

It Needs To Be Said

For the year 1988, if we don't accomplish anything else, we all should work very hard to change the thinking of our youth. Basically, our youth have all the ingredients to excel, however bad attitudes and drugs are ruining their chance for success.

Many of our youth has acquired the attitude that their parents and adults, in general, do not know what's going on in today's world. That adults are out of touch with things, that they are old fashion and can't relate to current trends and thinking. In a few cases, this maybe true, however, the majority of today's adults are more aware and knowledgeable of current trends and thinking than they display. If our youth were as intelligent as they think they are, they would realize that it is the adults that create their fashions, music, lifestyles and everything else they enjoy. About the only thing the youth can call their own original maybe the language they speak as slang, everything else is adult created. This includes the drugs you use, the cars you drive with the loud music and fancy lights. Therefore, if the youth are as intelligent and "in to it" as they pretend, then why do they feel adults are "out of it?"

One thought is, adults do not project themselves as competent and knowledgeable people. Too many of today's black adults have lied so such to others that they have come to believe their own lies. This creates a false individual that is fearful of truly ascertaining themselves as they must insure that their lies do not catch-up with them. Therefore, instead of getting tough with their children, letting them know with examples, black adults simply turn their heads to what they know as fact. It is very hard to accept that parents can not detect that their teenage child is using drugs. Drug use is very difficult to hide from an individual that knows you and every parent should know their children very well. Turning your head from the truth does not make it go away, you only compound the problem and that is where many parents go astray. They deny the fact their children are using drugs, they deny their children have a bad attitude in hope it will go away. Well, it won't and until you, the parent, use positive action to correct the problem, no one, not even the police or prison will change them. A bad attitude child is one that always right, can get along with others, especially those in authority and has little respect for others, does that sound familiar, mom and dad? Giving your child material things without an understanding of what you, the parent, went through to get it is not a sound practice. Not making your child a responsible individual is also not a sound practice. Showing your love with gifts and a carefree life is sending your child on a head-on collision with serious trouble. Discipline is also a sign of love, it shows that you want your child to be able to adapt to the lifestyle outside the home. To hold down a job, to be a Christian, to make anything out of yourself requires discipline and, in most cases, it is self discipline. If the parent does not maintain discipline, even of their teenagers, then that teenager will carry a lack of discipline into young adult. In 1948, let's show our youth love and understanding. Let's allow them to speak their problems to us without fear of being "put down". Let's give them guidance and instruction that they must follow or they must pay the price. It may hurt you, the parent, a great deal to discipline your upper-teenager, but will that hurt be as great as seeing your child in serious trouble with drugs or

"Tranfers For Racial Balance"

(Editor's Note: In case, you lost the letters sent concerning your children. We thought you'd like to have a copy of them.)

Dear Parents:

We would like to call to your attention the opportunity for your child to get a majority-to-minority transfer from O. L. Slaton to J. T. Hutchinson, Smylie Wilson, and Atkins for grades seven through noise and Mackenzie or Evans in grades eight or nine. This transfer could begin at the beginning of the second semester which is January 25, 1988.

If you are interested in securing a transfer for your child, please contact the principal of O. L. Slaton, Mr. Ramon Abarca.

Dear Parent:

Because of our most recent negotiations with the Justice Department about our concent decree, it will be necessary for us to relocate some students from the O.L. Slaton magnet program to the J. T. Hutchinson magnet program. The students who will be asked to go to J. T. Hutchinson on January 22, 1988, will be those seventh and eighth grade minority students who transferred to O.L. Slaton for pon-academic magnet courses, such as swimming, gymnastics, or dance. Ninth grade students may go if they wish. If the student quelified for an honors course, then the atudent may remain at O.L. Slaton.

Even though the students will be assigned to J. T. Hutchinson as full-time students, they will still be in the magnet course at the Lomax Center. We will provide transportationn from J. T. Hutchinson just as we provide transportation from O. L. Slaton to the Lomax Center. We are simply saying that the O. L. Slaton and the J. T. Hutchincon magnet programs will become the same and that any Black or Hispanic student wanting to take only the non-academic magnet courses will attend the J. T. Hutchinson campus, and any Anglo student wanting to take only those courses will attend O. L. Staton. We realize that this may not be the most appropriate time, but we ask for your understanding and cooperation. If you have a question, please call me at 766-1024.



Your Absence from Church is A Vote To Close its Doors



The Guiding Spire

There is a story told of a church steeple which was located on the southeast coast of England. High above the ocean water level stood the church on a cliff. The pyramidal spire of the church almost reached the clouds. One day a hurricane destroyed the church. The povertystricken congregation were not able to rebuild the church and made arrangements to worship in a neighborhing community. One day a representative of the executive department of the British navy inquired of the congregation as to when they planned to rebuild the church. He was informed that the congregation could not rebuild because of monetary problems. Tearfully he said, "The British Admiralty will rebuild it for you. That spire was on all of our charts. Every one of His Britannic Majesty's ships set its course by that spire."




