

New Suspect in Clark Case?

Instead of enting a judge's ruling on a trials, previously filed motion, the three Cla Kwidzinski, Frank Carrso and Victor Jasas-charged in the Lenard Clark beating. were surprised in early December to discover that police suspect a fourth person may have been involved in the incident.

As a result, attorneys for the defendants Judge Daniel Locallo to allow them to track discovery, so that they could get more information on that person, while also investigating how the lineup procedure was conducted.

Caruso's lawyer, Ed Jensen, alleged that police were attempting to hide the information pertaining to the fourth suspect. Jensen also said that the fourth suspect in question had allegedly confessed to the beating but police failed to do anything about it.

To resolve both of these issues, Locallo summoned the detectives involved in the case along with Lt. John Regan of Area I Detective Division to testify.

It was found that although police made mention that a fourth suspect was wanted

recorded the outcome of their findings in any of their reports. Defense attorneys

believe that information regarding the fourth suspect could be contained in the detectives' general- progress reports, that are now missing.

Locallo determined that the defense attorneys did have a basis for their motion and a right to see the reports. As a result, he ordered that the prosecution find them and then hand them over.

Earlier in the day, Jensen had also filed a motion asking Locallo to sever the hate crime charge from the attempted murder and aggravated battery charges and have separate trials. Locallo denied the request, saying that there was no basis for multiple






