NEA EFghlights Public Schools' Role in Making America Strong Af Joint Conference On **Concerns Of Minorities** And Women

WASHINGTON, DC-Public Education: Democracy's Foundation" will be the focus of the 2002 Joint Conference on Concerns of Minorities and Women scheduled for June-27-28 ar The Adam's Mark Hotel in Dallas: The conference is held each year just prior to the Annual Meeting of the 2.7 million-member National Education Association (NEA), which will focus this year on implementation of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) reauthorization.

"In our classrooms, generation after generation of native-born and immigrant students have been taught to understand and respect America's core values," said NEA President Bob Chase-"The success of America's domestic security will depend on more than metal detectors and sky marshals. It will also depend on the values, we teach our children. The Joint Conference assists. NEA members by illuminating the latest trends and developments in education policy and classroom instruction that have proven effective in teaching minority students. Kicking off the conference with a keynote speech on "Creating a Climate of Success for All Students in the 21st Century's" is Freeman A. Hrabowski, in. president of the University of Maryland in Baltimore County, as well as a mathematician and author Hrabowski created a highly successful program to attract African American students into graduate and professional programs. The Luncheon speaker, Sherman Alexie, comes from the world of arts and letters, A Spokane/Coeur d'Alene Indian, Alexie's first screenplay, Smoke signals, premiered at the 1998 Sundance Film Festival, where it received the Audience Award and Filmmakers Trophy. His novels include Reservation Blues and Indian Killer, a New York Times Notable Book, His most recent book. The World, won the PEN/Malariud award.

# Texas Tech University's College of Education Receives \$1 Million Grant For Course

LUBBOCK - Texas Tech University's College of Education recently received a \$1 -3 million grant from the New Mexico School for the Visually! Handicapped. The funding, which will span over a five-year period, will support courses for New Mexico teachers who will work with visually impaired students and orientation and mobility specialists. Classes for the program. the New Mexico Vision Professionals Outreach Project, start[t in the Fall 2002. Pat Kelley, Ed.D., co-principal investigator of the grant, said the program will offer online courses for both teachers and mobility professionals-Additionally, two weekend classes in Alamogordo, N.M.,

and a summer course in 2003 will be offered for mobility students. Kelley, who is also a research associate professor of the College of Education, said teachers will learn Braille and how to adapt materials for instruction for the visually impaired. Mobility students will learn how to guide people with visual impairments. 1 There are 32 programs in the United States that train teachers to work with individuals with visual impairments and 16 programs in the United States for mobility professionals," Kelley said. "Unless we make ourselves globally available, a lot of people will be overlooked."

threatening to file tormal civil rights complaints in three of the states where the disparities between white and black students are hi-Ohio, Louisiana and Florida.

The National Caucus of Black State Legislators, on the other hand, is focusing on how legislators can build coalitions which include educators, parents, and students to make the problems known and then intensively work to direct them. In their report. Closing the Achievement Gap, C.J. Prentiss, State Senator from Cleveland and chair of the TCBSL's Committee 011 Elementary and Secondary Education, wrote, "We know what works-our children can learn and perform at a high level with quality teachers who understand our community, with research-proven intervention, including smaller class sizes, with personal attention, and with a focus on high standards." There are no quick and easy solutions to these problems. Next week, I'll look at some of he causes and possible solutions and at similar problems faced by other students of color. But, make no mistake about it, this is not just a crisis for communities of color-it is a crisis for every American who cares about the future of our nation. Our African American slave ancestors whose very lives wee at risk if they learned to read and those who were rave enough to teach them will have worked for naught if we produce a whole generation unable to read two hundred years later. That would be a true American tragedy and does not bode will for our democracy.

American students in the nation these warnings, mistakenly and that white fourth graders believing the middle class were three times more likely to pass the reading proficiency tests than were their African American counterparts. Moreover, of the current seventh graders, only 11.5 percent of black students have passed all parts of their sixth-grade proficiency exams and new state rules require them to pass a difficult tenth grade test in order to graduate. If Ohio were the only state where African American students were in academic trouble, that would be a tragedy for our state, but the reality is that it is true across the nation and thus achievement gaps it is a tragedy for our nation.

Nearly 50 years after the "Brown vs. Board of Education" decision which rendered separate but equal schools for black students unconstitutional and in a new century where information is the key to economic survival, African American students have fallen way behind. And without intensive and intentional strategies targeted for them, they will become casualties of the new economy and candidates for prison, unemployment lines and worse. "Not having an adequate education today is literally an economic death sentence," said Katie Haycock of the Education Trust. These numbers and the realities behind them mean that the very future of the African' American community is at risk. That is why many are beginning.


### EAST AUDBOLCK FARINGSFEDLERS WITH MEET
