Last Rites Set For Boy Shot In His Backyard

Funeral services are scheduled to be held Friday at 2 p. m. at Ford Memorial Church of God in Christ for the eight year old boy who was killed as he did his evening chores after returning home from the last day of school. Roderick Jones died at Lubbock General Hospital about two hours after having been shot in the head while he crossed his own backyard.

Lubbock Police have arrested a 14 year old juvenile in the shooting death, but have not charged him with the murder pending completion of their investigation. The youth is presently held at Lubbock County Detention Center.

Assistant District Attorney B. J. "Beni" Hemmelin said Tuesday she could not say when the investigation would be completed or what the formal charges will be.

"It does not appear to have an accident at this point, but we are keeping on open mind," she said.

If the district attorney's office files a murder charge against the youth, they will have two options: one option under a "determine sentence" provision of Texas law could sentence the juvenile for a term not to exceed 30 years, another option under an "indeterminate sentence" provision would detain the youth at the detention center until his 21st birthday where a judge will decide whether he has been rehabilitated or whether he should serve additional time in prison.

Whichever procedure is used to prosecute the youth or whatever charges will be brought against him, the

Arthur Cooper

There are always times and places we try and forget, but as part of a time in history that all Blackmen would like to forget. Because of the hardships, it posed for Blacks. That time being Slavery, no matter how hard we try to erase that part of our past, it will always be there, for without a heritage there is no future.

A man for the time, Arthur Cooper was born in Greenwood, Mississippi, between 1861 and 1870, the oldest of twelve children, was the product of the era. As a child, Arthur recalls living on a plantation where his family worked in the fields, and did all the housework and taking care of livestock.

After the abolishment of Slavery, Arthur still a young man can remember his family moving to Texas and crossing the Mississippi River which to him seemed to take forever.

The family settled in Carthage, Texas where there they became sharecroppers. Arthur can recall having to work in the fields from sunup to sundown in order for the family to have food to eat. He taught himself to count while working in the field picking potatoes for doing that time schooling was

almost unheard of for the Blackman. As a boy, he loved to hunt and fish with his father and grandfather, as recreation because all he had to look forward to was getting up early and playing in the fields and working the gardens to help support the family.

He married Eivia Fogs and continued to sharecrop on his grandfather's land. Wanting something better for himself and family, he learned the art of blacksmithing and after fourteen years, his marriage ended in divorce.

After his divorce, Arthur, along with his family, moved to what is now called Coopers Bottom and set up farming their own land. This was a turning point for the family. In 1923, he met and married Bessie Cleavers and to this union fifteen children were born, five boys and ten girls: Katherine McLin, Mozelle Cooper, Arthur Mae Thomas, Rozine Lampkin, Nozine Fields, Maudie Mae Adams, Loise Tealer, Annie Ruth Moore, Allen Dean Rodless, Annie Helen McDonald, and Emma Brown; boys: Willie L. Cooper, Eugene, Arthur Joe, and Sammie Wilson Cooper.

It Needs To Be Said

"MIRROR, MIRROR ON THE WALL, I AM THE GREATEST OF THEM ALL." When you look into the mirror, what do you see? Forget about the physical appearance, do you see a person that has confidence, a sense of self-worth, that you are truly somebody? Regardless of what your social or economic status, the important thing when you look into the mirror, do you feel good about yourself? Or, are you always finding fault with yourself, or only look at yourself in a dark room or find it difficult to go eyeball to eyeball with yourself?

Health Editorial:

Migraine Headaches

True, migraine headaches are "sickening", often debilitating pains that throb and ache unilaterally in the temporal region. Women are usually affected more often than men. The stereotyped migraine personality is anxious, rigid, perfectionistic, and may be resentful and appear fatigued. The attacks last minutes or as long as a few days, and headaches may be separated by weeks or months and precipitated by menstruation or intake of certain foods or by alcohol. The attacks are preceded by vertigo, facial flushing or pallor, spotty blindness or the appearance of flashing lights. As the headache progresses, there is increasing irritability, nausea and vomiting.

Migraine may be caused by excess vasodilation of the blood vessels outside the skull such as the maxillary artery, although simple dilation by itself does not cause pain. The diagnosis can be confirmed by noting rapid pain relief after hand or digital pressure over the common carotid or external carotid arteries, located on both sides of the neck just to the side of the "Adams apple". This condition must be differentiated from other disorders which cause pain similar to migraines, example trigeminal neuralgia and myofascial pain dysfunction. Migraine headaches are treated almost entirely medically; milder cases may be treated with aspirin. More severe forms call for stronger pain medications. Psychological counseling is also of benefit in many cases. If you are one of the thousands who suffer from migraines see your physician.

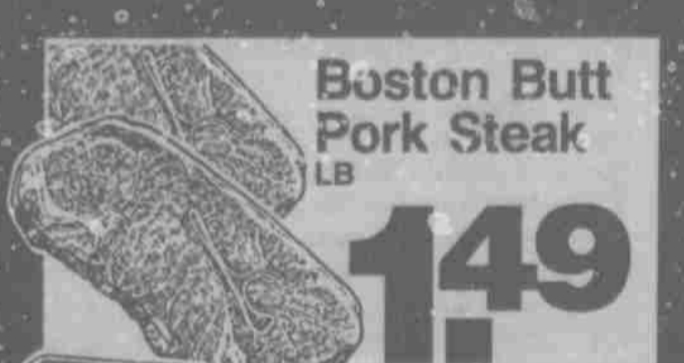



Have you ever attempted to drive into a parking space and another driver sees you there first and hastily cuts in front of you and occupies the space? If so, and in most instances, your reaction is not favorable toward the rude person. Not everyone is kind. In fact, not any of us are always kind. Most of us underestimate the importance of this grace. The Apostle Paul admonished us to "be kind one to another, tender hearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you" (Ephesians 4:32). Often in our prayers, we pray to be faithful, true, and strong, but we seldom pray to be kind. And yet Jesus made kindness the test of his judgment. The only way that we can convince people that we are Christians is by being kind. Our Lord Jesus commands us to love our enemies, and explains his meaning by adding, "bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you and pray for them that despitefully use you and persecute you" (Matthew 5:44). The late Rev. T. A. Steadham spoke to me in my young ministry when I was having some trouble in my congregation. These pearls of wisdom fell from his lips: "Son, you can catch more flies with honey, than you can with vinegar." That is to be kind. Kindness is power; a divine achievement; being Godlike. Are you kind toward your fellowman?

Summer School Set For LISD

The summer vacation will be abbreviated for many students and teachers who participate in summer school offerings of the Lubbock Independent School District. Although some programs have had pre registration, many students will enroll for the classes on Thursday, June 8. Most classes will begin Monday, June 12.

Senior high courses for grades 9 thru 12 will be offered at Estacado High School. Seventh and eighth grade classes will be offered at Smylie Wilson, and a similar program will be available at Alderson for students who attend that school.

A number of elementary schools will offer tuition free extended year instruction as a result of funding by Chapter 1. In addition, a program to serve

students not involved with Chapter 1 programs will be offered on a tuition basis at Maedgen Elementary.

Several other programs will be in operation. Oral language skills will be emphasized in pre-kindergarten and pre-first grade classes for students who qualify in the same elementary schools that offer the tuition free extended year classes. Williams Elementary will offer "Kamp Kaleidoscope", an enrichment program for students who do not need remediation, for kindergarten through sixth grade. Libraries at the elementary school level will be open on a schedule of two or three days each week through July 14. Lomax Center will have swimming classes for third graders from several schools,

speech therapy will be given at Maedgen Elementary, and Ballenger School will have special education courses for trainable and early childhood.

Traffic Signal Installation

Beginning this week, June 5th, traffic signals will be placed in operation on the detour route around the traffic circle. Signals will remain in effect until

construction is completed in this vicinity, according to the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation.

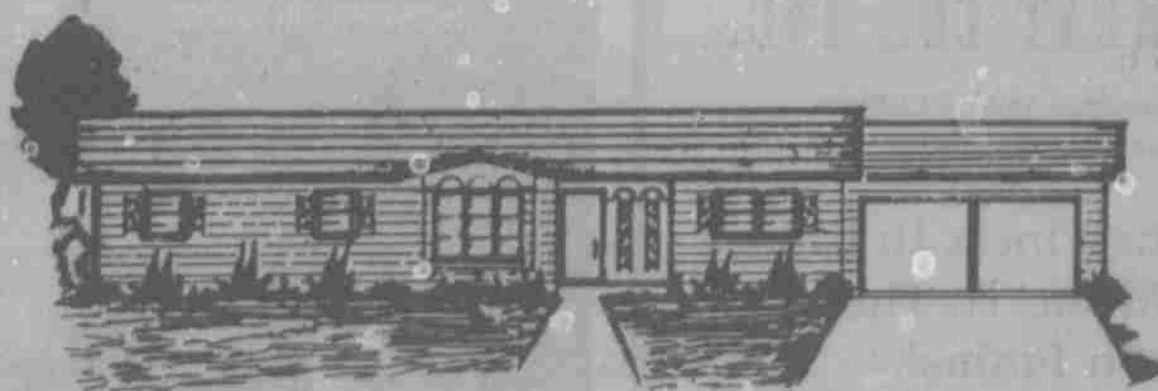
