Within the so-called "modern day America", where would you rate Lubbock? Is Lubbock a city with a good outlook for your future? Is Lubbock a contender for cities people would like to live? But more importantly, where and how would you rate cast Lubbook? What has east Lubbock got that makes you want to stay? What does east Lubbock offer or is planning that will be attractive to you in 10 or 20 years from now?

To you as an individual, it easi Lubhock a better place overall today than it was in 1978? What about 1968? If you would use a plus for all the good things and a minus for all the bad about east Lubbock for the past 10 and 20 years, what would your majority be, plus or minus?

With the year 2000 less than 12 years away, I would hope that the plus far exceed the minus. If cast Lubbock is 10 or 20 years behind time in 1988, the rapid progress being made and planned for the rest of our city will place. us even farther behind by the year 2000. If east Lubbock is in your plus standing, will we be able to maintain it in future years?

But in the long run, that goody turns into crippler of our ambitions and talents.

Just as a baby learns to walk and talk on it's own, so must we as adults. We must stop being like an infant. taking all that is given with a bubbling smile, coo and goo. and making like it's the best we can do. We must learn to weigh the plus side against the minus side and make informed intelligent decisions about our participation in social programs, political candidates, our community and other things affecting our daily life. If things are bad in 1988, by the year 2000, it will be like being in hell with gasoline clothing. Lubbock is our city, but like the old saying goes, "clean up your own house before trying to clean-up mind" applies to us. We must get east Lubbock taken care of first, before we can give 100% to the rest of

1987 Top 20 Black College Football Standings

T. P. Fowler

Final standings in the 1987 Black College National Football race compiled by the Post Rating System show that Central State University of Ohio retained the national crown it won in 1986. The magnificient Marauders nailed down a 10,1,1, record for the second year in succession to collect a Post index rating of 122.4, which is almost as good as its 1986 rating of 122.7.

The Post ratings were introduced in the January, 1947 issue of AMNEGRO MAGAZINE, which was published by the late B. C. (Bert) Muse, publisher, educator and businessman. The Post ratings appeared later in subsequent issues of AMNEGRO MAGAZINE. and in other Muse publications such as THE TYLER (TX) TRIBUNE, and its successor, THE DALLAS STAR POST.

Designed to minimize personal opinion and sectional bias, the Post rating scale utilizes a weighted, scientific mathematical formula to appraise individual team schedules and provide a comprehensive, qualitative evaluation of each team's performance with reference

Newcomers to the Top 20 are Alabama State, Alcorn State, Arkansas, Pine Bluff, Fayetteville State, Florida A & M. Hampton University and South Carolina State. The 1986 Top 20 teams which did not repeat are Fort Valley State, Grambling State, Mississippi Valley State, North Carolina A & T. Savannah State, Tennessee State and Bishop College, which dropped football after the 1986 grid season.

Central State's opponents compiled a composite total of 70 wins, two ties and 62 losses in 1987, and the Marauders recorded a 5,2,5 schedule rating, which translates into five games played with teams compiling winning records, two games with break even teamed, and five games with teams which had more losses than victories. Central State accounted for five quality wins over teams with winning and break even records enroute to the top run of the national grid totem pole.

Howard University (9,1). which ranked 7th in 1986, ranked 2nd with 120.0 points. The Bison had a 3,0,7 schedule rating and three quality wins. Winston Salem (9,3), which finished in a with Grambling State and Alabama A & M in 1986, had a 7,0,5 schedule rating and garnered six quality wind in placing 3rd with 109.5 points. Jackson State (8,3,1) retained the No. 4 spot won in 1986 by collecting a 6,0,6 schedule rating and four quality wins in scoring 104.7 points. Alabama State (8,3), unranked in 1986, had a 6.0,5 schedule rating and four quality wins to finish 5th with 103.6 coints.

Alabama A & M (8,3) edged Hampton University (9, 3) for 6th place by the slim margin of 102.8 to 102.7. Both teams collected two quality wins and their schedule ratings were 5,0,6 and 5,0,7, respectively. In the battle for 8th place, Virginia State (9,2) was able to accumulate a schedule rating of 4, 0, 7 and an index rating of 102.6 to nose out Tuskegee (8,2), which had a 4,0,6 schedule rating and an idex of 102.5. Virginia State

collected three quality wins to two for Tuskegee. In 1986, Tuskegee University and Virginia State ranked 12th and 17th, respectively. Tenth place Albany State (8,3), which ranked 6th in 1986, complied a 5,0,6 Con'i on Page 8



schedule rating and snared one quality win in achieving an index of 101.8.

Alcorn State (6,3), Virginia Union (7,3) and Delaware State (7,3) created a log jam for 11th place when each team finished with an index rating of 101.0. Rounding out the Top 20 were No. 14 Southern University (7,4) with a 99.1 rating; No. 15 Fayetteville State (6,2,2) 98.0; No. 16 Knoxville College (7,1) 97.7; Nol 17 South Carolina State (6.5) 97.5; No. 18 Florida A&M (5,5,1) 96.4; No. 19 North Carolina Central (6,5) 95.5; and No. 20 Arkansas, Pine Bluff (7,4) 93.6.

In 145 games played by the Top 20 teams with each other and with other perdominantely Black colleges, 93 percent were won by the higher rated team. The higher rated teams won 131 times and lost on only ten occasions; four games ended in a deadlock. Top 20 teams held a 1614 edge in games played with colleges that are not traditionally Black.
