Although many activities are set throughout the United States of America this week and a national holiday Monday, January 18, 1988, the gala affair for the birthday celebration of the late Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. will be held Sunday evening, January 17, 1988 in the Lubbock Memorial Civic Center Theater, beginning at 6 p. m. This event is sponsored annually by the local Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Celebration Committee.

Guest speaker for this year's event on Sunday will be Rev. McKinney Young, pastor of the Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church of Atlanta, Georgia. Rev. Young is expected to address many issues which are relevant to citizens of Lubbock.

The King Celebration will begin tonight, Thursday, January 14th, at the Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church, 2202 Southeast Drive, at 7:30 p. m. with the Rev. C. C. Peoples, pastor of the Mt. 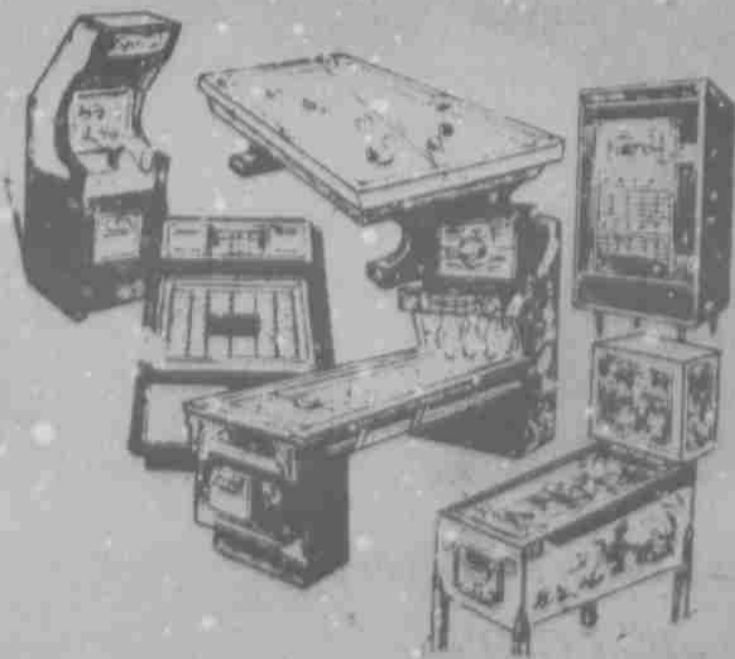

It Needs To Be Said

For the year 1988, if we don't accomplish anything else, we all should work very hard to change the thinking of our youth. Basically, our youth have all the ingredients to excel, however bad attitudes and drugs are ruining their chance for success.

Many of our youth has acquired the attitude that their parents and adults, in general, do not know what's going on in today's world. That adults are out of touch with things, that they are old fashion and can't relate to current trends and thinking. In a few cases, it is maybe true, however, the majority of today's adults are more aware and knowledgeable of current trends and thinking than they display. If our youth were as intelligent as they think they are, they would realize that it is the adults that create their fashions, music, lifestyles and everything else they enjoy. About the only thing the youth can call their own original maybe the language they speak as slang, everything else is adult created. This includes the drugs you use, the cars you drive with the loud music and fancy lights. Therefore, if the youth are as intelligent and "in to it" as they pretend, then why do they feel adults are "out of it?"

One thought is, adults do not project themselves as competent and knowledgeable people. Too many of today's black adults have lied so much to others that they have come to believe their own lies. This creates a false individual that is fearful of truly ascertaining themselves as they must insure that their lies do not catch-up with them. Therefore, instead of getting tough with their children, letting them know with examples, black adults simply turn their heads to what they know as fact. It is very hard to accept that parents can not detect that their teenage child is using drugs. Drug use is very difficult to hide from an individual that knows you and every parent should know their children very well. Turning your head from the truth does not make it go away, you only compound the problem and that is where many parents go astray. They deny the fact their children are using drugs, they deny their children have a bad attitude in hope it will go away. Well, it won't and until you, the parent, use positive action to correct the problem, no one, not even the police or prison will change them. A bad attitude child is one that always right, can get along with others, especially those in authority and has little respect for others, does that sound familiar, mom and dad?

Giving your child material things without an understanding of what you, the parent, went through to get it is not a sound practice. Not making your child a responsible individual is also not a sound practice. Showing your love with gifts and a carefree life is sending your child on a head-on collision with serious trouble. Discipline is also a sign of love, it shows that you want your child to be able to adapt to the lifestyle outside the home. To hold down a job, to be a Christian, to make anything out of yourself requires discipline and, in most cases, it is self discipline. We would like to call to your attention the opportunity for your child to get a majority-to-minority transfer from O. L. Slaton to J. T. Hutchinson, Smylie Wilson, and Atkins for grades seven through nine and Mackenzie or Evans in grades eight or nine. This transfer could begin at the beginning of the second semester which is January 25, 1988.

If you are interested in securing a transfer for your child, please contact the principal of O. L. Slaton, Mr. Ramon Abarca.

Dear Parent:

Because of our most recent negotiations with the Justice Department about our consent decree, it will be necessary for us to relocate some students from the O. L. Slaton magnet program to the J. T. Hutchinson magnet program. The students who will be asked to go to J. T. Hutchinson on January 22, 1988, will be those seventh and eighth grade minority students who transferred to O. L. Slaton for non-academic magnet courses, such as swimming, gymnastics, or dance. Ninth grade students may go if they wish. If the student qualified for an honors course, then the student may remain at O. L. Slaton.

Even though the students will be assigned to J. T. Hutchinson as full-time students, they will still be in the magnet course at the Lomax Center. We will provide transportation from J. T. Hutchinson just as we provide transportation from O. L. Slaton to the Lomax Center.

We are simply saying that the O. L. Slaton and the J. T. Hutchinson magnet programs will become the same and that any Black or Hispanic student wanting to take only the non-academic magnet courses will attend the J. T. Hutchinson campus, and any Anglo student wanting to take only those courses will attend O. L. Slaton. We realize that this may not be the most appropriate time, but we ask for your understanding and cooperation. If you have a question, please call me at 766-1024.

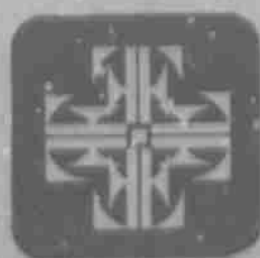

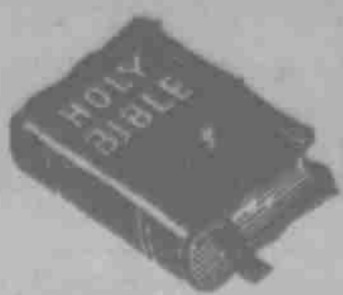

In I Thessalonians 4:13-18 it says "But I would not have you to be ignorant, brethren, concerning them which are asleep, that ye sorrow not, even as others which have no hope. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so them also which sleep in Jesus will God bring with him. For this we say unto you by the word of the Lord, that we which are alive and remain unto the coming of the Lord shall not prevent them which are asleep. For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the trump of God; and the dead in Christ shall rise first: Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air; and so shall we ever be with the Lord. Wherefore comfort one another with these words." The Lord is coming with His saints. Notice in Jude 14-18 "And Enoch also, the seventh from Adam, prophesied of these, saying, Behold, the Lord cometh with ten thousands of his saints, to execute judgment upon all, and to convince all that are ungodly among them of all their ungodly deeds which they have ungodly committed, and of all their hard speeches which ungodly sinners have spoken against him. These are murmurers, complainers, walking after their own lusts; and their mouth speaketh great swelling words, having men's persons in admiration because of advantage. But, beloved, remember ye the words which were spoken before of the apostles of our Lord Jesus Christ; How that they told you "here should be mockers in the last time, who should walk after their own ungodly lusts."

WHERE HE IS COMING

We can be looking for Jesus to come OUT OF THE EAST. Jesus says in Matthew 24:27 "For as the lightning cometh out of the east, and shineth even unto the west; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be." God tells us plainly where He is going to stand. Zechariah 14:1-5 says "Behold, the day of the Lord cometh, and thy spoil shall be divided in the midst of thee. For I will gather all nations against Jerusalem to battle; and the city shall be taken, and the houses rifled, and the women ravished; and half of the city shall go forth into captivity, and the residue of the people shall not be cut off from the city. Then shall the Lord go forth, and fight against those nations, as when he fought in the day of battle. And his feet shall stand in that day upon the mount of Olives, which is before Jerusalem on the east, and the mount of Olives shall cleave in the midst thereof toward the east and toward the west, and there shall be a very great valley; and half of the mountain shall remove toward the north, and half of it toward the south. And ye shall flee to the valley of the mountains; for the valley of the mountains shall reach unto Azel; yea, ye shall flee, like as ye fled from before the earthquake in the days of Uzziah king of Judah; and the Lord my God shall come, and all the saints with thee." Much is said in 2 Peter 3:1-18. Verse 3 says "Knowing this first, that there shall come in the last days scoffers, walking after their own lusts, and saying, Where is the promise of his coming?... Verse 10 says "But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night;... and verse 12 says "Looking for and hastening unto the coming of the day of God..." In closing, verses 17 and 18 says "Ye therefore, beloved, seeing ye know these things before, beware lest ye also, being led away with the error of the wicked, fall from your own steadfastness. But grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and for ever. Amen." WHEN HE IS COMING to be confused next month.

fresh, aggressive approach to solving our problems and the problems of state government, then I believe

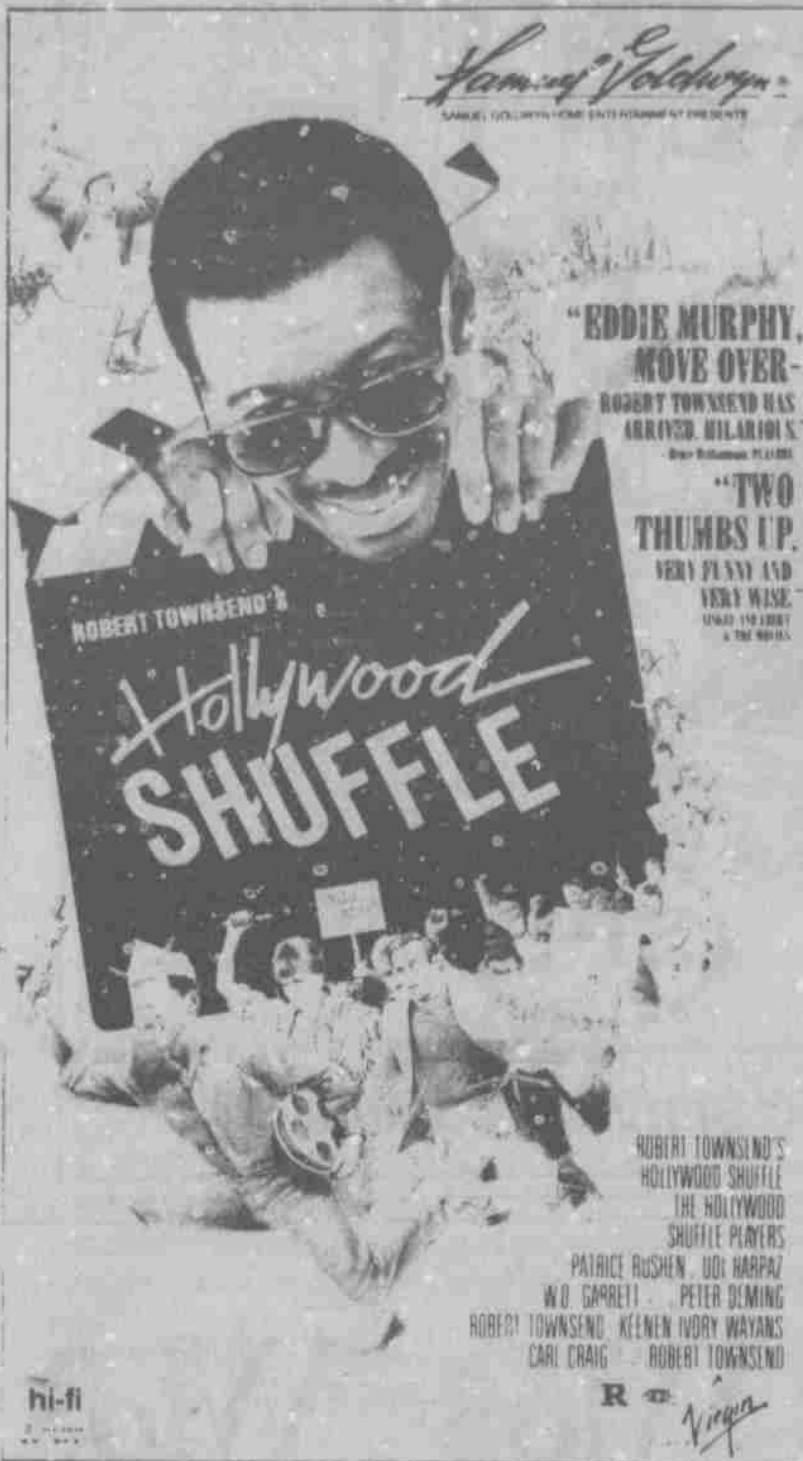
