 Looking back 200 years it is all too casy to see the Constiutional Convention in Philadelphia as one of calm reflection and wisdom as republic. The men who met there are justly honored for their repubic. The men who met there are justly honored for theiranchievement. But what they scomplished only come affer wets of angry. passicnate debate.
The most divisive argument among the delegates at the Constitutional Convention 200 years ngo was the question of proportional representation in congresss. Delegates from the large states, led by James Madison of Virginia, were deternined that population should dictate how many members cach state could elect to the new con-
gress. The small states were just as determined tiare each state gresss. The small states were just as determined that each state
should nave an equal voice in congress. Both sides feared should nave
domination.
domination.
Large states, such as Virginia and Pennsylvania, were supported by the Southern delicgates. Although South Carolina and Ccorgia had small populations, they expected
moved into their vast westem territories.
Thie argument nearly ended the effor at a national constiution. The large sates threatened to form their own, separate union. A del-
egate from a small state countered with an ominous statement: "Sooner than be ruined, there are foreign powero who will take us by Hite hand.
