## LISD Sets Deadline For Tranfer Requests

All requests for student transfors and assignments in the Lubbock Independent School District for-
next school year,
I991-92, musl be made during the period of February 1 - March 15, 1991. Only those rransfer tequests on the approppriate forms provided
by the school district will be considered. Decisions will be made in writing.
Any transfer requests to be considered must be filed by the March 15 deadline. All types of transfer requests are included; however, these dates could change
for targeled grades and schools in the desegregation plan should desegregation orders create a need for additional time.
The majority to minorily transfers are included in the Pebruary -March 15 application period.

Students who attend school where their ethnic classification is in the majoinity. For purposes of the majority to minority transfer policy, minority students are Hispanic and Black, and majority students are Anglo and etbnic groups other than Hispanic and

Schools will be classiffed as "majority" or "minority" based on the ethnic makeup at the close of the first semester, January 17. Under the majority to minority transfer policy, four elementary sehools are not available to receive such transfers because they are involved in magnet school assignments: Iles, Ramirez,

Students who attend schools where their ethnic clasisification is in the majority may transfer to schools where their ethnic classification is in the minority

Transfer request forms may be picked up and returned to principals of the schools where students are presently enrolied.
