## If's A Lesson in Hisfory ...

## Texas School Public Relations Association

Education is freedom. For Texans, that is not just s saying but a part of our history and everyday life When Texas Public Sc hools Wcak was first set up b tha Texas Masonic Lodige, it was meent to coincide with March 2, Texas Independence Day, pointing out tha reedom and education go hand in hand.
In fact, Texans cited the lack of a public education system as one of their grievances in the Texa on a par with freedom. Texans knew that education was crucial for future generations.
When we celebrate Texas Public Schools Week this year - MARCH 5-9 - we shoutd remember that"Building Brighter Futures" is what Texas schoois have alway strived for.
While the young repubic was mired in the diplomatic, economic and military problems of a new nation, it neve failed to keep education as one of its goals. The Texas Congress declared that four leagues of land be designated in each county to support public schoois. The first state constitution, written after Texas joined the Uniled States in 1845 , directed the state legislature set aside 10 percent of tax revunes for a
The Texas Public Schools Systems, as we know today, came into being with the signing of the Texas loday, came into being with the signing of the Texas first school districts whereby each county was divided inio districts to suit their population. A $\$ 2$ million endowment for the permanent fund provided the initial funding for the public schools system. The Texas Common School Law also provided for the distribution of the interest earned from the "Special Fund" on a per-student basis.
Facing a drastically changed state economy in the post-World W/ar II era, Texans restructured the public schools system in 1949 to meet the needs of future generations.
The Texas Education Agency became what it is today under the Gilmer-Aiken laws of 1949. The appointed State Board School Board became an elected body of 21 members.. The elected Superintendent of Pubic Education, appointed to a four-year term by the State Education, appointed to a Beard.
An economic inde $\%$ ", a more complex formula for school funding based on a iocal school district's ability to raise their own revenues, replaced the per-student minimum salaries for teachers.
In the 136 years the Texas public school system has been in place, Texans have placed education as their top priority. Education is the largest single item in the state budget.
But Texans are not satisfied with that. One netional poil indicates that most people believe that we are still no spending enough on education and would be willing to raise taxes to expand our public school system Texans continually push for educational excellence and innovations. Now serving over 3 milioh students Texas public schools have seen losir acher reading steadily rise in the last deca.

An alternative is $X$-RAY treatmient. A keloid caninot simply be cut out This would leave a scar that might turn into another keloid. ## Church of God - Houston Found Guilty

Thany consumers and business owhers have reported being contacted by the CHURCH OF GOD of Houstor with offers of low interest loans. Some folks have reported that the "Church" has marketing people actually setting up offices in Lubbock. Your Bureau has learned hat on February 1 the Attorney General obtained a permanent injunction against: CHURCH OF GOD houston. The principal, Melvin White, also uses the DEVELOPMENT COMPANY LTD , and CITIZEN'S LIFE \& CASUALTY INSURANCE CO. The judge found that Ine defendaris were engaged in the unauthorized business of insurance by selling unauthorized policies of insurance for Citizens Life and Casualty Insurance Co. Also, it was found that defendants were engaged in the unauthorized business of selling and promoting unregistered securities under the designations certificate of deposit loan program, signature loan program, savings account plus program and precious metals plus program Fin:as of over one half million were levied.

## Bogus Health Care Promotions

The hottest telemarketing swindles of the late 1980's were prize offer packages used to encourage the purchase of over-priced vitamins and water purifie syslems. The newest promotion: health-care related such products as bran, psyllium, Retin-A and the hair such products as bran, psylium, helin-A and the hair make a major push into health scams during the 1990's. Among the bogus items and services most likely to be the subject of such appeals are: arthritis remedies, weightloss plans, sexual aids, baldness remedies, nutrition schemes, "chelation" therapy, muscle stimulators and antifurgal drugs for hiypersensitivity to "candida," a ungus fouind naturaliy in the mouth. Unilike most other lelemarketing schemes, there is the potential hore of a risk to public health since poorly or improperly prepared iteme intended for internal ingestion could result in serious ilfness or worse. So, as with other promotions, if its too good to be true.....
