increasing the number of organ and tissue donors. This staggering percentage may be attributed, in part, to the escalating number of African Americans with conditions that can lead to the need for an organ transplant; such as dix
betes, high blood pressure and heart disease. Despite this rapid growing need, there remains a crit ical shortage of African American organ donors.
