Agreed, this may not be high salary jobs, but they are jobs that can put food on the table, pay the rent and supplemen other

We as ninorities must stop following those that have, can have and will have more so long as they keep us down. Remember the Water Theme Park, where is it, what his it done for us? Just think what east Lubbock would be now had the Water Park been built? Don't let a repeat of the Water Park occur with horse racing.



Dismal Legacy on Civil Rights

Ronald Reagan appears determined to co down in history as a President who sought actively to set Lack the cause of civil rights. How else can one read lils veto of the four year, bipartisan effort to restore the reach of antidiscrimination laws narrawed by a Sourceme Court ruling? Congress appears to have the votes to override the vete. Decency argues for doing so, without delay.

Several Foueral civil rights laws operated on the principle that when Federal money flows to one department of a school or hospital, the entire institution should be forbidden to discriminate on the basis of race, sex, age or handicap.

But in 1934, in a case involving Grove City College, the Supreme Court accepted an argument acvanced by the Reagan Administration to narrow the principle. A 6-tn-3 majority ruled that if a school received a Federal subsidy for student aid, only the financial aid office would be bound by the principle. The school still might discriminate in the athletic. department, for example, without losing Federal

With the restoration bill, Congress restated its intent that the civil rights laws apply according to the broad understanding that prevailed before the Grove City decision. The votes to approve it demonstrated a powerful bipartisan consensus: 75 to 14 in the senate and 315 to 98 in the House.

The lawmakers rejected the Administration's orguments that the proposed legislation would overregulate society. Similarly, mey now should turn aside the alternate legislation k.r. Reagan offers to show his commitment to civil rights. This counterproposal is a hodgepodge of amendments already rejected by Congress her use they would weaken, not strengthen, civil rights enforcement.

If the performance on Grove City was dismaying, it was not surprising. The Administration has consistently pursued a disruptive policy on civil rights, from its attempt to give tax exemptions to racially discriminatory Bob Jones University to its efforts to weaken the U.S. Commission on Civil

President Reagan's veto of the civil rights restoration bill enlarges this unhappy record and saddies Republican candidates in the 1968 campaign with the burden of having to explain this latest, stubborn insistence on lighting a lost, and ugly, cause. The mystery is why Mr. Reagan wants to leave for himself so dismal a legacy.



Every year it seems that some so-so team will get hot during the spring games and prompt articles on how they may be the surprise team of the year. Spring training won-lost records are very misleading especially when it comes to good veteran ballelubs. They know what they have to do to get ready. "THE RESURRECTION OF JESUS CHRIST"

We believe in and accept the samed and Holy Scriptures upon this subject at their face value. We believe that Christ rose bodily "the third day according to the Scriptures."

THE LYILENCE OF HIS RESURRECTION.

1. The testimony of the angel. Matthew 28:6-7 says "He is not were: for he is risen as he said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay. And go quickly, and tell His disciples that he is risen from the dead; and, behold, he goeth before you into Galilee; and there shall ye see him."

2. The testimony of Jesus to the apostles. He told them in Luke 24:39 "Behold my hands and my feet, that it is i myself: handle me, and see; for a spirit hath not flesh and bones as ye see me have."

3. His invitation to Thomas in John 20:27 "Then saith he to Thomas, Reach hither thy finger, and behold my hands; and reach hither thy hand, and thrust it into my side: and be not faithless but believing."

4. The declaration of the Holy Scriptures in 1 Corinthians 15:4 "And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures." Mark 16:6 says "Ye seek Jesus of Nazarath, which was crucified; he is risen; he is not here: behold the place where they fald him."

5. The empty tomb. Luke 24:1-7 "Now upon the first day of the week, very early In the morning, they came into the sepulchre, bringing the spices which they had prepared, and certain others with them. And they found the stone rolled away from the sepulcher. And they entered in, and found not the body of the Lord Jesus. And it came to pass, as they were much perplexed thereabout, behold, two men stood by them in shining garments: And as they were atraid, and bowed down their faces to the earth, they said unto them, Why seek ye the living among the dead? He is not here, but is risen; remember how he spake unto you when he was yet in Galliee. Saying, The Son of man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the ghird day rise again."

6. The change wrought in the apostles.
a. After His death they were disheartened and afraid. John 20:19 says "Then the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled for fear of the Jews, came Jesus and stood in the midst, and saith unto them, Peace be unto you." Luke 24:37 says "But they were terrified

and affrighted, and supposed that they had seen a spirit."

b. After He revealed Himself to them in His resurrected body, they were very bold in preaching and witnessing about the resurrection. They would die rather than give up

this precious doctrine.

(1) Hear what Peter had to say on the day of Pentecost In Acts 2:22-36 "Ye men of Israel, hear these words; Jesus of Nazareth, a man approved of God among you by miracles and wonders and signs, which God did by him in the midst of you, as ye //yourselves also know: Him, being delivered by the determinate counsel and foreknowledge of God, ye have taken, and by wicked hands have craiffed and stain: Whom God hath raised up, having loosed the pains of death: because it was not possible that he should be nolden of it. For David speaketh concerning him, I foresaw the Lord always before my face, for he is on my right hand, that I should not be moved: Therefore did my heart rejoice, and my tongue was glad; moreover also my flesh shall rest in hope: Because thou wiit not leave my soul in hell, neither wilt thou suffer thine Holy One to see corruption. Thou hast made known to me the ways of life; thou shalt make me full of joy with thy countenance. Men and brethren, let me freely speak unto you of the patriarch David, that he is both dead and buried, and his sepulchre is with us unto this day. Therefore being a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him, that the fruit of his loins, according to the flesh, he would raise up Christ to sit on his throne; He seeing this before spake of the resurrection of Christ, that his soul was not left in hell, neither his flesh did see corruption. This Jesus hath God raised up, whereof we all are witnesses. Therefore being by the right hand of God exalted, and having received of the Father the promise of the Holy Ghost, he hath shed forth this, which ye now see and hear. For David is not ascended into the heavens: but he saith himself, The Lord said unto my Lord, sit thou on my right hand. Until I make thy toes thy footstool. Therefore let all the house of Israel know assuredly, that God hath made that same Jesus, whom ye have crucified, both Lord and Christ."

(2) Hear Peter again in Acts 3:14-15 "But ye den'ed the Holy One and the Just, and desired a murderer to be granted unto you; And killed the Prince of life, whom God

hath raised from the dead; whereof we are witnesses."

(3) Note him before the Sanhedrin ard others in Acts 4:10 "Be it known into you all, and to all the people of israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom ye crucified, whom God raised from the dead, even by him doth this man stand here before you whole." Acts (:33 says "And with great power gave the apostles witness of the resurrection of the Lord Jesus: and great grace was upon them all." Also in Acts 5:29-32 it says "Then Peter and the other spostles answered and said. We ought to obey God rather than men. The God of our fathers raised up Jesus, whom ye slew and hanged on a tree. Him hath God exaited with his right hand to be a Prince and a Saviour, for to give repentance to israel, and forgiveness of sins. And we are his witnesses of these things; and so is also the Holy Ghost, whom God hath given to them that obey him."

7. Stephen saw Jesus standing at the right hand of Cod in Acts 7:54-56 which reads "When they heard these things, they were cut to the heart, and they gnashed on him with their teeth. But he, being full of the Holy Ghost, looked up steadfast!" Into heaven, and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing on the right hand of God, And said, Jehold, I see the heavens opened, and the Son of man standing on the right hand of God."




