in bushes near a reputed Oakit Cliff crack house. Police said he held a bag containing six rocks of Pruith, convicted Nov. 1, was glven two years' probation Dee. Friday ing he questions "the whole governance of the school," Cottrelil called for an emergency

said a regular board meeting is scheduled for Jan. 22, so there is no need for an earlier session. Cottrell, complaining that net-

The amendment was ratified on Doc, 18, 1865, soon after the Civil War ended and two years after Abr ham Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation. It took the question of slavery out of the hands of the individual states and proclamed, Nerude. except as a punishment for tude. except as a punishment for
