loans may be forgiven with a minimum of two years of service in a health manpower shortage area.

Political Potpourri

Although Jesse Jackson has been under increasingly-heavy attacks from the Jewish community as the result of the "Hymie/Hymietown" controversy and subsequent remarks by Minister Louis Farrakhan, the civil rights leader rolled up massive majorities among black voters in the Pennsylvania's Democratic primary. Jackson carried Philadelphia over Walter Mondale 37 to 35 percent and won twenty percent of the state's total vote.

... The House Foreign Affairs Subcommittee on Africa last week unanimously approved 3. Res. 430, the "Mandela Freedom Resolution." The resolution calls on South Africa to immediately release Helson and Winnie Mandela, two black South Afircan political prisoners, from their more than 20-year detentior.

The resolution, which includes among its co-sponsors the chairman of the Foreign Affairs Committee, the chairman of the Rules Committee and all members of the Coogressional Black Caucus, now goes to the full House Foreign Affairs Committee for consideration. Nelson Mandela, leader of the oldest and most popular liberation movement of South Africa's black majurity, the African National Congress, has been in prison for 20-years serving a life sentence for seeking to overthrow the apartheid government.

Winnie Mandela, an equally prominent opposition leader, has been systematically detained and abused by South Africa's security police and confined to a home designated by South Africa and far removed from family and friends

Congressman Geo W. Crockett, Jr., a member of the House Foreign Affairs Committee, expressed his "outroje" recently at the actions of the Reagan Administration in Nacaragua and called on Congress to withdraw all authorizations for funding U.S. military operations and assistance in Central America. "This administration has taken us to the brink of war in Central America," Crock_tt said. "It has sent hundreds of millions of dollars in military assistance to governments without regard for their treatment of their citizens.

it has encouraged and supported revolution in nations with legitimate governments. It has exported U.S. military personnel to aleas of hostilities in violation of the War Powers Resolution, and now it seeks to snub its nose at the rule of international aiw and the forum of world opinion by repudiating the right of Nicaragua to take its legitimate grievance to the World Court.

3. The unit rule and instructed delegations shall be forbidden.

4. Party Rules and Robert's Rules must be observed and shall not be

5. No more than two-thirds of the Delegates and of the Alternates to County, Senatorial District, and State Conventions shall be of the same sex. Goals for Weblocal Delegates shall be 50 percent for women, 21 percent of Hispanics, and 16 percent for Blacks. An attempt will be made to provide 15 percent representation for youth (18-35 years).



Breastfeeding is Best For Infants

A recent survey by the national center for Health Statistics revealed that white women are twice as likely to breastfeed their infants as are Black women. The survey compared women's breastfeeding practices in 1969 nand 1960. Nicotem percent of withit women exclusively breastfeed their children in 1969 compared to nine percent of Black woman. By 1940, 51 percent of white women breastfed their children compared to only 25 percent of Black comen.

these figures require our attention because bottle-fed infants are more likely to be malnourished and underweight tas those who are breastfed. Breastfeeding provides infants with the best possdible netrition. It also helps to immunize infants against diseases in a way that bottlefeeding came. Babies who are botule-feel risk centracting infections from unclean water and anstarilized bottles.

More recent data are needed on how many poor and minority women are breastfeeding their children. But the government does not same willing to look into this. In 1982 a small human netrition institute unit within the U.S. Department of Agriculture admitted a survey to the Office of Management and Dudget Tor-Idearance. The servey had been under design for three years and would have examined breastle practices among long-income and misority Americans.
