





Now that the NAACP is publishing "From the Desk of the NAACP" and Pastor J. H. Ford is bringing those old fashion scriptures back to mind with a today's message, "I didn't know" must take the route of "sour milk." To Rose Wilson and Pastor Ford, it is very gratifying to see you come forth with words for the community, thank you.

If we can get the Southwest Digest as our

weekly source of information that is read by the majority, a major accomplishment in the communication gap will be bridged. Many criticize this paper for the lack of local information articles. Well, the February 23rd edition was very informative. East Lubbock has complained about no black radio station, which we do need. However, how many of you would not work for \$15,000 a year just because you can't get a \$30,000 a year job? Well, we don't have a black radio station, so let's the maximum utilization out of what we have, a black newspaper. T. J., can you envision the Southwest Digest with a half-dozen carriers delivering door-todoor.

With continued involve-

ment by the community with the contents of this paper, it can only get better and better. The Southwest Digest is a small paper, with a limited staff of reporters, however, with more community involvement with key issues that the community has interest, a service can be rendered to the entire black population.

Our community is facing some very grave internal problems that requires total community awareness and involvement. Enlightening the community on a one-onone basis or small groups is not fast or effective enough to stem the increasing drug, crime, and pregnancy problems we are experiencing. Too many of the community feel that by either closing their eyes or just plain ignoring the problems somehow they will go away. Our eyes have been closed too long already as too many of our youth and young adults have already reached a point where they will not amount to a "hill of beans." Even worst, we are allowing the younger ones to admire and generate desires to be just like the lost ones.

Hopefully we can get the word out to majority in time to salvage the younger ones. For this reason, our media tool must be what we already have avaliable and we must be rentless in our efforts to get more and more. to read the information. We need to hear from Dr. Damon Hill about the professional views of drugs on east Lubbock Blacks. We need to hear testimonies from users and user parents. We need to hear from Officers Britt and Price about east Lubbock crimes. We need testimonies from our teenagers who have babies and how it has affected their lives.

It is not expected that our community will be drug. crime and teen pregnancy

Robert McNair

Scientist Astronaut - 1950 to 1985

The second Black American Astronaut to fly in space. Ronald McNair was a scholar, a musician, a boxer, a scientist, and a Southerner.

He was inspired to study Algebra while working in the cotton and tabocco fields of Lake City, South Carolina where he and his brothers were taunted by an arrogant overseer. McNair went on to earn a Bachelor of Science degree in physics, magna cum laude, from North Carolina A & TUniversity in Greensboro, He was named a Prosidential Scholar and Ford Foundation Fellow. He earned his doctorate in Physics from Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT).

McNair became recognized world-wide as an expert laser physics and worked with the Hughes Aircraft Corporation before he was selected into the Astronaut program in 1978 at age 28.

He made his first flight in February, 1984, on a Challenger Mission.

Religious Singer - 1911 to 1972


