21 Additional Class Actions Certified Against Lubbock Area **Cotton Farmers**

On December 7, 1988 United States District Judge Sam R. Cummings certified 21 class actions against 21 cotton farmers from the Brownfield, Seagraves, and Tahoka areas.

Three migrant farm workers filed a federal class action law suit against 24 Lubboack area farmers in July, 1987 alleging that for three years the farmers failed to comply with the disclosure and record keeping requirements of the Agricultural Worker Protection Act and failed to comply with Texas field sanitation laws. The complaint also alleged the three migrant workers were

not paid the minimum wage of \$3,35 per hour.

Settlements for three class actions totalling \$19,500 with three of the farmes were approved by Judge Cummings on September 6, 1988.

"All of us were at a settlement conference Wednesday concerning this case, said TRLA staff attorney Stephen C. McIntyre. "I guess Judge Cummings issued the order after he received a report on the progress of the settlement conference. We are very pleased that Judge Cummings issued an order certifying the remaining twenty one class actions. We

will continue to negotiate and hope that we reach a reasonable settlement as we did with the other three class actions," said McIntyre.





Secondly, get the true word to as many people as you can using the written media. The "grapeview" is doing more harm with distorted information than you imagine. Knowing the full story directly from the "horse's mouth" will generally eliminate complaints and criticism.

Educational Revolution Spreads to Zimbabwe

Black News Briefs

New Study: Blacks Remain Most Segregated Group

Chicago, III.: Even when their incomes allow them to buy homes in expensive suburban areas, Blacks still remain the most segregated group in America. That was the leading conclusion of a study released last week by a University of Chicago sociologist. The study compared housing patterns in 59 U.S. cities and surrounding suburbs. Research associate Nancy Denton said that when it comes to housing "there are strong penaltiese for being Black." However, the study entitled "Suburbanization and Segregation in U.S. Metropolitan Areas, found that Asians were most likely to be accepted into traditionally white suburbs. In addition, Hispanics who looked white faced little difficulty moving in white suburban areas. But Black Hispanics faced the same type of housing segregation as Amerian born Blacks. One result of the continuing housing segregation says study author Dr. Douglas Massey is that Blacks who do move to the suburbs tend to end up in "Black suburbs" which are located close to the inner cities.



THE ORDINANCE OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

A. The PLACE Of The Lord's Supper -- In The Church.

The Lord's Supper is not a method of fellowship between Christians, but it is a local Church ordinance to be practiced only in the local Church, by the members only of that local Church.

1. Jesus Instituted it in the local church. Matthew 26:20,26 says "Now when the even was come, he sat down with the twelve. And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed it, and brake it, and gave it to the disciples, and said, Take, eat; this is my body." Remember that i Corinthians 12:28 says that "God hath set some in the church, first apostles," Not everyone who loved the Lord were invited. Neither Mary, Martha or Lazarus were invited to the Supper. Even the mother of Jesus was not invited.

2. The order of events in the great commission, reveals that it is to be in the local church. Jesus said to the eleven disciples in Matthew 28:19-20 "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoe er I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. A-men."

b. Baptizing those who believes and are saved. This puts them in the local church.

c. Teaching them to observe all things which would include the Lord's Supper. We cannot reverse this order of the great commission and be Scriptural and true to God's Word.

3. The order practiced by the local Jerusalem Church places the Lord's Supper In the local church. Acts 2:41-42,47 says "Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls. And they continued stedfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking of bread, and in prayers. Praising God, and having favour with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily such as should be sayed."

b. They were baptized—this placed or added them to the church by the Lord. c. it was observed by those who were sound in doctrine. Acts 2:42 says "And they continued stedfastly in the apostles" doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking of

bread, and In prayers.

a. Teaching all nations the gospel.

a. They received the word-they were saved.

4. The Apostle Paul taught that the Lord's Supper was In the local Church. 1 Corinthians 1:2 says "Unto the church of God which is at Corinth," Paul continues to write to the local church in 1 Corinthians 11:2 which says "Now I praise you, breathren, that ye remember me in all things, and keep the ordinances, as I delivered them to you." and in the same local Church in 1 Corinthians 11:18,20 he says "For first of all, when ye come together in the church." "When ye come together therefore into one place, this is not to eat the Lord's Supper."

5. The members in the local church were forbidden to eat the Lord's Supper with those living in sin. 1 Corinthians 5:7-12 says "Purge out therefore the old leaven, that ye may be a new lump, as ye are unleavened. For even Christ our passover is sacrificed for us: Therefore let us keep the feast, not with old leaven, neither with the leaven of malice and wickedness; but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth. I wrote unto you in an epistle not to company with fornicators: Yet not altogether with the fornicators of this world, or with the covetous, or extortioners, or with idolaters; for then must ye needs go out of the world. But now I have written unto you not to keep company. If any man that is called a brother be a fornicator, or covetous, or an idolater, or a railer, or a drunkerd, or an extortioner; with such an one no not to eat. For what have I to do to judge them also that are without? do not ye judge them that are within?" The local church body has a right to judge those in her membership. If the local church invites all Christians to partake of the Lord's Supper, then how can they obey the above Scriptures of God's Holy Word?

6. Paul rebuked the local Corinthian Church for trying to observe the Lord's Supper when there were divisions and heresies among them. I Corinthians 11:17-22 says "Now in this that I declare unto you I praise you not, that we come together not for the better, but for the worse. For first of all, when we come together in the church, I hear that there be divisions among you; and I partly believe it. For there must be also heresies among you, that they which are approved may be made manifest among you. When we come together therefore into one place, this is not to set the Lord's surper. For in seting every one taketh before other his own supper: and one is hungry, and another is drunken. What? have yo not houses to set and to drink in? or despise ye the church of God, and shame them that have not? What shall I say to you? shall I praise you in this? I praise you not."

Gody, if Thesselenians 3:6 says "Now we command you, brathren, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that we withdraw yourselves from every brother that walketh disordarly, and not after the tradition which he received of us." And I Thorny 6:1-5 says "Let as many servents as are under the yoke count their own masters worthy of all honour, that the name of God and his doctrine be not bleaphered. And they that have believing masters, let them not despise them, because they are breathren; but rether do them; service, because they are faithful and beloved, partakers of the benefit. These things teach and exhort, it may man teach otherwise, and consunt not to wholesome words, even Cont on Page 8






