NAACP President Says Justice Is Finally Served in Birmingham

Kewisi Mfurne, President - CEO, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), said that with the unity verdict of former Ku Klux Klansman I nomas Elanton, Jr. Justice has finally been served in one of the most vile and victous murders this country had over seen."

However, Milume said: "We'te mindful that this verdict will not bring back the lives of the four little gills who were senselessly killed in the 1963 bornoing of a Birmingham, Alabama church, Nor will it erase the collective pain that this nation has lived with for the last 38 years. I hope their deaths will remind us of how hate can custroy when left -unchallanged."

An Alabama jury on Tuesday fought Blanton guilty of first degree murder in the deaths of four black girls, killed in one of the most shocking crimes of the civil rights era. Cynthia Wesley, Carole Robertson and Addie Mae Collins, all aged 14, and Denise McNair, 11, died in the 3 blast of the Sixteenth Street Baptist Church.

Its half-million adult and youth members throughout the United States and the world are the premier advocates for civil rights in their communities, conducting voter mobilization and monitoring equal opportunity in the public and private sectors.

Bipartiaen Lawmakers To Announce Legislation That Will Establish A National African American History Muceum

WASHINGTON, DC-U.S. Senators Rick Sentorum (R-PA), Sam Brownback (R-KS), Max Cleland (D-GA), and Hillary Clirton D-NY), and house Republican Conference Chairman J.C. Watts (R-OD/4) and Congressmen John Lewis (D-GA15) held a press donference on Thursday, May 3, 2001 at 11 00 a.m. they unveiled legislation to establish a National Museum of African American History and Culture on or near the National Mall in Washington, D.C.

When asked about the importance of the legislation, Republican Conference Chairman Santorum stated, "African Americans have played a key role in shaping our nation, not only into a symbol of democracy and freedom, but into a beacca that other nations look to for leadership in areas ranging from arts and Merature to science and medicine. From slavery to the modern civil rights movement, African Americans sacrificed life, liberty, and their own pursuit of happiness in order to attain these very same ideals for those who would follow in their footsteps

Despite this courageous history of lecoership and sacrifice, there is currently no national museum de licated to telling the African American story located on or near the National Mail in Washington, D.C. Establishing a national museum to recognize African American history and culture is a long-overdue step in honoring the contributions and legacy of the African Americans who have shaped our nation."

Seal off electrical receptacles and switch boxes with foam gaskets or fiberglass insulation. Savings: 1-3% percent of heating/cooling costs.

Turn off the pilot on your gas furnace during the warm season. This saves gas and the pilot flame adds to the heat the A/C has to remove from the air.

Outdoor Tips "Keep the Heat Out, the Cool In"

Cook outdoors whenever possible.

Seal gaps around pipes, fans and vents that go through walls, ceilings and floors, and accesses to unheated spaces.

When re-roofing, consider using tighter-colored shingles.

Convert incandescent bulbs to fluorescent lamps with screw-in bases. Fluorescent lights give the same

amount and quality of light as incandescent bulbs, yet use one third of the energy and last ten times longer.



Protecting Yourself on the Internet by John Cornyn, Attorney General of Texas

Q: Back day I receive several e-mails adver-

tising porn sites. I have young children in the house and do not what them exposed to such things. Are you doing anything to put these sites out of business.

A: The Internet remains almost entirely unregulated, creating ample opportunity for those who choose to engage in undesirable enterprises. It is important to remember that activities which are illegal in the real world are also fliegal in cyber space like child pornography.

As Attorney General, I take serious my responsibility to protect the children of this state. To help combat child purpography on the Internet, my office has staff members dedicated to prosecuting those who post illegal images on the Web.

The Internet Child Pornography Unit was created in 1998 through a grant from the Governor's office. Specially trained investigators and prosecutors work with local law enforcement officials to investigate and prosecute those suspected of possessing child

If you receive an e-mail that appears to be advertising a Web site

that contains child pomography, you can file a report directly with the Internet Child Pornography Unit through the "Criminal Justice" section of our Web site at www.ong

Last year, my office joined foress with the Texas Internet Service Provider Association (TISPA) to create guidelines for reporting suspected child pornography on the Web. Members of TISPA now have guidelines that they can follow to report possible cases of child pornography to my office for investigation.

Now, when an Internet customer reports allegations of child pornography to his or her Internet Service Provider, that provider can in turn report it to our office. This provides a means for Internet Service Providers to of my office can investigate Internet police their own networks and protect their customers.

Q: I get dozens of unsolicited emails each day in my e-mail account, Is there any way to stop these people? The messages are usually advertisements for get-rich-quick-schemes.

A: Everyone who has an e-mail account has received unsolicited messages, or"Spam." Not only are these messages annoying, they can take forever to download and they clog e-mail

accounts. These messages are about get-rich-quick or work-at home schemes. Others offer phony university diploma's or fraudulest international driver's licenses.

Many messages contain instructions telling the recipient to reply to the message and type "remove" in the subject line. But this rarely works. In fact, it sends a message that your address is an active account and opens you up to

receiving more spam. Many Internet Service Providers have anti-spam policies. Check with your provider to see how to file a complaint. You could also consider using an Internet Service Provider that strictly enforces its anti-spam policies or that filters e-mails for spam.




