"Submits Alternative 7-0 Plan" Minority Groups, Officials Oppose 5-2 Plan!!

Twelve minority organization this week submitted a 7-0 plan for electing members to the Lubbock Independent School District's Board of Directors. The groups asked the Justice Department for approval of the 7-0 plan instead of tho 5-2 plan submitted by LISD for pre-clearance.

The 7-0 plan provides three safe minority districts. District 1 was drawn with a higher minority percentage in order to maximize the black voting block. Although districts 2 and 3 are just over 50% minority, many, if not most, of the whites in these two districts are students at Texas Tech university and these students rarely vote in local elections, leaving these two districts much more heavily minority than the figures indicate.

Although school enroliment district wide is approaching 60% minority, under the 5-2 pian only two trustees (or 28 of

the board) are elected from minority districts (Districts 1 and 2). With this plan, there would be three trustees (or 43% of the board) elected from minority districts (Districts 1, 2 and 3). in addition, District 4 becomes a Central Lubbock District that, although anglo, has many of the same problems and concerns as the minority districts. District 4 becomes a balance between minority districts 1, 2 and 3 and anglo districts 5, 6

and 7.

Last year, Bidal Aguero one of the original plaintiffs of the Voting Rights suit against LISD that changed the method in which Trustees were elected, promised to pursue legal action against LISD if the 5-2 plan is approved. Aguero said that many things have changed since 1985 that justify a 7-0 plan.

In a statement issued by the Lubbeck ISD and submitted to the U.S. Justice Department on May 18, 1993, concerning the preclearace of a plan calling for the maintaining of the single -member districts and 2 at-largo system of electing School Board Trustees, LISD gives an ultimatum to Justice saying that if the plan is not accepted, they would appeal to federal court for approval.

According to supporters of the 7-0 plan, they are going to move forward proving that the at-large representation is unconstitutional. The five white men on the Board of Trustees should realize it. If they are the fiscal conservatives that they say they are, they should forget about protecting their seats and spending our tax monies friviously and start worrying about educating our children, according to local minority leaders.
