Two weeks ago a Louisiana federal court helí that drawing congressional districts simply for the purpose of benefiting blacks was unconstitutional. But last week a federal court in North Caroline held that such
districts were a valid way of remedying past discrimination. The differing rulings virtually guarantee that the issue of how far states can go to in drawing up district boundaries will have to be settled by the U.S. Supreme Court. But as it stands now, the newly created black majority district in Luplisiana is Iiegal while the olle in North
Caroitise the- 12 distitet eat continue to exist.

Ear! Shinhoster will serve as the new Exe ative Director of the NAACP. Benjamin Chavis Jr. was fired Saturday after an $8 \frac{1}{2}$-hour meeting of NAA.CP Board Members. Board members would niot comment on whether allegaions of sexual misconduct led to Chavis being ousted.
" "'m obviously soniewhat shaken," said Chavis as he left the board mee.ing. A leadership summit scineduled for Sunday was rescheduled and moved from the NAASP building to a tocal church. Chavis presided uver the meeting,
Che is allegedly sexually harassed an African-American NAACP worker then paid her over $\$ 300,000$ of NAACP money in an out-of-court settlement.
He is also accused of being freewheeling with the organization's money. Local residents have mixed reactions to Chavis being fired. Lubbock Black Chamber Secretary Dwight Pierce spid he feels Chavis should have been reprimanded. "I don't believe everything I read in the media but going by what I've read. Chavis' actions do leave doubts in your mind: It seems that many of our YIP leaders have skeletons in their closets. Everyone does but ours are just magnified."
County Commissioner Precinet 2 candidate Abraham S Sires believes that
outside intiuences led to Chavis being fired. "His ascocintion with the honoutside intiuences led to Chavis being fired. "His association witio the honorable Louis Farakhan brougtit ebout hira veing fired. The sexual harassment charges were just a means to an end. The U.S. President is under the same type of attack, but corporate America hasn't waged a war agatnst him." ## Children Pay When Parents Don't Childwatch

## By Marian Wright Edelman

I was disturbed to learn recently that Americars are more faithful about paying for their cars than for their children, The nationa delinquency rate for used car loans was a mere three percent in 1992, while the delinquency rate for child support owod to mothers was an astounding 49 percent in 1990.
A recent report from the Children's Defense: Fund found that after a decade of govermment efforts to improve child support enforcement, delinquent parents 3 ind overburdened states aie still failing to provide millions of children with healthy, safe, and nurured. healthy, safe, and nurured.
In fact, only 14.7 percent of the cases served by state child support agencies had some child support collection in 1983, and the rate increased only four percentage points to 18.7 percent of the cases in 1992. At this rate, it will be more than 180 years before each child served by a state agency can be guaranteed even eq partial support payment!
Our child support system is failing to deliver on its most basic promise to children, that parents will be held responsible for ensuring that they hive a roof over their heads and food on their tables. And we know that children pey when their parents don't. A 1992 survey of 300 single parents showed the real harm children suffer when child support is not paid. During the first year after one parent left the home, more than haif the families surveyed faced a serious housing crisis. In addition:

- Ten percent became homeless,
- Forty-eight (48) percent moved in with
- Nearly a third reported that their childret went hungry at some point during that year. - And more than a third reporied that their children didn'teven have a winter coul. Some states are better at enforcing child support than others. "Hell of Fame" states incluce Delaware, Massachusetts, Michigan. Minnesota, Montana, Pennsylvania, South Dakota, Utuh. Washington State, and Wisconsin. "Hall of Shame" states include Arizona, the District of Columbia, Illinois, Inciana, Louisiana, Mississippi, New Mexico. Tennessec, and Texas. States weic included in the Hail of Shame because they ranked at the bettom of the states in two or morc key measeres of child support performance, such as percentage of cases with paternity establishied or collections made.
In addition to families breaking up, the fact that more than one out of four children is is. out of wedlock isn't helping the problem of inadeyuate child support. Yet improvements can be made by foilowing the leads of Virginia and Washington State. Each dramatically increased their rate of estublishing paternity by pioneering hospital based programs which encouraga falhers to voluntariiy acknowledge the paternity of their children born out of wedlock.
Being in the Hall of Fame calls for congratdations but let's not let them get too comfortable since even in Washingtoa State, one of the nation's leaders, two out of three cases


## port Paynent at all.

Improving the child support enforcemient systert will foquite mithing the feferal govers ment responsible fer cellecting support and Ieaving the estahlishmint of paternity and the support obligation to the states. Also, a child stpport assurance system must guaraniee children a minimum level of support when the government is unable to collect it on their behalf: The federal government must help states locate absent parents and collert sup. Port, as well as ensiure that ench stale hius the staff and resources to do the job well.
One in four children lives in a single-parent family. White the government must do its part to enforce support for these children, it is equally as important that parents take moral and personal responsibility for the children they tring into this world. It is a tragedy and an outrage that the threat of ctt repossession prompts more regular phyments from Americans than the threat that a child might so hungry ! If you are a parent, remember that is the most inportant calling you have. Do not have children until you are ready to care for them.

Study Shows Dffectiveness of Blood Pressure Drugs in African-Americans लlamा The fist study to compure the effecticencess of all mifor elast es of hiegh blood pressure drugs, published in this week's Now Eingland Joumial of Medicine, found that certain frugs are more successful in treating African-Americans than ofhers.

One drug fram each of six classes of high blond pressure medicationsACE inlibitors, alpha-1-blockers, alpha-2-agoniste, beta blockers, calcium chamee blockers and diuretics-was evaluated. The calcium channel blocker, a drug called dilatizem, was most effective in blacks of all ages, conirolling blood pressure in 64 percent of dhe patients taking it. Aydrochlerothiazide was also effective in black men age 60 and oider. coatrolling blood pressure in 58 percent.
In the study about 600 African-American men wilh high blood pressure were candomly assigned a drug from one of the six classes or a placelo (a neutral compound, usually a sugar tablet, given to a patient and then monitored for its effects) and followed for at ieast one year
"Clearly, the calcium channel blocker was much more effective in the younget African-American patients than any of the other drugs," satd Matemen "il was also the most efleccive dug in older Africm-Amarican

 hhibitor captopril being least effective. And that is very interesting. heeame when you look at younger Curcensinn patients, enptoptil was the best drug.
High bloud pressure occurs in younger blacks at twice the rate it occurs in youngar whites.
"African-Americans have a disproportionale percentage of patients with nigh blood pressure," Materson stated. "It does a oot more damage thas in other populations so we need to treat it very aggressively,"
Not only are blacks more iikely to have high bleod pressure than whites, they tend to have it earlier in life and to experience more severe effects as a resull, such as stroke, kidney failure and heart disease. Of the total deaths of black males in the United States eacin year, 29 percent are attributed to bigh bloud pressure, comparec with 6 percent in white males.
The study was conducté by the VA Cooperative Studies Progran which coerdinates clinical research and statistical evaluation of large-scale zteses throughout the VA medical system. VA cooperative stadies invoiving over 10,000 participants in more than 100 medical centers are beling sonover
ducted currently.
