

In my experience with Lubbock, we of the east side general operate on rumors with the truth being known by only a select few. Butler Park was not, is not your park, it is our park, the entire community and city. Whenever there is a place where all of us do not feel comfortable, then we will take steps to correct the situation. Do not complain about the police or Councilman Patterson, they are only doing what was requested by the more responsible citizens of the community. The blame lies with each person who frequent the park and allow those actions to occur that are not tolerated in a civilized society. If you do not conduct yourself in accordance with the expectation of the community or society, then you must accept the consequences, or move somewhere they will accept your behavior. # WHY ARGUE? THE FACTS ARE HERE!

Land Commissioner Garry Mauro Urges Black Texans to Use Veterans Programs

Over the next several weeks a series of articles on the various Texas Veterans Land Board programs will be featured. These programs are available to eligible Texas Veterans and are funded by bonds which are repaid by Veterans using the programs.

In 1946, the Texas Legislature created the Texas Veterans Land Program, which was approved by the voters of Texas by almost a 3 to 1 margin. This program was designed to provide capital for land purchases by eligible Texas Veterans.

The Veterans Land Board was created to administer the program. The Board consists of the Texas Land Commissioner, who serves as Chairman, and two members appointed by the Governor who represent the financial and Veterans communities. The Texas Veterans Lend Board made its first loan in 1949 and has made more than 94,000 since.

Under the terms of the original Texas Veterans Land Program, the VLB would lend money to Texas Veterans returning from World Waz II to use for land purchases. Texas Veterans were charged only loan amount and administrative costs. Texas' approach was in sharp contrast to cash bonus programs begun by the majority of other states. In cash bonus states, each Veteran received a one-time, no-stringsattached cash amount for service rendered, ranging from \$30 to as much as \$300.

Today the Texas Veterans Land Program lends oligible Texas Veterans up to \$20,000 for the purchase of five or more acres of land. The current interest rate is 8.75 percent and the maximum There is no penalty for early pay-off of the loan. In 1983, newly-elected Texas Land Commissioner Garry Mauro successfully obtained the approval of the Texas Legislature and an overwhelming majority of Texas voters to create a Texas Veterans Housing Assistance Program. This program was expanded in 1986 to include the Texas Vet-

erans Home Improvement Program.

The Texas Veterans Housing Assistance Program (VHAP) lends eligible Texas Veterans up to \$20,000 at 9 percent interest to use toward the purchase of a home. These loans can be used in conjunction with VA, FHA or conventional loans. In most cases a Texas Veteran can buy a home with no down payment by combining a federal VA loan with a Texas VHAP loan.

The Texas Veterans Home Improvement Program lends eligible Texas Veterans up to \$17,500 at 10.5 percent interest for 15 years to make improvements to their homes. Veterans can receive loans for a variety of home improvements including room additions, roofing, attached garages, sidewalks, driveways, screened porches, patios, decks, fences and thermal windows.

In 1986, the Board increased the benefits available to Texas Veterans by allowing eligible Veterans to participate in all three loan programs one time. Prior to 1986, Texas Veterans were limited to one loan through the Texas Veterans Land Board. Participation in any of the VLB programs does not prevent a Texas Veteran from receiving any other benefits offered through federai Veterans programs.

Today, eligible Texas Veterans are entitled to up to \$57,500 in long-term, low-interest loans through the VLB to acquire land, houses, or make home improvements. Land Commissioner Garry Mauro is making a special effon to increase Black participation in the programs. A contract has been entered into with two Black-owned firms to assist in the implementation and attainment of this goal. Commissioner Mauro states "The Texas Veterans Land Board programs are the best in the nation and are enabling thousands of Texans to buy houses, land, or make improvements to existing homes. I am committed to ensure that Black Texans receive their fair

Dear Editor:

We Texans can thank Senator Lloyd Bentsen on the Intelligence Committee and Senator Phil Gramm on the Armed Services Committee for the perts they when. played committees, after an intense examination of the Intermediate Range Nuclear Forces (INF) Treaty. recommended Senate approval of the Treaty. After 21 days of hearings, the Senate Foreign Relations Committee on Marh 30 also overwhelmingly (by a vote of 17 to 2) recommended approval (AP, Mar 30/88).

I have urged Senators Bentsen and Gramm, as the INF Treaty is detated this month on the Senate floor, to oppose any amendments or reservations, however harmless they may seemS. harmless they may seem. Such amendments, if adopted, would require renegotiationss of the INF Treaty and probably would halt progress toward the much more important Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty (START) which President Reagan seeks to conclude this year.

INF and START together would make America much more secure by greatly reducing the number of nuclear weapons aimed at us and our allies. Further, INF would eliminate nuclear weapons with extremely short flight times (7 to 10 minutes), thus ending a dangerous hair triggered situation in which a false alarm or equipmente failure on either side during a crisis could set off a nuclear holocaust buy mistake.





"THE RESURRECTION OF JESUS CHRIST"

We believe in and accept the sacred and Holy Scriptures upon this subject at their face value. We believe that Christ rose budily "the third day according to the Scriptures."

#### THE EVIDENCE OF HIS RESURRECTION.

1. The testimony of the aggel. Matthew 28:6-7 says "He is not here: for he is risen as he said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay. And go quickly, and tell His disciples that he is risen from the dead; and, behold, he goeth before you into Gallee; and there shall ye see him."

2. The testimony of Jesus to the apostles. He fold them in Luke 24:39 "Behold my hands and my feet, that It Is I myself: handle me, end see; for a spirit hath not flesh and bones as ye see me have."

3. His invitation to Thomas In John 20:27 "Then saith he to Thomas, Reach hither thy finger, and behold my hands; and reach alther thy hand, and thoust it into my side: and be not faithless but believing."

4. The declaration of the Holy Scriptures in 1 Corinthians 15:4 "And that he was burled, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures." Mark 16:6 says "Ye seek Jesus of Nazareth, which was crucified; he is risen; he is not here: behold the place where they laid him."

5. The empty tomb. Luke 24:1-7 "Now upon the first day of the week, very early in the morning, they came into the sepulchre, bringing the spices which they had prepared, and certain others with them. And they found the stone rolled away from the sepulcher. And they entered In, and found not the body of the Lord Jesus. And It came to pass, as they were much perplexed thereabout, behold, two men stood by them in shining garments: And as they were afraid, and bowed down their faces to the earth, they said unto them, Why seek ye the living among the dead? He is not here, but is risen: remember how he spake unto you when he was yet in Gaillee, Saying, The Son of man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the ghird day rise again."

6. The change wrought in the apostles.

a. After His death they were disheartened and afraid. John 20:19 says "Then the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled for fear of the Jews, came Jesus and stood in the midst, and saith unto them, Peace be unto you." Luke 24:37 says "But they were terrified and affrighted, and supposed that they had seen a spirit."

b. After He revealed Himself to them in His resurrected body, they were very bold in preaching and witnessing about the resurrection. They would die rather than give up

this precious doctrine.

(1) Hear what Peter had to say on the day of Pentecost In Acts 2:22-36 "Ye men of Israel, hear these words; Jesus of Nazareth, a man approved of God among you by miracles and wonders and signs, which God did by him in the midst of you, as ye yourselves also know: Him, being delivered by the determinate counselland foreknowledge of God, ye have taken, and by wicked hands have crcified and slain: Whom God hath raised up, having loosed the pains of death: because it was not possible that he should be holden of it. For David speaketh concerning him, I foresaw the Lord always before my face, for he is on my right hand, that I should not be moved: Therefore did my heart rejoice, and my tongue was glad; moreover also my flesh shall rest in hope: Because thou wilt not leave my soul in hell, neither wilt thou suffer thine Holy One to see corruption. Thou hast made known to me the ways of life; thou shalt make me full of Joy with thy countenance. Men and brethren, let me freely speak unto you of the patriarch David, that he is both dead and buried, and his sepulchre is with us unto this day. Therefore being a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him, that the fruit of his loins, according to the flesh, he would raise up Christ to sit on his throne; He seeing this before spake of the resurrection of Christ, that his soul was not left in hell, neither his flesh did see corruption. This Jesus hath God reised up, whereof we all are witnesses. Therefore being by the right hand of God exalted, and having received of the Father the promise of the Holy Ghost, he hath shed forth this, which ye now see and hear. For David is not ascended into the heavens: but he saith himself, The Lord said unto my Lord, sit thou on my right hand, Until I make thy foes thy footstool. Therefore let all the house of Israel know assuredly, that Cod hath made that same Jesus, whom ye have crucified, both Lord and Christ."

(2) Hear Peter again in Acts 3:14-15 "But ye denied the Holy One and the Just, and desired a murderer to be granted unto you; And killed the Prince of life, whom God hath raised from the dead; whereof we are witnesses."

(3) Note him before the Sanhedrin and others in Acts 4:10 "Be it known unto you all, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom ye crucified, whom God raised from the dead, even by him doth this man stand here before you whole." Acts 4:33 says "And with great power gave the apostlos witness of the resurrection of the Lord Jesus: and great grace was upon them att." Also in Acts 5:29-32 It says "Then Peter and the other apostles enswered and said, We ought to obey God rather than men. The God of our fathers raised up Jesus, whom ye slew and hanged on a true. Him hath God exaited with his right hand to be a Frince and a Saviour, for to give repentance to Israel, and forgiveness of sins. And we are his witnesses of these things; and so is also the Holy Ghost, whom God hath given to them that obey him."

7. Stephen saw Jesus standing at the right hand of God In Acts 7:54-56 which reads "When they heard these things, they were cut to the heart, and they gnashed on him with their tecth. 4. Without It, the deed in Christ have perished. I Corinthians 15:18 says "Then they also which are fatten asleep in Christ are perished."

5. Without II, all our hope would be in this life only, and this would make us of all men most miserable. In closing, I Corinthians 15:19 says "if in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men most miserable. But now is Christ risen from the dead,"
