My mother was an avid gardener and gardening has held my interest from the time that I was about 10 years old, when my mother gave me a 6° X 61 comer of her garden to make mine. With her help, my harvest was just enough to make one pot of gumbo. I was proud of it. During this time of my life. I also harvested plums and berries from which I made wine. These were my years of youthful adventure. I was alwayshappy with the outcome of whatever fruit or vegetable I tried to grow. As my youthful years faded into adult years, I tried making a garden around my garage, as citylife in the northern part of the United States did not provide the land space for the kind of gardens you can make in rural and rural urban areas such as my current residence. I saved many trips to the grocery store, however, when I harvested, collard greens, Swiss

chard, tomatoes, cucumbers, okra, carrots, cabbage sprouts, garlic and onions. The soil was bountiful and by Renetta W. Howard to preserve some of these items to eat through the winter months. Changing cities made a big difference in my harvests.

> Living on the South Plains of the United States is definitely a different kind of gardening. After a few years, the cliche and the 100 degree temperatures diminished my zeal for gardening. I even turned to putting artificial nowers in my yard. Later, as I returned to my childhood gardening area to live, I was still putting artificial flowers in my yard. A couple of years ago, I planted some flowers and a couple of seeds of collard greens, a couple of peppers and a tomato or two. With a little luck, I had a small harvest; a couple of meals; a little more than with my first garden.

the largest garden that I have ever had Unfortunately, some of my seeds just did not raise .hemselves up through the soil. A day after I planted, we had the worst rain storm of the Spring and have continued to have rainy weather and some of my seeds washed away. The seeds that have come up have been surrounded by the tallest prettiest grass that I have ever seen. When asked about my garden, I say, "Oh, the grass is doing very well/* To preserve what seeds that have come up, I have put a new twist into gardening; a weed whacker. I used a weed whacker to get most of the grass out of my garden as a hoe and I never were good friends. Now, my plants can breathe and grow without the grass,

though I must admit that I did chop

off a few tomato and okra leaves in

ed some tomatoes, a few collard



Child Support Evader David Tello

Owes: \$49,479

Attorney General Greg Abbott needs your help to find Child Support Evader David Tello, one of the Most Wanted Child Support Evaders in Texas, Tello, who was named to the Attorney General's Top Ten List of Child Support Evaders in March 2002, owes \$49,479 for his two children's care. Tello has gone underground to elude officials and willfully avoid arrest.

In the original divorce decree from 1990, Tello was ordered to make child support payments of \$62.50 a week, Tello, who had the ability to pay and did not, was placed on 36 months probation in 1993 for getting more than \$8,000 benind on his child support payments. Tello did not follow the terms of the court order, and an arrest warrant was issued in October 1995 to revoke his probation.

Due to an indictment by the Bexar County Grand Jury in December 1999, Tello is also wanted on a felony warrant for criminal non-support. Tello now owes more than \$49,000 in unpaid child support because of missed payments and interest on unpaid child support.

Tello may be hiding in San Antonio, and is most likely working for cash to avoid garnishment of wages to pay child support.

Contact the Attorney Generals Office at 1-866-EVADERS (382-3377) to report information that

may lead to the arrest of David Tello.

The Child Support Evaders on the top ten list are being singled out because they have the ability to take responsibility for their children, but refuse to do so. Incarceration is the only option for parents who flagrantly ignore a court's order to pay child support. The Attorney General's Office helps parents who lack the ability to pay child support by referring them to job training and employment services.

Seniors: Living Trusts Are Not for Everyone

has heard reports about unethical sales of living trusts. Some victims have paid as much as \$1,800

door sales persons. Too often, the sale is made without regard for whether a living trust really is in the client's best interests. The fact is, for a majority of seniors, a living trust is NOT preferable to attorney.

A living trust is a legal document that usually is created for the purpose of allowing another person to assist you in managing your assets while you are alive, and for distributing your assets after you are gone.

A living trust is different from a "living will" (now called a "directive to physicians and family or surrogates"), which expresses your health care wishes about being kept alive or not if you are seriously injured or terminally ill.

A living trust involves three parties: the grantor, the trustee and the beneficiary. As grantor, you transfer ownership and control of your money, property, and other assets to the trust, which is managed by the trustee for the benefit of the beneficiary.

Our office for you. This option is typically used when you are facing a debilitating or terminal illness that may impair your judgment. If you are currently serving as your own trustee, the successor trustee will distribute the remainder of the trust after your death. The distribution of your assets after your death will be governed by the directions you provide in the trust document.

Some sales people often leau victims to believe that probate proceedings are overly lengthy and costly, and a living trust should be used in order to avoid probate. In fact, the probate process in Texas is one of the a will and a durable power of least expensive and simplest in the United States. Also, remember that a living trust is not the only way to avoid probate.

> "A living trust will reduce death taxes on your estate" is a frequently used, misleading statement. Most Texans will not face estate taxes. If your estate is subject to taxes, you can use a will to accomplish the same tax savings as a trust, usually at a much lower cost.

> Living trusts are not appropriate for the majority of seniors. In fact, for some people, the expense of creating, administering, maintaining and funding a living trust can outweigh the benefit of having a living trust.

In deciding if a living trust is right for you, be sure not to succumb to high-pressure sales tactics. Be wary of phrases like "once in a lifetime," "act now," You can serve as the grantor, and "don't let this pass you by." Whether a living trust is an appropriate estate planning tool

and goals. For example, living trusts are often appropriate for someone who is facing a serious incapacity like Alzheimer's. You should discuss the benefits and drawbacks with accountants, attorneys and financial planners who are experienced in this area and whom you trust before taking any action.

You should also be cautious about allowing a living trust salesperson to see your assets and your net worth because the salesperson may use this knowledge to sell you inappropriate investments. If you are subsequently contacted by a salesperson offering annuity products, you should be aware that there are several types of annuities, many of which are not appropriate for seniors as a tool for financial planning.
