





### from the Desk of Parson D.A. Smith

Who Would Be Free, Themsevies Must Strick the Blow

What troubles Parson Smith in February 2001 is the political and racial climate that exists in Lubbock, Texas and across America. Who would be free, them-

selves must strike the blow. Again I ask, are the words of Douglass, "Who would be free, them-

selves must strike the first blow" empty and vain in the 21st Century? No! His words still live. I remember in my early ministry hearing the voices of Blacks of African Ancestry of Wesleyan or Methodist tradition singing a hymn of Isaac Watts in the tune Arlington Common Meter, "Am I a Soldier of the Cross?" The following words of the hymn had great meaning to a people of African Ancestry struggling for their civil rights:

> Am I a soldier of the cross, A follower of the Lamb. And shall I fear to own His cause, Or blush to speak His name?

Must I be carried to the skies On flowery beds of ease, While other fought to wind the prize, And Sail through bloody seas?

Sure I must fight if I would reign: Increase my courage Lord; I'll bear the toil, endure the pain,

Supported by Thy word. Remembering the words of Douglass ("In contemplating the little progress made by the colored people in the acquisition of property in the South, and their present wretched condition, the circumstances of their emancipation should not be forgotten. Measurement in their case should not begin from the height yet to be attained by them but from the depths whence they have come. It should be remembered by our severe judges that freedom came to us not from the sober dictates of wisdom, or from

any normal condition of things, not as a matter of choice on the part of the landowners of the South, nor from moral consideration on the part of the North. It was born of battle and of blood. It came across fields of smoke and fire strewn with wounded, bleeding, and dying men.

Not from the Heaven of Peace amid the morning stars, but from the hell of war - out of the tempest and whirlwind of warlike passions, mingled with deadly hate and spirit of revenge; it came, not so much as boon to us as a blast to the enemy. Those whom the measure was directed where the landowners and they were not angels, but men, and, being men, it was to be expected they would resent the blow. They did resent it, and a part of that resentment unhappily fell upon us.") calls our attention once again to the fact that freedom come with a price. If we are to win the battle for our freedom in the 21it Century, we must use every available means of the legal system to free ourselves of the tyranny of white conservatives males in America.

This month, a hate crimes bill meant to toughen penalties for crimes directed against minorities, women, gays, and other groups won final approval from a key Senate Committee in Austin, Texas. The Senate Criminal Justice Committee, the same panel that rejected a similar bill in a contentious debate in 1999, approves the measure five to one. The bill must now go to the full Texas Senate. This will give us an opportunity to take a deep look at Senator Robert Duncan.

The bill approved enhances the penalty for crimes motivated by race, religion, color, disability, sexual orientation, national origin, or ancestry. Under the bill, defendants would be more harsfily punished for crimes if a jury concludes their action was motivated by hate.


The bill named "The James Byrd Jr. Act" after the black man who was dragged to his death behind a pickup in East Texas in 1998 by three white supremacists, was voted against by a West Texas white conservative, Senator Ted Bivins, Republican of Amarillo. Governor Rick Perry has said he would carefully consider the bill "if" it makes it to his





## Dispute Resolution

(1) The dispute resolution process provides for in Chapter 2260 of the Government Code shall be used as further described herein, by Texas Tech University and the contractor to attempt to resolve any claim in breach of contract made by

(A) A contractor's claims for breach of this contract that the parties resolve in the ordinary course of business shall be submitted to the negotiation process provided in chapter 2260 subchapter B of the Government Code. To initiate the process, the

contractor shall submit written notice, as required by subchapter B to the Director of Purchasing/Payables. Said notice shall specifically state that the provision of Ch.2260, subchapter B are being invoked. A copy of the notice shall also be given to all other representatives of Texas tech University and the contractor otherwise entitled to notice under the parties contract. Compliance by the contractor with subchapter B is a condition precedent to the filing of a contracted case proceeding under Chapter 2260 subchapter C of the Government Code.

(B) The Contested case process provides in Chapter 2260 subchapter C of the Government Code is the contractor's sole and exclusive process for seeking a remedy for any and all alleged breaches of contract by Texas Tech University of the parties are unable to resolve their dispute

under subparagraph (A) of this paragraph.

(C) Compliance with the contested case process provided in subchapter C is a condition precedent to seeking consent to sue from the Legislature under Chapter 107 of the Civil Practices and Remedies Code. Neither the execution of this contract by texas tech University nor any other conduct of any representative of Texas Tech University relating to the contract shall be considered a waiver of novereign immunity to

(2) The submission, processing, and resolution of the contractor's claim is governed by the published rules adopted by the texas Attorney General's Office pursuant to Chapter 2260 as currently effective, hereafter enacted of subsequently amended.

(3) Neither the occurrence of an event nor the pendency of a claim constitute grounds for the suspension of performance by the contractor, in whole or in part.
