Parents who desire to request "majority to minority" transfers for their children for the coming school year in the Lubbock Independent School District are requested to do so by

August 17, the date for new student registration. Requests for transfer for reason of going to a smaller school should also be made by August 17. Students who would

attend schools where their race is in a minority. Transportation service is available for students on majority to minority transfers. It is not available for students who transfer for

reason of going to a smaller school. Transfer request forms may be picked up and returned to principals of the schools where students are presently preregistered.

School offices will be open beginning August 1. Students who have moved from one Lubbock attendance area to another will need to register at their new schools on August 17. Schools may be called

beginning August 1 for appointments for earlier preregistration.

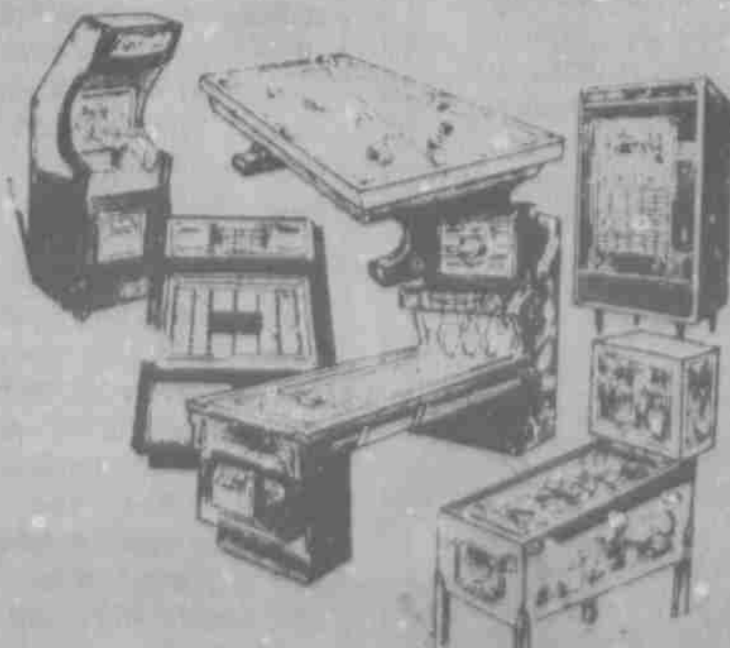

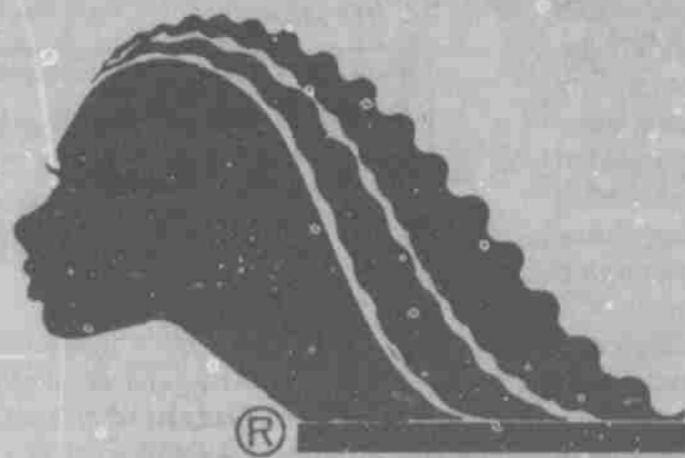

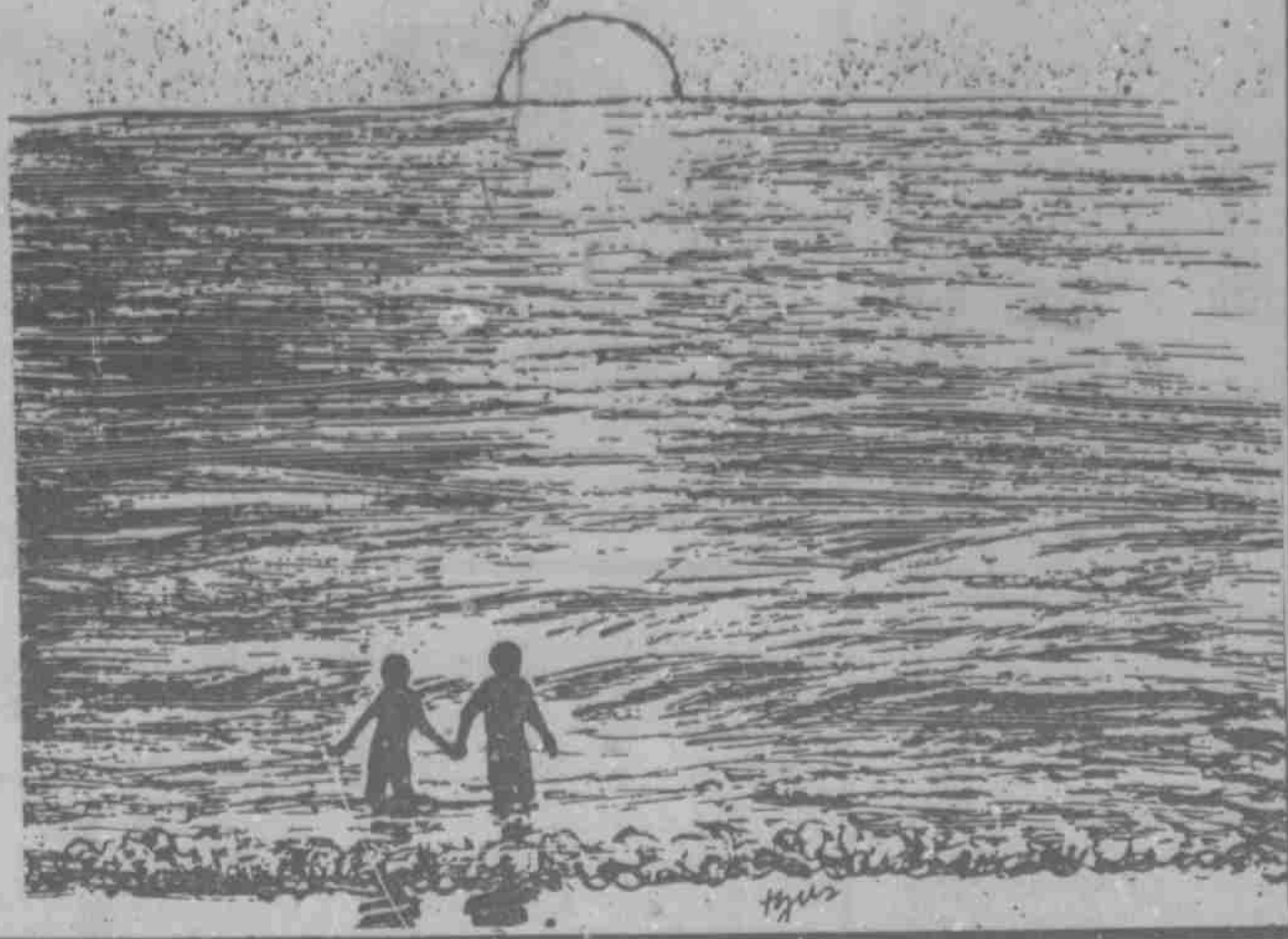

### Black News Briefs

#### Motown Records Sold To White Firms

Los Angeles, Ca.: The nation's best known and most influential Black entertainment company, Motown Records, was sold last week to two major white firms. Founded in 1959 in Detroit, Motown at its peak

was the largest Black owned business in America and was perhaps the major musical trend setter in the nation. For example, in 1966 an amazing 75% of Motown record releases made the top charts compared to an industry average of only 10 percent. The Motown label launched such major artists as Stevie Wonder, Diana Ross and the Supremes, Michael Jackson, Lionel Richie, Smokey Robinson, the Temptations, the Four Tops and Marvin Gaye. However, in recent years the company had not been doing as well. In fact, the company has had only one record to reach the top 40 charts in the last six months. Founder Barry Gordy, Jr. sold the company to MCA Records and Boston Ventures. The sale price was \$61 million.

#### Stevie Wonder Hopes To Run For Mayor of Detroit

Detroit, Mich.: Music star Stevie Wonder shocked Detroit area radio listeners last week when he revealed that he one day plans to run for mayor of the city. Talking on WJLB FM, the 38 year old Wonder said, "This is going to shock you (but) I am very serious about one day running for city." However, Wonder said he did not currently plan to challenge Mayor Coleman Young whose term expires next year. Wonder said a major problem he would like to attack is "the breakdown of the family structure."

### AN EDUCATOR'S OPINION

## Our Democratic Mission

America's appetite for education reform is still robust, and I am delighted that it is. I am even more delighted that reform efforts are at last focusing on profound systemic change, on the comprehensive restructuring of schools. This is a pivotal development.

There is little doubt that America's commitment to a system of free, universal, equal education stamps our nation with uniqueness. In the United States, as in virtually no other country, education is the loom that weaves together our splendidly varied social tapestry. It is also democracy's deliverance. As Thomas Jefferson once put it, "Education is the anvil upon which democracy is forged." Jefferson understood that America's strength would depend on the development and subsequent contribution of all its people.

Jefferson's admonition is today more true than ever before. That is why—as we restructure education—we must grant center stage to the schools' most important element, the young Americans who inhabit them.

I offer this reflection as an antidote to reform discussions that too often ignore the fact that the clientele of our schools is changing. Many of the youngsters in school today—the product of the second largest wave of immigration in our nation's history—look and sound different from their predecessors.

For example, in 1978 alone, more than 850,000 Asians arrived in America. That immigration brought to our shores the largest non-white, non-Western, non-English speaking group ever to enter this country at one time.

That Asian influx is only the most dramatic example of a much larger pattern. By the year 2020, almost 40 percent of America's citizenry will be minorities. Our nation will be home to 47 million Hispanics, 44 million Blacks, 15 million Asians, and 3 million Native Americans.

We dare not underestimate the potential of this population. We dare not squander this national treasure.

No one has better made this point than Maryland Superintendent of Schools David Hornbeck. "There was a time," says Hornbeck, "when the victim of our failure with any youngster was only that youngster. But today, we all become the victim. America can no longer afford, can no longer permit, throwaway or disposable children."

To those insightful words I would add only this. When we make minority children wait for an education, when we deny them equal opportunity, when we consider them too expensive to educate, we not only betray our democratic ideals—we sap America's human resources.

A restructured system of American education must never allow that to happen. Never.

#### Memorial For Black Revolutionary War Vets Approved

Washington, D. C.: The federal government last week gave final approval to plan to build a memorial for Blacks who fought over 200 years ago in the Revolutionary War. The approval came on a 7 to 0 vote by members of the National Capital Memorial Commission in Washington, D. C. The commission also approved memorials for women in the armed services and veterans of the Korean War. The Black Revolutionary War Veterans Memorial will be located near the Vietnam Veterans Memorial.

#### Vanessa Williams Promotes New Career

New York, N. Y.: Former Black Miss America Vanessa Williams has been touring the country recently promoting her new singing career. Williams, the first Black woman to capture the Miss America title, lost the title July 1984 when it was discovered that as a teenager she had posed for some provocative nude pictures. Now 25, Williams has returned to the national spotlight with a popular new album called "The Right Stuff." In recent weeks, she has appeared on television talk shows and conducted numerous interviews around the country. Williams advises young women seeking careers in entertainment to "Have belief in yourself. You can get to the top quickly, but longevity really is talent, and what you are like as an individual."

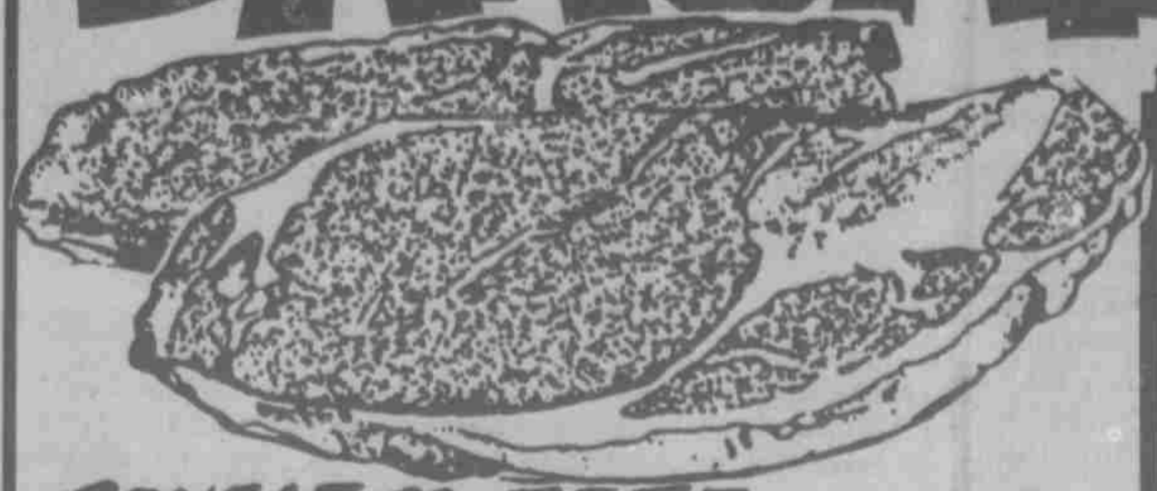

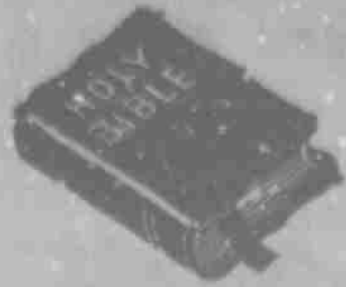

### "THE TRIBULATION PERIOD"

We believe that there will be a great 7 year tribulation period, a time of trouble, such as there never was since the beginning of the world to this time, or ever shall be. This great tribulation period will begin between the resurrection and rapture of the Saints and Christ's coming to reign with His Saints for a thousand years. We do not believe that the church or any of the saints of this dispensation will go through the tribulation period.

#### WHAT THE RAPTURED SAINTS WILL BE DOING DURING THE TRIBULATION PERIOD.

1. The Saints will be rewarded at the Judgment Seat of Christ. Romans 14:10 says that "We shall all stand before the Judgment seat of Christ." and in II Corinthians 5:10 It says "For we must all appear before the Judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad." Notice that the Word Of God is speaking to Christians only.
2. The marriage supper of the Lamb to local Churches. Revelation 19:7-9 says "Let us be glad and rejoice, and give honour to him: for the marriage of the Lamb is come, and his wife hath made herself ready. And to her was granted that she should be arrayed in fine linen, clean and white: for the fine linen is the righteousness of saints. And he saith unto me, Write, Blessed are they which are called unto the marriage supper of the Lamb. And he saith unto me, These are the true sayings of God." The Apostle Paul speaks to the local church which was at Ephesus and tells them that the Church is the Body of Christ and therefore is the Bride of Christ. Ephesians 5:30-32 says "We are members of his body, of his flesh, and of his bones. For this cause shall a man leave his father and mother, and shall be joined unto his wife, and they two shall be one flesh. This is a great mystery: but I speak concerning Christ and the church." Verse 23 of this same chapter says "The husband is the head of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the church; and he is the saviour of the body." Also Ephesians 1:22-23 says that God "gave him to be the head over all things to the church, which is his body," and another local church at Colosse was told in Colossians 1:18 "He is the head of the body, the church:"

#### THE REIGN OF THE ANTI-CHRIST.

1. The tribulation period will be reigned by the Anti-Christ and covers the 7 year period. Revelation chapter 6 through chapter 18 covers the tribulation period and the reign of the Anti-Christ.
2. The church is never mentioned a single time in all of this period. Why? Because the church has been raptured out of this sinful world into heaven to ever be with the Lord.

#### THE RUIN OF THE ANTI-CHRIST.

Revelation 19:11 through 20:15 John says "I saw heaven opened, and behold a white horse; and he that sat upon him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness he doth judge and make war. His eyes were as a flame of fire, and on his head were many crowns; and he had a name written, that no man knew, but he himself. And he was clothed with a vesture dipped in blood; and his name is called the Word of God. And the armies which were in heaven followed him upon white horses, clothed in fine linen, white and clean. And out of his mouth goeth a sharp sword, that with it he should smite the nations: and he shall rule them with a rod of iron; and he treadeth the winepress of the fierceness and wrath of Almighty God. And he hath on his vesture and on his thigh a name written, KING OF KINGS, AND LORD OF LORDS. And I saw an angel standing in the sun; and he cried with a loud voice, saying to all the fowls that fly in the midst of heaven, Come and gather yourselves together unto the supper of the great God; that ye may eat the flesh of kings, and the flesh of captains, and the flesh of mighty men, and the flesh of horses, and of them that sit on them, and the flesh of all men, both free and bond, both small and great. And I saw the beast, and the kings of the earth, and their armies, gather together to make war against him that sat on the horse, and against his army. And the beast was taken, and with him the false prophet that wrought miracles before him, with which he deceived them that had received the mark of the beast, and them that worshipped his image. These both were cast alive into the lake of fire burning with brimstone. And the remnant were slain with the sword of him that sat upon the horse, which sword proceeded out of his mouth: and all the fowls were filled with their flesh. And I saw an angel come down from heaven, having the key of the bottomless pit and a great chain in his hand. And he laid hold on the dragon, that old serpent, which is the Devil, and Satan, and bound him a thousand years, and cast him into the bottomless pit, and shut him up, and set a seal upon him, that he should deceive the nations no more, till the thousand years should be fulfilled; and after that he must be loosed a little season. And I saw thrones, and they sat upon them, and judgment was given unto them: and I saw the souls of them that were beheaded for the witness of Jesus, and for the word of God, and which had not worshipped the beast, neither his image, neither had received his mark upon their foreheads, or in their hands; and they lived and reigned with Christ a thousand years. But the rest of the dead lived not again until the thousand years were finished. This is the first resurrection. Blessed and holy is he that hath part in the first resurrection: on such the second death hath no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with him a thousand years. And when the thousand years are expired, Satan shall be loosed out of his prison, and shall go out to deceive the nations which are in the four quarters of the earth, Gog and Magog, to gather them together to battle; the number of whom is as the sand of the sea. And they went up on the breadth of the earth, and compassed the camp of the saints about, and the beloved city; and fire came down from God out of heaven, and devoured them. And the devil that deceived them was cast into the lake of fire and brimstone, where the beast and the false prophet are, and shall be tormented day and night for ever and ever." And I saw a great white throne, and him that sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away; and there was found no place for them. And I saw the dead, small and great, stand before God; and the books were opened: and another book was opened, which is the book of life: and the dead were judged out of those things which were written in the books, according to their works. And the sea gave up the dead which were in it; and death and hell delivered up the dead which were in them: and they were judged every man according to their works. And whosoever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire.
