## This Year's Juneteenth Is Big On Heritage

This year's Juneteenth celebration will focus on the needs of the Lubbock Black community, said committee president, the Rev. Anthony L. Sims, pastor of Carter Chapel C. M. E. Church.

The annual event is the traditional observance of when Negro slaves received notification that they were set free by the Emancipation Proclamation.

Even though the decree was signed by Abraham Lincoln in 1863, slaves did not know they were free until June 19, 1865.

"We feel it's something (Juneteenth) that all citizens, especially Black citizens in Lubbock, should be a part of," Sims said.

The Juneteenth theme, "Freedom Arises From Unity," reflects the committee's hope for the local Black community.

"It will cause us to have or to experience a desire to be more unified to work together more than we have in the past. We don't have as much unity in our community as we probably should," he said.

Sims hopes his organization can be the catalyst that will bring more people together to get more things done within the Black community.

The official observance is scheduled to begin Thursday, June 15th, with a program by the Lubbock Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., where several local residents will be honored. The honorees had not been announced at present time.

The Juneteenth activities for Saturday include: the annual parade, which will begin at 10 a.m. Saturday from the Civic Center parking lot to Mae Simmons Park, with an opening

ceremony at 12 noon with Lubbock Mayor B.G. "Peck" McMinn and the annual scholarship banquet at the Civic Center where Dr. Jimmy Snell, former mayor pro tempore of Austin, will be the keynote speaker.

Sunday, June 19th activities include: gospel music at 12 noon at Mae Simmons Park with a mass choir service at 2 p. m.

The celebration will end with at 7 p. m. inspirational

lecture on Black history in Lubbock, past, present, and future featuring Texas Tech's Dr. Julius Amin at Dunbar High School.

A reception will be held Friday at Mae Simmons Park for Dr. Jimmy Snell and the parade marshal, a 105 year old Levelland woman who has been in the area for all those years.

A tent will be set up with recreational and entertainment activities where free food will be offered.

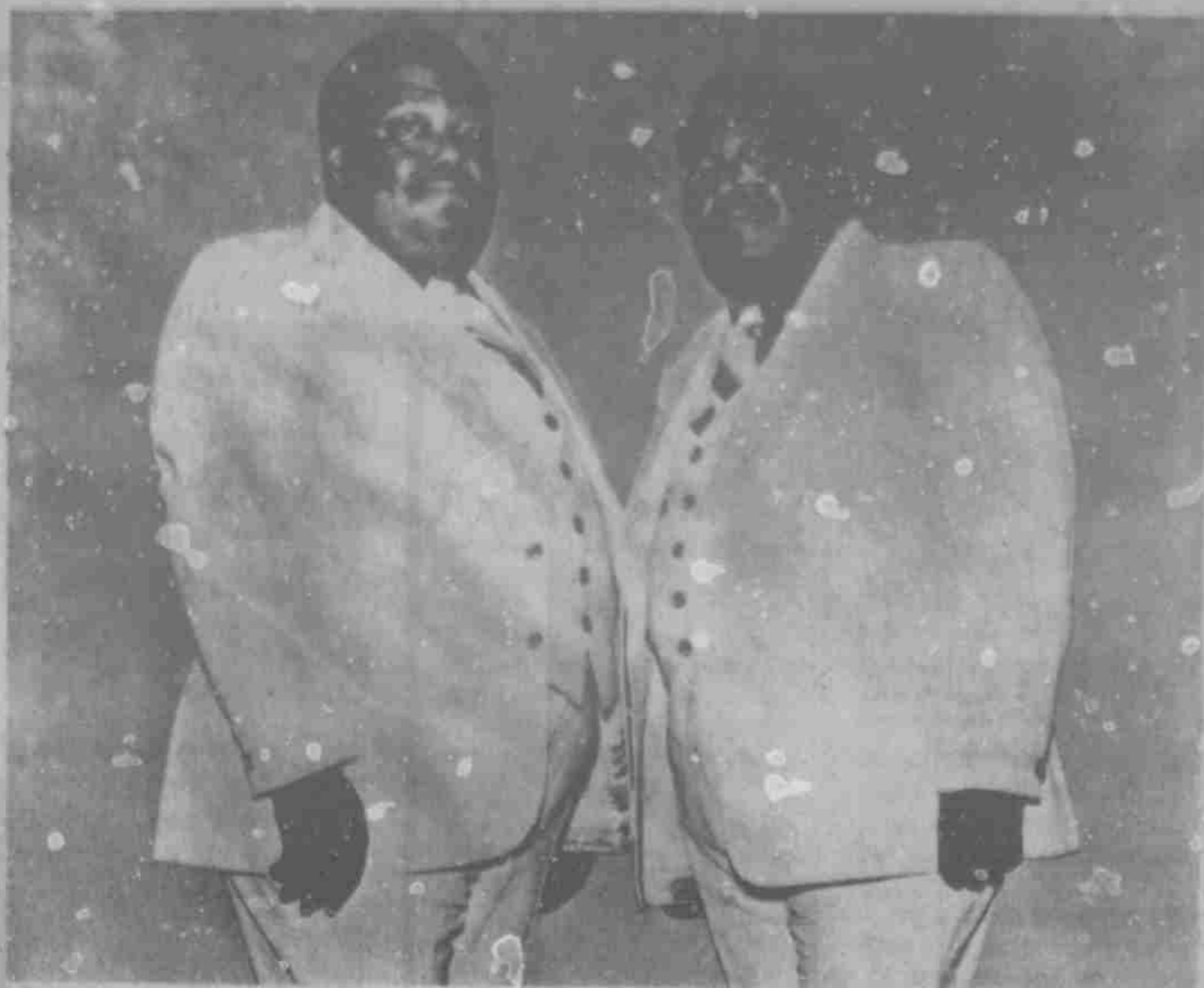

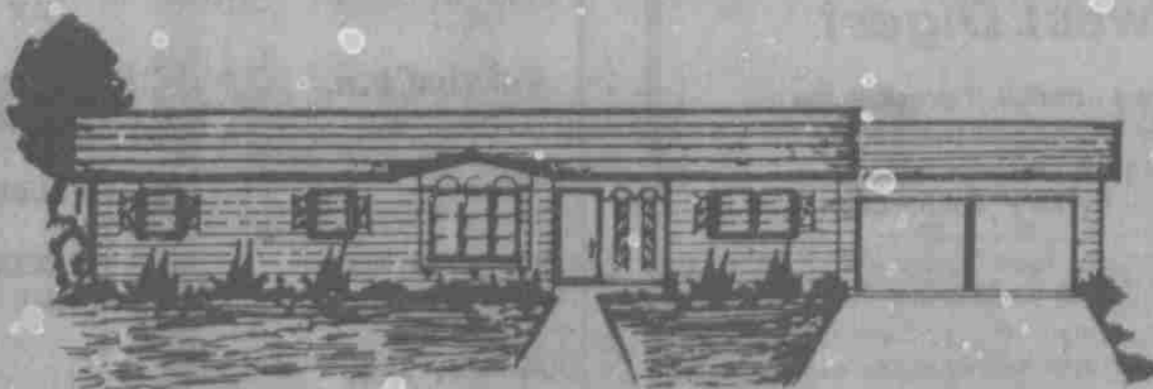

## It Needs To Be Said

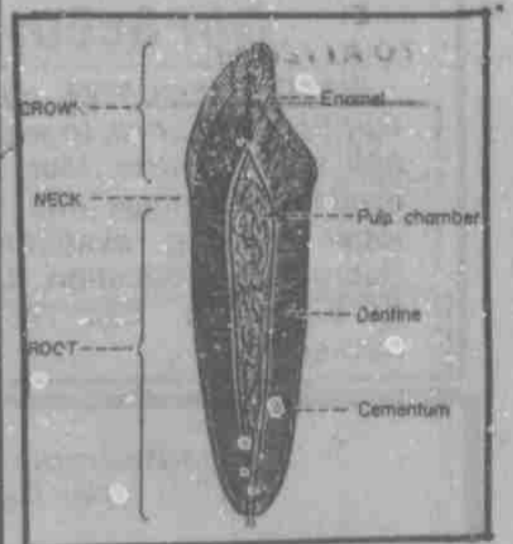
## Physiology and Different Parts Of The Teeth

The teeth and their function are often taken for granted. The teeth cut, grind, and mix the food eaten. To perform these functions, the jaws have powerful muscles capable of providing a chewing force between the front teeth of as much as 30 to 100 pounds and as much as 150 to 200 pounds for the back or jaw teeth. The upper teeth are provided with projections and facets or grooves which allow the teeth to interdigitate so that the teeth fit together like gears. This fitting of the teeth together is called occlusion. Missing teeth often allow the



remaining teeth to shift thereby throwing the bite or occlusion off and causing pain or soreness of the jaw muscles and joints.

The major functional parts of a tooth are the enamel, dentine, cementum, and pulp. The tooth can also be divided into the crown, which is the portion that protrudes out of the gums into the mouth, and the root, which protrudes into the bony socket of the jaw.

The enamel is the surface of the tooth which makes up the portion of the tooth which can be seen in the mouth. Enamel is composed of large and very dense crystals of minerals embedded in a fine meshwork of very strong and insoluble protein fibers.

The main body of the tooth is composed of the dentin. It is less harder than enamel. The dentin is made up of minerals similar to bone but more dense. It contains calcium salts which makes it resistant to compressional forces, while fibers containing collagen make it tough and resistant to damaging forces.

The portion of the tooth which is known as the root is covered by cementum. Cementum is a bony substance which is secreted by a membrane called the periodontal membrane. When the teeth are exposed to strain, the layer of cementum becomes thicker allowing the teeth to seat more firmly in the jaws.

The inside of the tooth is called the pulp. It consists of the nerve and blood vessels of the teeth. Many patients who complain of tooth aches, say "I think the cavity is in the nerve," are really saying the cavity involves the pulp. When people have root canals, it is this portion
