A Near Tragedy

Two years ago, a little girl we will call Angel was taken away from her parents by the Department of Child Services and given into someone else's custody. Angel's Mom was addicted

to valium and downers and her Dad was hooked on crack cocaine.

Both parents were on rehabilitation programs that weren't working for them. Angel's Mom had tried program after program without success.

Mom applied for and was provisionally accepted into yet another program. Instead she kept using and using until she finally passed out on her living room rug one day.

Dad, however, really wanted to change. He began working at the Narconon Professional Detox Center which uses the drug rehabilitation methods developed by American writer L. Ron Hubbard. He carefully reviewed his prior life and decided he needed to make a clean, fresh start, for himself and Angel. He filed for divorce.

He attended classes at Narconon every night, even though tired after a day at work. Scraping and scrounging and working late hours, he completed courses renewing his ability to confront and communicate.

Dad began to construct a new kind of life for himself. The Narconon staff were so pleased with his efforts that they rewarded him with a scholarship from their Benefactor Fund. 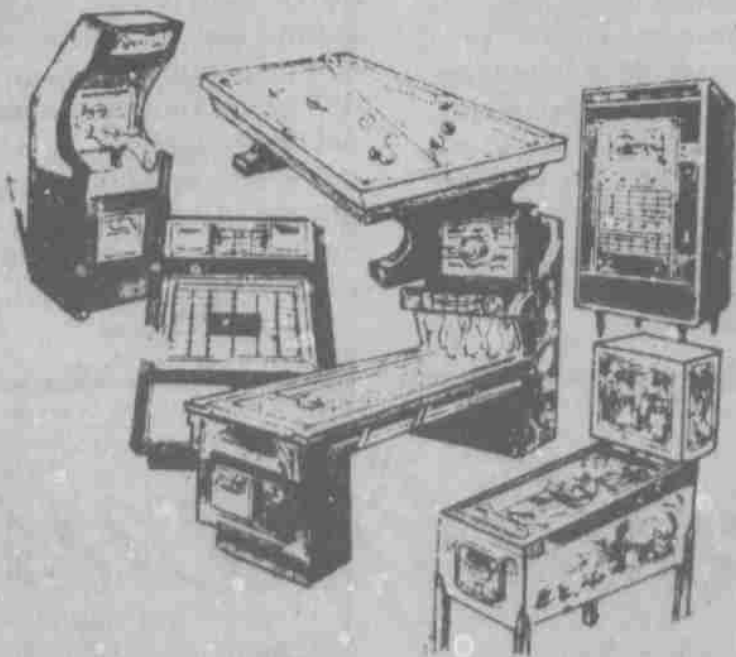

The time has come for the Black Community of Lubbock to open up. We need to open our eyes, mind, heart and soul. Our community has a self imposed segregated attitude that is hindering efforts towards obtaining the "why don't we have" things. Unless we are family, there is little socializing, fraternizing or cooperation among the difference classes of Blacks. We as Blacks simple do not have the numbers to segregate ourselves and still mount successful ventures. Our tendency is to look for support from only our select group.

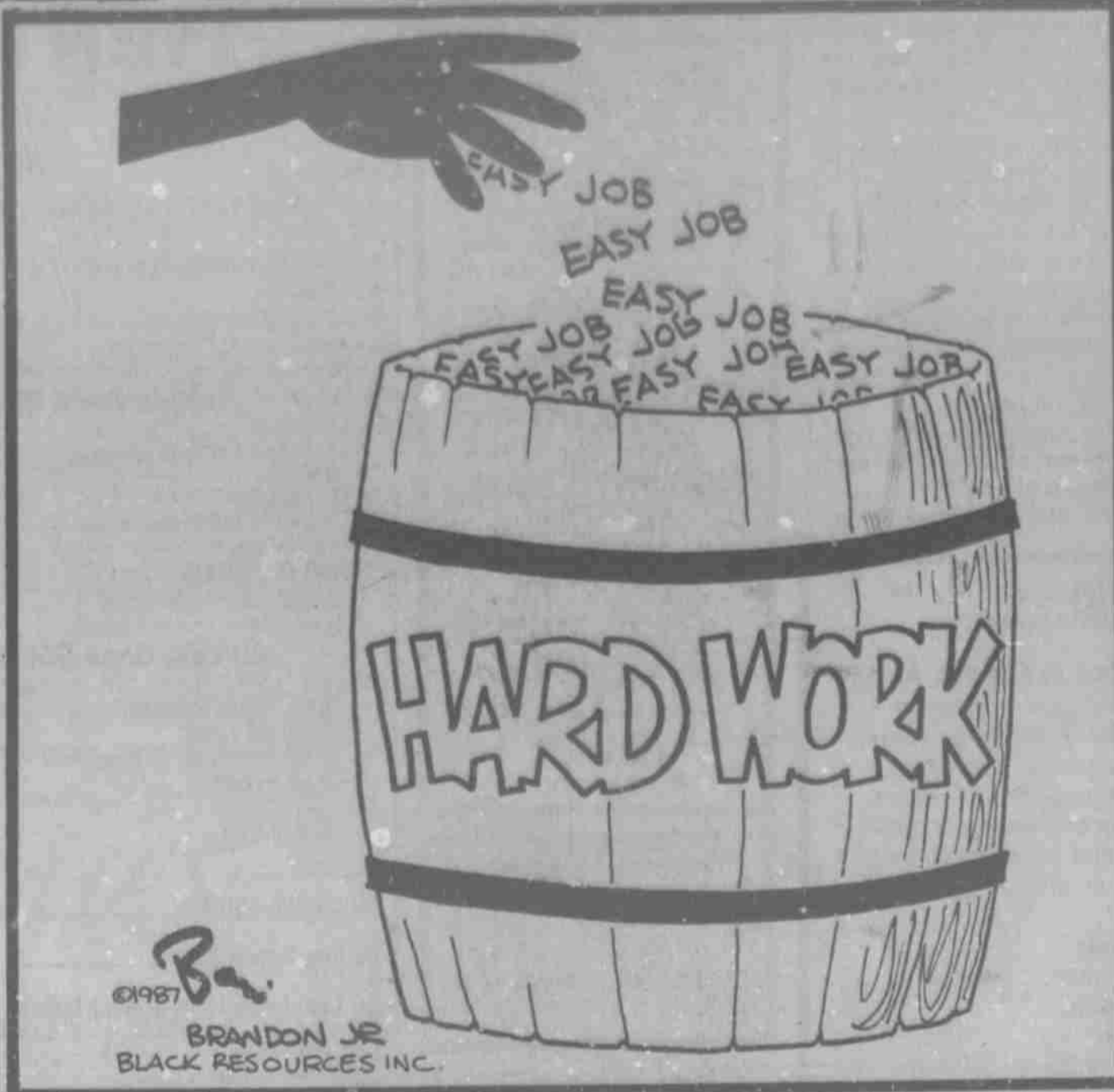
For the majority, people that dress up for work do not socialize with the blue jeans and T shirt workers. The T shirt workers share little time with those that are on welfare and the street people. Those in between ramble between groups but are not accepted well by either group. When events are scheduled, if not applicable to a certain group, not even a moments consideration is given to attending, least supporting with a contribution. With this type attitude, how can we fulfill our desires for those "why don't we have" things.

Except for bingo, what entertainment event has amassed a crowd of Blacks? Dinners, dances, concerts and the likes have serious problems due to the segregated attitudes. Money is a key, however, bingo and the liquor stores are not hurting for the Black dollar. Events such as the Annual NAACP and Juneteenth suffer in attendance simply because the T shirt, welfare and street crowd will not participate. Dances and concerts have double troubles in that the dress up crowd does not desire to fraternize and the other groups are further turned off by their musical choice. How long can sponsors of these event last? Crystals, a really nice club had to turn to the Hispanics for support to keep their doors open. The recently opened Off Broadway is trying to cater to Blacks, but still depends on the Hispanic business to keep their doors open. The only true Black clubs are the illegal establishments. With all our pride, hard work, our efforts to show we are progressing, that the Blacks have arrived, we do not have one legal club, that's a shame.

This is not knocking the illegal clubs nor promoting alcohol, it merely states a fact. Where do you take out of town friends, relatives, business associates for dinner, drinks and dancing? A city our size surely should have one club where Blacks get together. Those that feel comfortable in the illegal clubs have no problems, as they have an abundance to choose from. And that is another point, if Blacks can support the illegal clubs, with their small number of supporters, why can't the majority support a legal club? Surely the Blacks that frequent the illegal clubs are no wiser than the rest of us.

This same attitude applies to any Black business, the majority simply will not support it on a regular basis. If you would look at the businesses in the same light as your home, maybe you will get a better prospective of how it operates. Within your home, you have rent, utilities, food and personal expenses which you work for the money to pay for, so does the businessman. Whoever you work for, YOU provide a service to that employer in return for your salary, well, so does the businessman. Just like you, the businessman can't survive on less money for the same work, therefore why expect them to be giving free merchandise or extras.

If we would open up, our list of "why don't we have" would start a steady decline. We must open up to the fact other will not do everything for us. We must open up to



the fact it takes money, our money to maintain our community with the things we want, need and desire. We must open up to one another as it will take all of us working together to make our "why don't we have" list decline. It can be done if we can acquire an attitude that the only real difference between the classes of Blacks is their income.

We need to change our priorities, something is gravely wrong for us to be the viable community. We should and must be able to compete. We need to learn to love, trust, respect, trade with, utilize, invest in and with each other or we will continue to race down hill

Jackson Decides On V. P. Slot, But Won't Tell

Washington, D. C.: Jesse Jackson told reporters in Washington last week that he has decided whether or not he will accept the vice presidential slot on the Democratic party ticket, if it is offered to him by Massachusetts Governor Michael Dukakis. However, with typical Jackson coyness, he refused to reveal his decision. That move puts added pressure on Dukakis. Meanwhile, in Boston, Dukakis told reporters that Jackson was under "very serious consideration" as his vice presidential running mate despite polls showing that some whites would not vote Democratic if Jackson were on the ticket. Earlier, Jackson and Dukakis met while both were in Los Angeles.

They acknowledged that the v. p. slot was discussed but would only say the meeting was "friendly". Back in Washington, Jackson indicated that he strongly felt if the v. p. position was not offered to him then it should be offered to another Black or a woman.

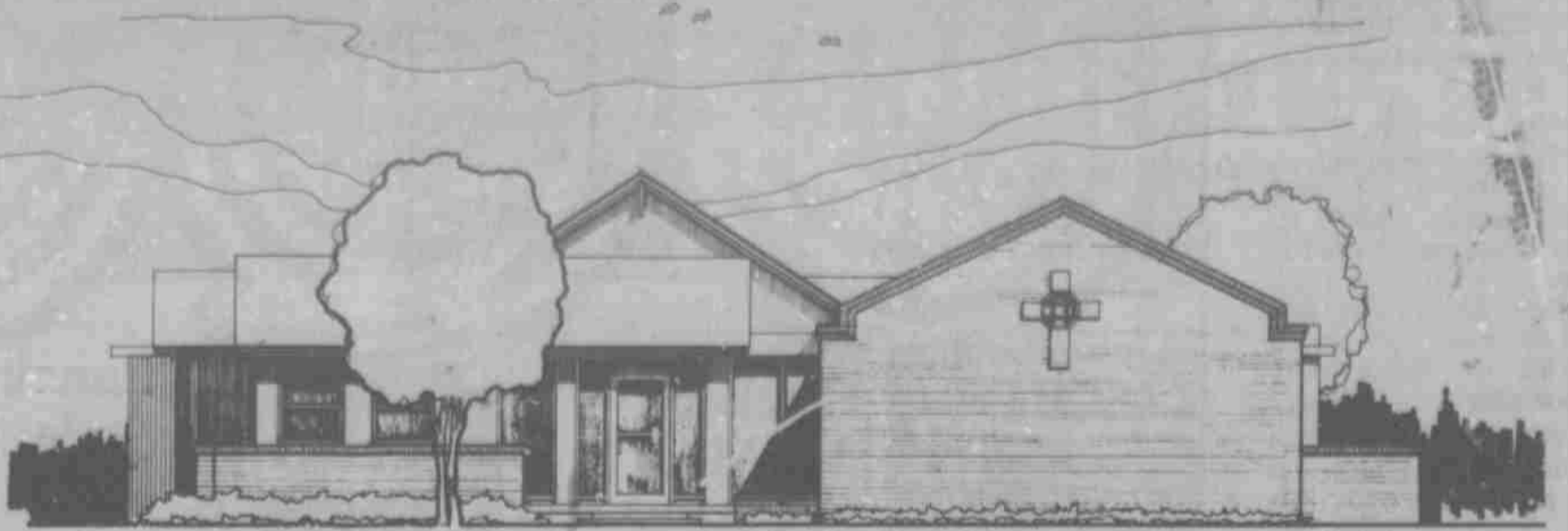

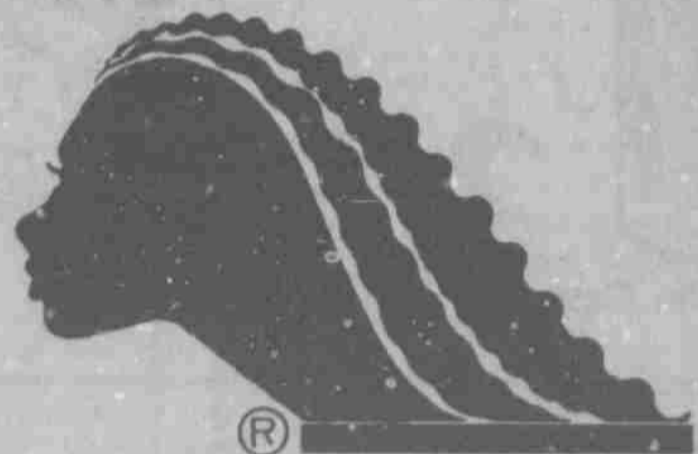

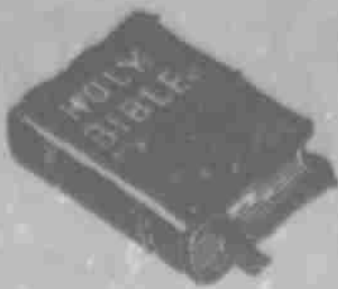

We believe that as Jesus Christ which was taken into heaven shall so come in like manner as we seen to go into heaven—bodily, personally and visibly; and that the "dead in Christ shall rise first"; and that the living saints "shall all be changed in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump" and we will go to heaven to ever be with the Lord.

HE IS SOON COMING BODILY FOR HIS SAINTS.

1. This is promised by the Holy Spirit through 3 witnesses. First, we have the witness of Christ Himself. He says in John 14:3 "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also." Secondly, we have the witness of the angels in Acts 1:11 "Which also said, Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? this same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven." Thirdly, we have the witness of the apostle Paul who says in 1 Thessalonians 4:16 "For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven".
2. His coming will be suddenly. Jesus says in Matthew 24:27 "For as the lightning cometh out of the east, and shineth even unto the west; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be."
3. The day and hour of His coming is not known. Matthew 25:13 says "Watch therefore, for ye know neither the day nor the hour wherein the Son of man cometh." Jesus says in Matthew 24:36 and 42 "But of that day and hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels of heaven, but my Father only. Watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come."
4. We should be looking for His coming soon. James 5:8 says "Be ye also patient; stablish your hearts: for the coming of the Lord draweth nigh." Hebrews 9:28 says "So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for him shall he appear a second time without sin unto salvation."
5. The saved are to prepare for His coming by purifying ourselves. 1 John 3:2-3 says "Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is. And every man that hath this hope in him purifieth himself, even as he is pure." We prepare for His coming by completing the work He has given to each of us. It says in Mark 13:32-37 "But of that day and that hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels which are in heaven, neither the Son, but the father. Take ye heed, watch and pray: for ye know not when the time is. For the Son of man is as a man taking a far journey, who left his house, and gave authority to his servants, and to every man his work, and commanded the porter to watch. Watch ye therefore: for ye know not when the master of the house cometh, at even, or at midnight, or at the cockcrowing, or in the morning: Lest coming suddenly he find you sleeping. And what I say unto you I say unto all, Watch." Matthew 24:42-51 also says "Watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come. But know this, that if the goodman of the house had known in what watch the thief would come, he would have watched, and would not have suffered his house to be broken up. Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh. Who then is a faithful and wise servant, whom his lord hath made ruler over his household, to give them meat in due season? Blessed is that servant, whom his lord when he cometh shall find so doing. Verily I say unto you, That he shall make him ruler over all his goods. But and if that evil servant shall say in his heart, My lord delayeth his coming; And shall begin to smite his fellow-servants, and to eat and drink with the drunken; The lord of that servant shall come in a day when he looketh not for him, and in an hour that he is not aware of, And shall cut him asunder, and appoint him his portion with the hypocrites: there shall he weeping and gnashing of teeth." We can also prepare for His coming by reaching our loved ones and others, with the gospel, for it says in Matthew 24:36-42 "But of that day and hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels of heaven, but my Father only. But as the days of Noe were, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. For as in the days that were before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noe entered into the ark, and knew not until the flood came, and took them all away; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. Then shall two be in the field; the one shall be taken, and the other left. Two women shall be grinding at the mill; the one shall be taken, and the other left. Watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come."

THE ORDER OF EVENTS AT HIS COMING.

1. The dead IN CHRIST (saved dead) shall rise, and they will receive glorified bodies. It says in 1 Thessalonians 4:16 that "The dead in Christ shall rise first," and it says in 1 Corinthians 15:42-44 "So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown in corruption; it is raised in incorruption: it is sown in dishonour; it is raised in glory: it is sown in weakness; it is raised in power: it is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. There is a natural body, and there is a spiritual body." And verse 52 says "In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed."
2. The living Christians will be given glorified bodies, and shall go up to meet the Lord in the air. 1 Corinthians 15:51-53 says "Behold, I shew you a mystery; We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality." In 1 Thessalonians 4:17 says "Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air; and so shall we ever be with the Lord." In Philippians 3:20-21 it says "For our conversation is in heaven; from whence also we look for the Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ: who shall change our vile body, that it may be fashioned like unto his glorious body, according to the working whereby he is able even to subdue all things unto himself." And 1 John 3:2 says "Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is."
