## Big Citizen Town Hall Meeting Sunday Night At The Bridge!

A Trio of Black Men has called this meeting, because there is too much mess in the East Lubbock Community. That mess include: too many burglaries, too many murders, too much drug involvement of young people selling and using crack.

problem as this mess is seen all over Lubbock," says Donnell Hooper.

"We want to have a discussion about this mess and invite all citizens to attend," says Hillary Hutchinson, Jr.

"It is important that we all get involve with this important meeting," says Larry Alexander.

## Whitney Gipson: All-American Track Star

In 2009, Whitney Gipson, a sophomore at Texas Christian University (TCU), earned All-Conference honors in the women's long jump during the indoor season after soaring 20 feet, 3 1/2 inches to place third overall ... She also captured first-place honors at the Arkansas Last Chance in the women's long jump, while collecting runner-up honors in the triple jump in Fayetteville ... Gipson had a breakthrough outdoor season in which she collected All-America honors in the long jump at the NCAA Outdoor Championships ... She posted her first All-America showing in Fayetteville in the women's long jump, soaring to a 13th-place finish in the finals ... Gipson was the only freshman in the nation to make the finals in the long jump at the NCAA Championships ... She soared to a fifth-place finish in the long jump and automatically qualified for the 2009 NCAA Championships at the Midwest Regional in Norman, Okla. ... The freshman, who leaped 20 feet, 7 inches on her final jump to qualify for nationals, posted a personal-best leap and the second-best jump in program history in Norman ...

30 jumpers ... At the LSU Relays, Gipson collected runner-up honors with the program's third-best leap ever ... The freshman was also part of a Mountain West Conference Championship 4x100 squad, helping the quartet claim first-place honors with a time of 44.66 seconds ... She also helped the 4x1 collect first-place honors with a seasonal-best time of 44.40 seconds at the Texas Tech Invitational.

### Birdville High School

Gipson, a three-time all-area sprinter and jumper from Birdville, Texas, comes to TCU after competing in the long and triple jump for Birdville High School ... She posted a top leap of 19 feet, 10 inches in the long jump and a personal best mark of 40 feet in the triple jump ... A talented sprinter, Gipson has also posted a top time of 24.01 in the 200 ... Overall, she placed second in both the long and triple jump at the 2008 4A Texas State Championship ... Also excelled on the hardwood earning MVP honors following district play in 2008 ...

She was invited to play in the DFW All-Star basketball game after earning four letters on the court.

She is the granddaughter of Mr. & Mrs. Curtis (Hattie) Gipson of Lubbock, and daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Winston Gipson.

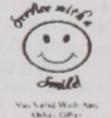

**From the Desk of Parson D.A. Smith**  
**"An Amuck Behavior: The U. S. Supreme Court"**

**We Thank God for Jesus**  
**"America Is Dammed!!!"**  
 Written by Evangelist Billy "BJ" Morrison, III - Your brother in Christ Jesus always.

The action of the United States Supreme Court last week should be considered as one of shame and disgrace toward every American (even the corporate thugs). The action of the Gestapo style 5 Supreme Court Judges in a 5-4 ruling in Citizens United v. FEC affect every voting and potential voter in America.

The Voting Rights Act of 1964 could be silenced by a powerful in the closet "Hitler Style" Corporations who could buy U. S. House Representatives, Senators and even the Presidency of the United States. Here is a case where "big money" will truly eat up, so to speak "little money."

Doug Kendall, writer of the Huffington Post wrote the Supreme Court's "conservative majority re-wrote the Constitution to give corporations - never mentioned in the Constitution - the same right to influence the electoral process as "We the People" as the NYT's Adam Liptak explains, "Sweeping aside a century-old understanding and overruling two important precedents, a bitterly divided Supreme...ruled that the government may not ban political spending by cooperation's in candidate elections." The justices did what many progressives feared for months it would do: hold that long-standing restrictions on corporate campaign spending violate the First Amendment.

Kendall noted that in a breathtaking dissent that was read aloud from the bench and was joined by Justices Ginsburg, Breyer, and Sotomay that the ruling is startlingly activist and plainly contrary to constitutional text and history. Two centuries ago, the Supreme Court under Chief Justice Marshall first recognized that corporations are artificial creatures of the State, subject to government oversight to ensure they do not abuse the special privileges granted to them. Corporation cannot vote in election, stand for election, or served officials, but the U. S. Supreme Court ruled they can overwhelm the political process using the profits generated by the special privileges

granted to corporations. In a profoundly wrong interpretation of the First Amendment, the Court granted corporations the right to drown out the voices of individual Americans in our Nation's elections. A blogger noted that we as Americans have been sold down the river. The blogger wondered how much these corporations spent to get this kind of verdict. The blogger noted that (morally) the justices had no idea what justice is. Another blogger noted: "Since when are Corporations a living breathing human entity? Be ready to be implanted with a tracking devise, a probe in your body when boarding a plane, being declared unfit to be human and most of all your rights as citizens will not exist anymore. Corporations will control the school board, the city council, the states and of course the Senate and the House of Representatives. Hello the United States of Corporate America. Some Americans are probably wondering if the Anglo god

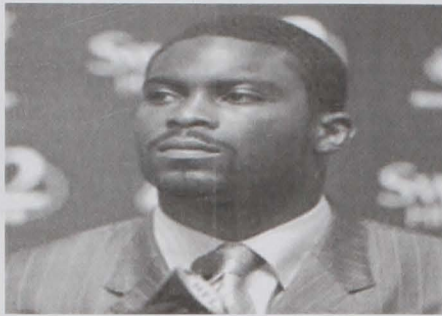
## Michael Vick Shows Rebuilt Life on New BET Docu-Series

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Michael Vick returned to the site of his gruesome dogfighting crimes, looked at an empty dog bowl left behind in a dingy cage and wondered how he ever could have risked fame, freedom and fortune for "Bad Newz Kennels."

"This is hard to imagine myself doing this years ago, man," Vick says, cameras rolling.

His visit to the property he once owned in Surry County, Va., where he trained pitbulls for vicious fights and helped drown or hang dogs that didn't do well, is a teaser of what's ahead in his docu-series "The Michael Vick Project."

Vick candidly tells how he became entangled in a dogfighting ring that sent him to prison and temporarily halted his NFL career as part of a series that debuts next month on BET. Vick says the 10-part series that premieres Feb. 2 will show he's

achanged man after a tragic fall from stardom he says "was all my fault."

"At times, it's hard to talk about it, but for the most part, if you talk about it and let it all out, it kind of helps put the demons to rest," Vick told The Associated Press on Thursday.

Vick served an 18-month prison sentence for operating a

dogfighting ring. He returned to the NFL this season as a backup QB with the Philadelphia Eagles.

In the first episode, Vick openly discusses living a "double life" of running the operation at the same time he was making Pro Bowls and signing a 10-year, \$130 million contract with the Atlanta Falcons. Vick explains in detail the childhood experiences he had with dogfighting
