Health Editorial: Physiology and **Different Parts** Of The Teeth

The teeth and their function are often taken for granted. The teeth cut, grind, and mix the food eaten. To perform these functions, the jaws have powerful muscles capable of providing a chewing force between the front teeth of as much as 30 to 100 pounds and as much as 150 to 200 pounds for the back or jaw teeth. The upper teeth are provided with projections. and facets or grooves which the teeth to allow interdigitate so that the teeth fit together like years. 

remaining teeth to shift thereby throwing the bite or occulsion off and causing pain or soreness of the jaw muscles and joints.

The major functional parts of a tooth are the enamel, dentine, cementum, and pulp. The tooth can also be divided into the crown, which is the portion that protrudes out of the gums into the mouth, and the root, which protrudes into the bony socket of the jaw.

pic he enamel is the surface of the tooth which makes up the portion of the tooth which can be seen in the mouth. Enamel is compared of large and very dense crystals ci mmerals embedded in a fine meshwork of very strong and insoluble protein fibers. The main body of the tooth is composed of the dentin. It is less harder than enamel. The dentin is made up of minerals similar to bone but more dense. It contains calcium salts which makes it restitant to compressional forces, while fibers containing collagen make it tough and resistant to damaging forces.

The portion of the tooth which is known as the root is covered by cemectum. Cementum is a bony substance which is secreted by a membrane called the periodontal membrane When the loeth are exposed to strain, the layer of cementum becomes thicker allowing the teeth to seat more firmly in the jaws.

The inside of the tooth is called the pulp it consists of the nerve and blood w vels of the teeth. Many patients who complain of looth ache, say 'I think the cavity is in the nerve," and reader saying the cavity involves the pulp. V hen people have root canals, it is this particin






