## Graduates From Trucking School

A Lubbock woman wanted to prove it could be done and she did it. That is, she graduated from the Concho Career Institute Professional Truck Driving school on September 18, 1987. She became the first Black woman to graduate from the school.

One hundred-eighty classroom hours were necessary in order to become familiar with the history of truck driving, mechanical systems, including the various engines, transmissions, electrical systems, braking systems, common to the road rigs. Benson also studied the Department of Transportation (DOT) Motor Carrier Safety Regulations. This included: logbook and map reading producers. This course included basic CPR training, PTDDC course which is sanctioned by the National Safety Council. One hundred-fifty hours were devoted to driving and

observation which included daily pre-trip inspections, coupling and uncoupling, upshifting, downshifting, right and left turns, urban, and rural as well as freeway driving. "I gained experience through practice in performing yard and docking procedure. I also got a certificate for outstanding achievement. I am now DOT certificate and can drive any kind of 18 wheeler. I now have my commercial licenses."

Benson is the mother of two children, Latasha and Bronsha Benson, both of Lubbock, Texas. She is the daughter of Ruby and August Benson, and step-father W. T. Phenix. Her grandparents are Mr. and Mrs. Arthur L. Tucker and grandmother, Mrs. Ocie Cooke, all of Lubbock, Texas. She resides at 2203 Birch Avenue.

## Fire Prevention Week In Lubbock

Few people think much about it until a fire sweeps through a home of a friend, relative or even their own house. Only then after witnessing the devastation, disruption and often, death, does anyone consider what could have been done to prevent it.

Next week, Oct. 4-10, the Lubbock Fire Department will join with other fire departments around the country and the National Fire Protection Association in promoting "Fire Prevention Week."

Fire Prevention Week is somewhat of a misnomer because as fire officials point out, fire prevention is a year-round job for everyone.

"Almost 80 per cent of the people killed in fires die in their own home or apartment," Lubbock Fire Marshal Jack Carlile pointed out. Most fires happen at night, when people are asleep. With a small amount of money and a few precautions, you can usually survive a fire," Carlile said.

The small amount of money would be for smoke detectors, Carlile said. Smoke detectors are now available for less than \$10 each and can prove invaluable in providing early warning and giving people time to escape, he said.

The panic, fear and sorrow of the death of a loved one killed by a fire affected more than 6,100 families in the United States in 1985. In Lubbock last year, 3 people died as the result of fires and 28 people were injured. So far this year, no fire deaths have been recorded in Lubbock, but 12 people have been injured. The number can be deceiving and create a false

sense of security, Carlile remarked.

"When we have a low fire death rate that is fortunate. Maybe people are becoming wiser and fire prevention is working. But we also know that it can only take a few minutes for a fire to spread through a home or building and kill people. We have to keep the people aware of fire safety every chance we get.

"And with the colder weather coming up heaters and fireplaces can be very dangerous. We just want people to practice common sense and not be the victim of a fire," Carlile added.

The Fire Marshal went on to say that beyond the deaths and injuries, the financial burden of a fire can be enormous. In 1986 in Lubbock, fires caused more than \$1,648,000 in insured fire losses. Thus far this year, fire damage has totalled \$1,012,000 and the winter months are still ahead. Nationally, in 1985 the two and a half million fires reported totalled more than \$7.3 BILLION in fire losses.

"This year we are giving added emphasis to developing a fire escape plan for the home. If you have a smoke detector and it goes off what do you do next? We encourage people to develop their home escape plan and take a few minutes to practice it each week. That small amount of time can pay off big if you find yourself in the middle of a fire at your home," Carlile said.

## Fishing Rodeo Set For Lake Six Saturday

The first Lubbock Coca-Cola Fishing Rodeo will be held Saturday, October 3rd, from 9 a. m. to 11 a. m. The Fishing Rodeo, a part of the Lubbock Fishery Improvement Program, will be held at three separate lakes: Maxey Park (30th and Oxford), Buddy Holly Area (North Loop 289 and Canyon Lake Drive -- Lakes 1 and 2), and Canyon Lake 6 (east of Quirt Avenue on Canyon Lake Drive). At each rodeo site, first, second and third place awards will be given for youths 12 and under, and 13 and older (a total of 6 awards at each rodeo site). Awards will be based on the total length of all fish caught by each participant. Contestants will be required to register before fishing and an award ceremony and prize-drawing will begin at 11:00 a. m. There will be no charge to participate in the rodeo. All people are invited to participate.

Registration will begin at 8:00 a. m. There will be registration headquarters at each: Maxey Park -- 30th and Oxford; Buddy Holly Area -- Canyon Lake 1 boat

ramp; Canyon Lake 6 -- boat ramp.

The Fishery Improvement Program is coordinated by the cooperative efforts of the Department of Range and Wildlife Management at Texas Tech University, the Lubbock Parks and Recreation Department, and the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

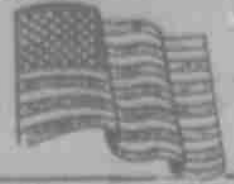

### Namibia Information Briefs

#### SWAPO Leaders Hospitalized

(NIS) -- Two of the six SWAPO leaders arrested during South Africa's crackdown late last month have required emergency treatment at the Windhoek State Hospital, according to news service reports from Namibia.

National Chairman Daniel Tjongarero, the highest ranking SWAPO official in Namibia, underwent surgery last week and is in satisfactory condition after suffering from a kidney disorder. Tjongarero's family physician was initially denied access to him.

SWAPO Advocate Anton Lubowski, a leader of the National Union of Namibia Workers, was also removed from prison detention to undergo hospital treatment for a kidney ailment.

At press time, attorneys for the six had filed an urgent appeal for their release. They were the targets of a country-wide sweep that drew international condemnation.

#### UK Dockworkers Boycott South Africa Uranium

(NIS) -- Liverpool dockworkers, continuing a boycott of South African uranium, recently cited the arrival of five containers of uranium hexafluoride from the U. S. which were destined for the British Nuclear Fuels Ltd. (BNFL) Capenhurst Plant.

While the plant management claimed that the uranium was from Canada, the dockworkers insisted that the highly enriched level was characteristic of Namibian or South Africa.

The uranium was aboard the U. S. "Atlantic Compass." The Reagan Administration has been accused of importing uranium in violation of the 1986 sanctions law, according to members of Congress who are pushing for a stronger embargo against South Africa.

Some 1500 Liverpool dockworkers last month refused to handle 80 tons of uranium from Namibia and South Africa. They say over two thirds of uranium processed by BNFL comes from South Africa or South Africa - occupied Namibia, site of the world's largest open uranium pit.

#### Namibia Church Leaders Charge Slander

(NIS) -- The Council of Churches of Namibia, accusing South African Administrator-General Louis Pienaar of waging a "smear campaign", has adamantly dismissed the allegation that the CCN should take responsibility for a recent bombing in the capital city, Windhoek.

Pienaar publicly suggested the possibility of criminal charges being filed against church leaders, although no evidence has been produced to uphold his claim.

No one was injured in the July bomb blast which occurred in a parking garage adjacent to the South African military command. The Peoples Liberation Army of Namibia (PLAN), SWAPO's fighting wing, claimed responsibility for the explosion.

#### Bishop Tutu Visits Namibia

(NIS) -- Anglican Archbishop Desmond Tutu was scheduled to visit Namibia this month, according to a spokesman from the Diocese. He said Tutu would travel throughout the country, although specific details about his visit were not available.

#### Chemical Warfare In Angola

(NIS) -- The Cuene province in Angola has been hit by chemical weapons of South Africa's invading forces, according to reports filed by the BBC.

Provincial Commisar Pedro Muinde reportedly urged civilians of that southern province to join the army and the people's defense brigades to guard against what he termed South Africa's attempts to "annex Cuene ... to establish a buffer zone."

Cuene sits near the border with Namibia, the frequent launching ground for South Africa's raids into Angola.

#### Cuban Troops Withdrawal Not UN Concern

(NIS) -- United Nations Special Envoy Maarti Ahtisaari, recently back from a mission to South Africa, said the South African government remains entrenched in the position of linking Namibian independence with the withdrawal of Cuban troops from Angola.

Ahtisaari told the Star that the issue must be resolved by South Africa and Angola. He stressed that the Cuban troops are not an issue officially recognized by the UN.

South African officials maintained that they are interested in implementing Security Council Resolution 435, considered the blueprint for Namibian independence. But despite that claim, the UN envoy left Johannesburg with no end to South Africa's 21-year illegal occupation in sight.

The Monday Morning Quarterbacks in our case in east Lubbock, the "Weekend Quarterbacks" concern is amuck about the Dunbar Panther football team. Even those loyal to Estacado must share a similar concern as their roots come from Dunbar. Even our females who are not that familiar with the finer points of football are expressing serious dismay at the Panther performance on the football field.

One game, the thrashing by Estacado is not the single issue, although it carries a year long embarrassment: The Panthers over the past few years have had much better talent and material than their record indicates. Their size, speed and abilities are equal to the other teams they compete against, yet they appear mismatched in football fundamentals and execution. To this fan who has watched most of their games, the wrong formation for the skills and abilities of the players, very poor play selection and players remaining first string that clearly show poor production in the games are the factors for our poor record.

Dunbar and Estacado football teams are from the same city, east Lubbock. They have the same ethnic, social, economical and religious backgrounds, and in several cases, have the same blood lines. They buy food from the same places, breath the same air and are similar in many respects, yet Estacado is an annual contender. Agreed, Coach Louis Kelly is unequal among local high school coaches and this may even be statewide. Coach Kelly clearly explains why the Matadors "whip up" on the Panthers each year. But other teams do likewise and that where the confusion or frustration come in. Why can't the Panthers who have similar everything to the Matadors play somewhere close in the win column. Could Coach Kelly take the Panthers to a respectable season? I feel very confident he could. Could Coach Jerry Lee take the Matadors to a respectable season? I feel confident he could NOT.

The problem with the Panthers is at the top, the coach. As head coach, he is responsible for his staff, therefore blaming the staff is not justified. Coach Lee has been at Dunbar long enough to have built a respectable team. Injuries are a part to team. Injuries are a part of the game and replacements are suppose to be ready and able to perform satisfactorily, a COACH insures this. Again, if the Panthers had been performing up to expectations prior to the injuries of three two-way starters, than a MAYBE could be used but sorry coach, your Panthers were not playing good ball before the injuries. If Gamble is out for the season, you might consider forfeiting the remaining games.

Coaching is vital in the sports field. The coach, the staff and player must be in accord to produce a winner. Isn't it strange that

### "The 'Greatness' Trap"

Several weeks ago, I was talking with a friend of mine. In the course of the conversation he boasted of his position and the power that he had over other lives. His chest bulged as he talked about his titles, position and the inroads he had with those in position of power. He painted his life with praise and huzza. After he finished, I quoted Matthew 23:12 ("For whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted.") and said to him you have fallen into the "greatness" trap.

The Pharisees fell into this trap called "greatness" with all of its jagged edges. Jesus used them as examples to remind his disciples that true greatness comes from godliness within. It concentrates on service to others, rather than acts requiring audible praise.

### TITHING—THE GRACE OF GIVING

#### I. GOD'S PLAN FOR GIVING.

##### A. God's Plan Before The Law.

1. Abraham tithed. Gen. 14:18-20; Heb. 7:1-10
2. Jacob vowed to tithe. Gen. 28:22
3. Abraham was very likely not the first tither.
4. Abraham's tithing was over 400 years before the Law. Gal. 3:16,17

##### B. God's Plan Under The Law.

1. The tithe is the Lord's. Lev. 27:30
2. The tithe is holy unto the Lord. Lev. 27:30
3. The tithe must be given honestly. Lev. 27:31-33
4. The tithe is commanded by God. Lev. 27:34
5. The tithe commanded in the last O.T. book. Mal. 3:10

##### C. God's Plan Under Grace.

1. Jesus endorsed the tithe. Matt. 23:23
2. Jesus doubtless tithed. If He had not done so, the Pharisees would have no doubt criticized Him for not doing so.
3. The New Testament nowhere disannuls the tithe.
4. The tithe is proportional giving. Proportional giving is taught in I Cor. 16:2 and II Cor. 8:12-14.

#### II. GOD'S PLACE FOR GIVING.

##### A. Under The Law God Chose The Place —The Storehouse.

1. Tithes, offerings and sacrifices to be brought to the place of God's choice. Deut. 12:5,6,8,13
2. This pattern continued through the O.T. Mal. 3:10. The storehouse was the Tabernacle and then later on it was the Temple. This was God's choice.

##### B. Under Grace God Chose The Place —The Church.

1. In the N.T. the offerings were brought to the Church. Acts 4:34,37
2. The Church is the storehouse. I Cor. 16:2. Compare I Cor. 1:2 and note that he was writing to the Church.
3. This order was given to Churches. I Cor. 16:1
4. Paul's appeals for offerings were addressed to Churches and not to individuals. II Cor. 8:1-7; 9:1-7. Compare with II Cor. 1:1. Individuals would give, but it was through their Church that they gave.
5. Paul commends the Philippian Church for their giving to missions. Phil. 4:10-17
6. Every Christian should be a member of a Scriptural N.T. Church and do their giving through it.  
a. No Christian should give to an unscriptural church, but through a Scriptural Church.

b. Many false causes and man made religious parasites would be eliminated if this plan was practiced.

#### III. GOD'S PROMISE FOR GIVING ACCORDING TO HIS PLAN.

##### A. God Will Bless Obedience.

1. Bountiful sowers will be bountiful reapers. II Cor. 9:6,7
2. He will pour out blessings and protect property. Mal. 3:10,11
3. Prosperity as God blesses. Prov. 3:9,10; 11:25
4. God's good measure given. Luke 6:38
5. Treasure in heaven. Matt. 6:19-21

##### B. God Will Chasten For Disobedience.

1. There will be less to reap. II Cor. 9:6. If you sow sparingly, you will reap sparingly.
2. It will tend to poverty. Pro. 11:24
3. It will hinder service to God. I Tim. 6:9,10
4. It will bring a curse. Mal. 3:9

Scriptural giving is one of the fundamentals of the Faith. II Cor. 8:7. "Therefore, as ye abound in everything, in faith, and utterance, and knowledge, and in all diligence, and in your love to us, see that ye abound in this grace also."

We are commanded to bring our gifts into the storehouse (common treasury of the church) upon the first day of the week.

I Cor. 16:2. "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as G. hath prospered him, that there be no gatherings when I come."

Under grace we give, and do not pay, the tithe—"Abraham GAVE a tenth part of all"—"Abraham GAVE the tenth of the spoils"—Heb. 7:2,4—and this was four hundred years before the law, and is confirmed in the New Testament; Jesus said concerning the tithe, "These ye ought to have done" Matt. 23:23.

We are commanded to bring the tithe into the common treasury of the church.

Lev. 27:30. "The tithe is the Lord's."

Mal. 3:10. "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it."

In the New Testament it was the common treasury of the church.

Acts 4:34,35,37. "And brought the prices of the things that were sold, and laid them down at the apostles' feet... Having land, sold it, and brought the money, and laid it at the apostles' feet."

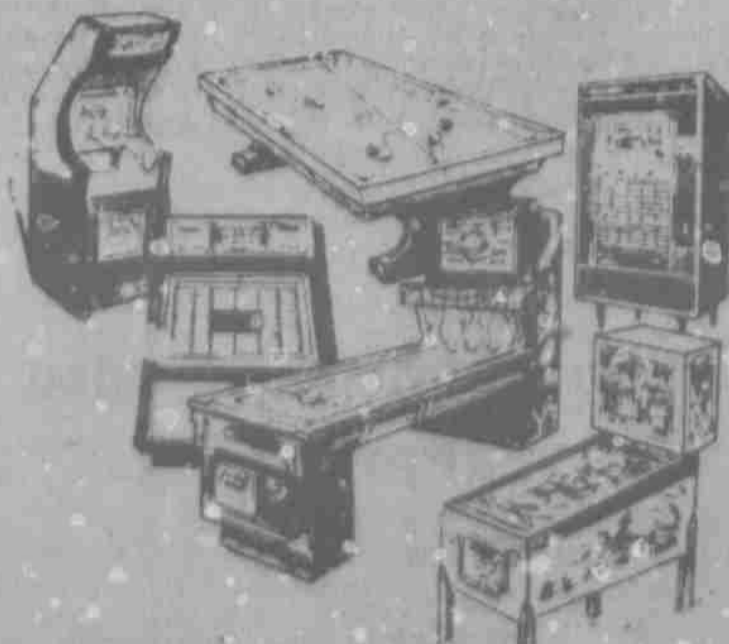
