Controlling Modical Costs

Gae of the major issues before the hation at this time is the rising onest of medical care. Steas have been taken and others proposed to damped the undationary spiral that has made health care costs higher than the general cost of living with the resulting boost in Medicare

Since October 1, 1983, the Health Gare Financing Administration (FICFA) has been phasing in a prospective payment plan for Medicare aspital reimbursement. Enacted as part of the 1983 Social Security amendments, the new system replaces reimbursement according to papital costs with reimbursement according to pre-established rates for each type of illness, based on diagnosis. If nospitals provide treatment at a lower cost than the established rate, they make a profit. If they provide treatment at a higher cost then the established ra's, they suffer a loss. Thus, the Midicare hospital insurance program for the first time contains incentives for hospitals to control costs and rewards

Unior the old system, hospital ox is have increased an annual average of 17.5 percent since 1979. Hospital costs account: 1 fo: twothirds of the approximately 50 billion expended for Medicare in 1982. In that year, hose Ital costs increased 12.6 percent, three times the general rate of inflation.

The new system will be phased in over a 3-year periou, and will be fully affective by October 1986.

As the new system reduces the growth of Medicare expenditures, it will also result in a reduction in the growth of out-of-pocket deductibles

beneficiacies must pay. However, officials not that effective use of one's Medicare protection can also help reduce costs for a person and in the end induce total Medicare costs. For example, many doctors still accept assignment of their pill. When a dector agrees to accept assignment of the bill, he or she accepts the Medicaro approved payment as his or her entire charge. The Social Security office has a Pisting That shows the name and address of doctors and suppliers in your area and the approximate percentage of claims on which they accepted assignment in the previous year.

In addition, studies show that many people purchase costly supplemental medical insurance that either duplicates ther Medicare coverage, provides far beyond their reasonable needs, or does not otherwise meet their needs. People are urged to shop carefully before they buy and not buy more polices than they need. The Social Sicurius office has a leaflet call Guide to Health Insurance for People with Medicare that provins useful tips on supplementing Medicare. It was develope jointly by the Haalth Care Financing Administration and the National Association of Insurance

Medicare officials also encourage people to join a health maintenance organization (JMO) plan. An HMO provides comprehensive health care at reasonable prices, generally under contract with Medicare, with the person paving a fixed monthly premium to the HMO covering the cost of the deductibles and coinsurance under Medicare. The Social Security office has a leaster which spells out how HMO's may work to meet your health care need.





Simultaneous major leatures in America's best known newsweeklies were not the result of charitable acts by the publishing world, but a recognition that lackson's actions at the San Francisco convention could determine the next president of the United States. If Jackson strongly supports the likely Democratic noplines, Walter Mondale and subsequently helps turn out a re-esive number of black voters for the November election, Reagan would probably be denied a second term in

The Democratic Party leadership is visibly upset that the fiercely independent Jackson may be in a position to insist that the Decocratic Party support a range or black-interest issues, including the abolition of "runoff" orimaries, stroop affirmative action politices, sharplyincreased federal 313 to the poor, and a change in party rules that deter mirerity qualify for delegalas. They talk inclassantly about their learn that Jackson will lead a walkaut of black delegates at the convention if the black agenda is liggered, and subsequently give only lukewarm. support to the eventual Democratic Party nomines.

Jackson, who met recently with Charles Manatt, Chairman of the Democratic National Convention, said that Manatt was obsessed with concern that Jackson would lead a walkout in San Francisco, Jackson. however, has never said that he would load a walkout at the Genomatic

He emphasizes correctly that his struggle and the struggle of black people has been to "get in" to the convention, not whether to walk out if

black-interest demands are not met.

Jackson's critics continue to raise the prospect that Jackson's demands that the Democratic Party embrace the policy concerns of the black community will drive white voters, particularly white Southern voters into the Republican Party. Although his detractors raise the possibility of a white backlash, they refuse to condemn racial attitudes so closely held by many white Americans that they would rather switch political parties than end the mistreatment of blacks and other

Suggestions that Jackson lower his voice, soften his demands, temper his charges and be prepared in San Francisco to compromise in the interest of party unity is paternalistic nonsense. Similar suggestions are seldom made to other racial and special interest groups

For Jackson to radically compromise on issues central to his historic campaign, would be to retreat to the usual black political charity. It is time for America's black community to flex its political muscle. If that is misunderstood, and there is a white backlash, the blame will not fall on Jackson and his supporters, but on a racially-sensitive white America that cannot bear the legitimate exercise of black political power. Jesse Jackson scored a massive victory over Mondale and Hart in the District of Columbia's recent primary, beating Mondale by more than a 2-to-1 margia. Hart received less than ten percent of the vote.

Jackson also had an impressive third place victory in Tennessee, winning approximately 25 percent of the vote. It is expected that Jackson will also do well in Maryland, where it is possible for him to finish second behind Mondale.

Although Baltimore's black political leadership largely supports Mondale, it is expected that the majority of the city's blacks will vote for Jackson. A first or second place finish is also possible for Jackson in Louisiana wher the black mayor of New Orleans is a strong supporter.
