If someone witnesses an illegal dump, he is encouraged to give the time of the dumping and any information about the persons and vehicles involved. Citizens reporting the dumping can remain anonymous, but leaving a name and number will

The hotline is a project of the Solid Waste, Business and Neighborhood Development,

Environmental Health and Stormwater Management Departments and Keep Lubbock Beautiful. The hotline is designed to allow citizens to report dump sites within the city limits and to report dumping inprogress. Once complaints are received, they will be marked as commercial or residential dumping. Environmental Health will oversee commercial dumping incidents while Code Enforcement will oversee residential dumping reports. The City will receive weekly reports and inspect as necessary. Several surveillance cameras are in use around the City to catch illegal duapers in the act. These hidden cameras have been successful in recording a number of illegal dumps.

TOP Hantavirus Diagnosis

Awaits Confirmation for

Health Department

A county physician has diagnosed the first probable case of Hantavirus Pulmonary Syndrome (HPS) since 2002. An independent laboratory has confirmed infection with the virus, and the City of Lubbock Health Department is waiting confirmation by the Texas Department of Health in the coming days.

Hantavirus is a viral infection caused by inhalation of aerosolized mouse waste (urine, feces, saliva), and in severe cases can be fatal. There is no specific treatment for HPS, but prompt recognition and aggressive supportive care favor a desirable health outcome.

The Health Department recommends the following steps the one can take to protect self and family from risk of infection with this virus.

1. Before occupying abandoned or unused cabins, open them up to air out for at least 30 minutes using ercos-ventilation is possible. Inspect for rodents and do not use cabins if you find signs of rodent infestation.

2. If you sleep outdoors, check potential campsites for rodent droppings and burrows.

3. Do not disturb rodent burrows or dens as niight be found when hunting, camping or hiking.

4. Avoid sleeping near wood piles or garbage areas that may be frequented by rodents.

5. Store food (pet food, or human food) in rodent-proof containers and promptly discard, lems immediately, especially if. bury, or burn all garbage.

money, it is put to good use to educate our children and provide other essential state services, but I would much rather give it back to its rightful owners, especially in these tough economic times."

the Unclaimed Property List

In addition to checking the Unclaimed Property List in the newspaper, Strayhorn urges Texans to visit her Unclaimed Property Web site, www.window.state.tx.us/up. The site contains the names of unclaimed property owners on this year's list and from previous years. The online database also

includes unclaimed property owners who have less than \$100 in unclaimed property, whose names are not published on the newspaper list.

Unclaimed property can be anything from a forgotten rent or utility deposit, to an uncashed check, a dormant bank account or an abandoned safe deposit box. Banks and businesses turn these assets over to the state after three to five years if the owners cannot be found, but unclaimed property continues to belong to its rightful owners. There is no time limit to claim the money.

Since Strayhorn took office, she has returned more than \$300 million in unclaimed property to its owners.



Darkness settles and Jack-o-fantern's ghoulish smile beckons little ghosts and hobgoblins to come out to play. In hopes that all the night's partakers return home safe and sound, the Texas Department of Safety is reminding Texans to be safe and responsible this Halloween.

"Halloween is a fun time for both children and adults, but oftentimes people act or drive carelessly or are not aware of their surroundings," said Col. Thomas A. Davis Jr., director of the DPS. "Many pedestrians will be on the streets, and drivers need to watch for them."

To prevent tragedy befalling our children, motorists are urged to drive slowly in neighborhoods and to be on the lookout for trick-or-treaters.

Safety tips for trick-or-treaters include:

- -Look both ways before crossing roadways. Always walk, don't ran.
- -Cross the roadway at intersections and crosswalks when possible.
- -Avoid toy gans and knives-they could be mistaken for the real thing.

---Wear costumes that are light in color, and short enough to avoid tripping. -Wear shoes that fit

--- Reflective material of some kind on the costume is strongly encouraged. -Avoid masks-use face paint instead for better visibility and peripheral vision.

--- Travel in groups with adult supervision.

-Do not enter the cars and homes of strangers. Avoid home, without visible porch lights.

-Carry a flashlight and make sure an adult accompanies small children. Exercise caution when crossing streets.

-Never trick-or-treat in unfamiliar areas.

-Take all treats home for an adult to inspect before cating anything. Never cat unwrapped candy.

-Make sure children know their home phone number and how to call 9-1-1 (or their local emergency number) if they have an emergency or become lost.

Neugebauer Advances Tech Forensics

Washington, D. C. -Congressman Randy Neugebauer announced a federal grant Friday of \$248,375 to expand the Texas Tech lastitute of Forencic Science by creating a Forensic Crime Lab and autopsy video training system. The grant comes from the Department of Justice's National Institute of Justice.

The major focus of the Institute is to assist those combating terrorism attacks through forensic methcds. The new toxicclogy laboratory will have biological and chemical agent testing capability as wee as post-mortem poison research capacity. The innovative autopsy telecommunication system will allow law enfo. cement agencies, which are located in remote areas to view autopsies and interact with the pathologists during procedures. This continuous loop between

forensics and law enforcement will Neugebauer for his help, permit the investigations to proceed much more swiftly.

"This grant allows Texas Tech to quickly provide services in the city of Lubbock rather than seeking assistance from overworked companies in the surrounding areas. The twofold advantages of education and feasibility make this project a worthwhile endeavor," stated Neugebauer.

The new lab will cut costs form previously outsourced services and provide a new educational experience to Texas Tech students. Because state crime labs are often backlogged, this new facility will improve response time of laboratory analysis.

Dr. M. Roy Wilson, President of the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center, expressed his gratitude to Congressman

"Obtaining this important funding is critically important in launching the newly established Texas Tech Institute for Forensic Sciences. This funding will allow us to begin development of a state-of-tne-art forensic toxicology laboratory at the Health Sciences Center that will be invaluable to our forensic science education and research programs as well as our on-going forensic pathology services to communities in this region."

Dr. Wilson added that the grant will also fund a pilot project to assess the feasibility of using the Health Science Center's advanced teleconmunications technology to provide tele-forensic services to other West Texas law enforcement agencies."



Business Personal Property and Tax Amnesty

Texas business owners, unlike homeowners, pay property taxes not only on their real property but also on tangible personal property that is used in the operation of their businesses. Taxable business personal property items include but are not limited to: furniture, fixtures, equipment, heavy machinery, computers, vehicles, aircraft, tanks and fuel dispensing equipment.

Business owners are required to file an annual report of their business personal property, called a rendition, with the appraisal district where the property is located. However, since the law previously provided no penalty for not rendering, a substantial number of businesses have not filed a rendition as required by law.

A recent law passed by the Texas Legislature, Senate Bill 340 (SB340) imposes moretary penalties for not filing renditions. For 2004 and future years the penalty for failure to timely file a complete rendition is 10% of the total amount of taxes imposed on the property for

2003 to ensure all of their business personal property is taxed for 2003.

This week those businesses that did not render this year, are being mailed a Special Amnesty Program Confidential Rendition for 2003 and a letter explaining the new law. Any business owner who believes that their personal property account(s) may have omitted property is eligible for amnesty from back assessments for 2001 and 2002, if they complete this special amnesty rendition form and return it to the appraisal district on or before December 1, 2003.

Because of this new law it is likely that previously unreported business assets will be discovered and back assessed for 2001, 2002, and 2003 as required by law. However, the Legislature included in SB340 a one time annesty period from having omitted property added to the 2001 and 2002 tax rolls. To obtain amnesty for 2001 and 2002, an owner must act before December 1





Happiness: A Study

By Ruth Oron

For years I was unhappy. Like many other people, I was consumed with thoughts about how others didn't see me right and I felt hurt and angry most of the time. It never occurred to me that I was actually unhappy because I was so little interested in me in being fair to anything. I learned from Aesthetic Realism, the education founded by the great poet and critic Eli Siegel, that ethics and happiness are deeply related. We can't be selfish and careless about ethics and expect to be happy, in fact, it is impossible.

Recent issues of the international periodical The Right of Aesthetic Realism to Be Known serialized a 1949 lecture by Eli Siegel, "Aesthetic Realism and Happiness." In it he said:

"Happiness can be defined as the feeling that what one wants is going along with what the world is or does. That is what it deeply is: the utmost affirmation of oneself with the utmost acceptance of what is not oneself."

I had thought as many women do, that if I could just find the right man and build my life around him I would be happy. But this never worked. In her editorial commentary Ellen Reiss, Class Chairman of Aesthetic Realism explains:

"[T]he one way we will be happy is through feeling that we are related to everything, the universe while putting aside everything else: not just a "significant other" or nephew or song or car or rug or film or pastry or land-cape. All these can be beginning points for feeling we have to do with everything. But people usually try to be happy by making a smaller world in some way, selecting some persons and things from reality, and saying everything else doesn't matter much."

I will never forget the jcy I felt, when, after studying in Aesthetic Realism consultations and classes a very short time I was walking in my neighborhood in Queens and saw for the first time how I was related to things in the world. As I looked at the brilliant colors of the autumn leaves that had fallen on the earth - red, brown, ochre, dark burgundy, orange - I felt they were showing me how I wanted to be. They were a magnificent oneness of something flamingly exuberant and also fading. In their beauty, they made sense of the way I could swing painfully between being so lively one moment and then wanting to withdraw into myself and stay home in bed. "All beauty," Mr. Siegel explained, "is a making one of opposites, and the making one of opposites is what we are going after in ourselves." Seeing these leaves that fall I felt as never before that the world could make sense and that I could like myself. The greatest interference to happiness and the source of all injustice, Aesthetic Realism

"false importance or glory from the lessening of things not [one]self." I am so grateful I learned that the drive I once had to be disgusted with things and people was contempt, and although I got a triumph feeling I was superior to nearly everything and everyone, this was the reason I felt miserable. I came to see I had been missing out on the real pleasure and wonder of seeing what people and things are and how they could add to me, have me know myself.

A large reason why I feel impelled to have what Aesthetic Realism says on this subject known is that I am sure if people are happier our dear world will be a kinder and safer place. In order to really feel good, I learned, we need to ask and answer these ethical questions: "Am I just to other people and things?" and "Do I see other people's feelings as real as my own?" Through the education of Aesthetic Realism, people feel that their happiness is solidly based - that is the real thing at last!



ORDINANCE NO. 2003-00110 FRANCHISE AGREEMENT

ORDINALCE GRANTING TO SOUTHWESTERN PUBLIC SERVE'E COMPANY THE REHT PRIVILEGE AND FRANCHISE TO CONDUCT WITHIN THE CITY OF LUBBOCK, TEXAS, AN LECTRICAL LIGRTING AND POWER BUSINESS AND TO ENTER UPON, ERECT CONSTRUCT, MAINTAIN XTEND, REPAIR, REPLACE AND REMOVE IN, UNDER, UPON, WITHIN, OVER, ABOVE, ACROSS AND ALONG INV AND ALL OF THE PRESENT AND FUTURE PUBLIC ROADS, HIGHWAYS, STREETS, LANES, AND ALLEYS OF THE CITY OF LUBBOCK, A SYSTEM OF POLES, POLE LINES, TOWERS, DISTRIBUTION LINES, TRANSMISSION 5. CABLES, CONDULTS, TRANSFORMERS, AND OTHER DISTRIBUTION AND TRANSMISSION EQUIPMENT, FACILITIES AND APPURTENANCES NECESSARY OR TROPPR FOR THE TRANSMISSION AND DO ELECTRICITY INTO, IN, WITHIN, FROM, ACROSS, AND THROUGH THE CITY OF LUBBOCK, A STING, OR AS SAID CITY LIMITS MAY HEREAFTER BE EXTENDED; AND GRANTING SPS. ITS SUCCE IGNS, THE AUTHORITY TO USE SLICH FOR THE PORPOSE OF TRANSMISSION, DISTRIBUTION SALE OF ELECTRICITY TO THE CITY, AND TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE CITY, OF AN PERSON OF PERSONS, FIRMS OR CORPORATIONS, WHEREVER LOCATED WITHIN OR WITHOUT THE CITY LIMITS OF LUBBOCK, FOR USE BY SUCH PURCHASES OR PURCHASEES FOR ANY PURPOSE ATTINO-RIZED BY LAW FOR WHICH ELECTRICITY MAY BE USED OR FOR ANY OTHER PERPOSE OR USE WHICH IS OR MAY BECOME NOBMAL OR CUSTOMARY IN THE REFAIL ELECTRIC INDUSTRY IN TEXAS, PROVIDING 24AI THIS FRANCHISE MIALL BE EFFECTIVE FOR A PERIOD OF TWENTY (20) YEARS COMMENCING UPON AND EXTENDING FROM THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE AFTER FINAL PASSAGE HEREOF. PROVIDING FOR THE TEMPORARY REMOVAL, RAISING OR LOWERING BY SPS OF ITS WIRES AND OTHER APPURTE NANCES: PROVIDING FOR THE RIGHT TO, AND CONDITION OF, THE OPENING OF PAVEMENTS AND SIDE. WALKS BY SPS; RETAINING ALL RIGHTS OF CITY TO REGULATE THE LOCATION OF SPS'S FACILITIES IN, UPON, ALONG, UNDER AND OVER THE STREETS, ALLEYS APD OTHER PUBLIC PLACES OF CITY, AS WELL AS TO REQUIRE THE RELOCATION OF SAME: PROVIDING FOR EFFICIENT ELECTRICAL SERVICE AND THE MAIN-TAINING OF SPS'S FACILITIES: PROVIDING FOR THE USE BY CITY FOR THE PURPOSES SPECIFIED OF POLES AND CONCUTS OF SPS: PROVIDING COMPENSATION, AND METHOD OF PAYMENT OF SUCH, TO THE CT FOR THE USE BY SPS OF THE STREETS, ALLEYS AND PUBLIC WAYS OF THE CITY, AND FOR SPS'S RECOVERY OF SUCH FEE: PROVIDING FOR THE MAINTAINING OF RECORDS BY SPS WITH RIGHT OF INSPECTION BY CITY RESERVING TO CITY ALL POWERS OF REGULATION, PROHIBITING ASSIGNMENT EXCEPT PY CONSENT BY CITY EXCEPT IN CERTAIN CASES, GIVING CITY'S CONSENT TO THE CUTTING AND TRIMMING BY SPS OF CONFLICTING TO EFS; FROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE, PROVIDING THAT THIS FRANCHISE SHALL NOT BE EXCLUSIVE: MAKING MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS RELATIVE TO THIS GRANT OF FRANCHISE: REPEAL ING ALL PREVIOUS ELECTRICAL LIGHTING AND POWER FRANCHISE ORDINANCES AND RELATED RELEASE.

PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THIS FRANCHISE ORDINANCE AND ITS ACCEPTANCE BY 2"S. WHEREAS, the Gity granted to Southwestern Public Service Company ("SPS") a franchise to operate and ma an electric system in the City of Lubiock via Ordinance No. 8341 finally passed by the City Council on July 22, 1982.

WHEREAS, the electrical lighting at a power franchise previously granted by the City Council of the City of Lubhock expired on September 10, 2002, and it appearing to this Council that Ge renewal of the franchise that has expired is expedient and wise, and will be of benefit to both SPS and the City of Lubhock, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LUBBOCK, TEXAS:

Franchise Authorization

That subject to the terms, conditions, and provisions of the ordinance, the City of Lubbock. Texas, bereinafter referred to as "City", does hereby grant unto Southwestern Public Service Company, a corporation incorporated under the laws of the State of New Mexico, having a permit to do business in the State of Texas, hereinafter referred to as "SPS", its successors and assigns, the right, privilege and franchise to conduct an electrical lighting and power business within the boundaries of the City of Lubbock, as such boundaries now exist or may hereafter be extended.

SPS shall have the right to enter upon, erect, construct, maintain, extend, repair, replace, and remove in, under, apon, within, over, above, across and along any and all of the present and future public roads, highways, streets, lanes, alleys and other public rights-of-way of the City now or hereafter owned or controlled by the City a system of poles, pole lines, towers, distribution lines, transmission lines, underground and above ground lines, wires, guys, cables, conduits, transformers, and of er distribution and transmission equipment, facilities and appurtenances necessary, proper or reasonably needed for the transmission and distribution of electricity into, in, within, from, across and through the City as now existing or as the said City limits may hereafter be extended to the extent City is authorized to grant such right.

SPS is authorized to use said poles, lines, towers, wires, gays, conduits, transformers, and other distribution and transmission equipment, facilities and appurtenances for the transmission, distribution, delivery and sale of electricity to the City and to the inhabitants of the City or any other person or persons, firms or corporations wherever located for use by such parchaser or purchasers for any purpose authorized by law for which electricity may be used or for any other purpose or use which is or may become normal or customary in the retail electric industry in Texas.

II. Term and Deregulation.

The term of this franchise granted to SPS shall be for Twenty (20) years from the date the franchise becomes effective as outlined below. The franchise rights and privileges shall be in full force and effect December 1, 2003 or thirty (30) days from the last publication of this Ordinance, whichever occurs later, provided SPS has formally accepted this franchise as provided in Section XXII

III. Franchise Fee/Payment

As compensation and rental for the use of the streets, alleys and public ways of City in the conduct of its business under this franchise, SPS shall puy the City each year of the life of this franchise, beginning December 1, 2003; a sum of money equal to five percent (5%) of the minual gross receipts of SPS from its retail electric lighting and power sales for consumption within the corporate limits of the City. All amounts payable to the City under this section shall be surcharged to SPS's costomers taking electric service within the corporate limits of Lubbock. The franchise payments shall be due and payable monthly with the first payment to be due and payable on January 15, 2004. Each subsequent payment shall be due on the 15th day of each month thereafter for the remaining life of this franchise. Each payment shall be based on the gross receipts of SPS during the preceding calendar month. Said monthly payments above provided shall be exclusive of and in addition to ad valorem taxes.

All money due and payable to City by SPS computed under the terms of the previous franchise shall be payable to the time that computation begins under this franchise.

- Any and all such payments made by SPS pursuant to this Section shall be credited on any amount imposed, levied or Any and all such payments made by SPS pursuant to this Section shall be redited on any amount imposed, levied or assessed against SPS by the City of Lubbock, pursuant to ordinance or otherwise, at any time as a charge (whether designated as tental, tax or otherwise) for the use by SPS of City's streets, alleys and public ways. The term "gross receipts" as herein used, shall include all receipts from the sale of electric lighting and power in SPS's certificated territory in the corporate limits of Lubbock. Texas. The term "gross receipts" shall also include all res, commissions, collections, rema, revallies, and any income associated directly or indirectly with the sale of electric lighting and power within the corporate limits of Lubbock. Texas. Notwithstanding the general definition above, "gross receipts" shall not include revenues collected for franchise fees or sales taxes, and does not include bad debt from gross receipts" shall not include revenues collected for franchise fees or sales taxes, and does not include bad debt from gross receipts." Any covenue subsequently received by SPS that was previously determined to be had debt by SPS shall be subject to the franchise fee. SPS's wholesale sale of electric lighting and power to the City's municipally owned electric utility are not covered by this Franchise Agreement

Provided further, that no part or portion of this Section shall ever be construed as requiring SPS to make ... additional expenditure over and above its normal and ordinary cost, and if the City's requirements hereunder cause an additional cost of expense in collarging, removing, adding to or otherwise changing SPS's facilities. City shall reimbar e SPS for the full amount of such costs. SPS shall not in any case be liable for damages or claims of damages to any person or persons arising from or growing out of the attachment of City's equipment, or arising from or growing out of the construction, operation or mainter-nee of such factilities. The City further agrees to indemnify and hold SPS aarmitess from any and all damages or claims for damages by reason of the construction, reintenance or operation of the City's facilities as set forth in this Section.

XII. Annual Receipts Report Right to Audit

SPS shall on the 1st day of February of each year of the life of this franchise, file or cause to be filed, a statement, eec tified by a doly qualified officer of SPS, showing the gross receipts of SPS within the City of Lubbock (as defined above) dur ing the twelve months ending on the 31st day of December immediately preceding. For the purpose of determining the amount of the gross receipts of SPS, SPS shall keep in its office at the disposal of and open to inspection by any auditor inthorized and appointed by City at all reasonable times, books of accounts and other records showing a full, true, complete and accurate account of the gross receipts of SPS from its electric lighting and power sales for consumption within the corporate limits of the City for the prior three calendar years.

XIII. Indemnification

SPS thall indemnify and save the City harmless from all claims, demands or causes of action brought against the Cit occasioned by or unising out of the construction, reconstruction, maintenance, or repair of SPS's electrical lighting and power system, or in any way growing out of the granting of this franchise either directly or indirectly, provided, however, that the provi sions of this Section shall not be applicable to any clauns, damages, actions or causes of actions proximately resulting from the use by City, its officers, agents, representatives or employees, of SPS's poles and ductlines for the installation, maintenance or rensoval of City's equipment, as provided in Section XI, or for which the City is otherwise liable as provided herein.

XIV. Authority

In granting this franchise it is understood that the lawful power vested by law in the City to require all persons or corporations to discharge the duties and undertaking for the performance of which this franchise was made, is reserved; this gran s ruede subject to all the tights, powers and authorities either of regulation or otherwise reserved to the City by its Charler or by the general laws of the State.

XV. Assignment/Transfer of Franchisa

The rights, franchises and privileges hereby granted shall not be transferred or assigned by SPS except with the consent of the City Council of the City of Lubbock expressed by Ordinance passed by and City Council; provided, however, SPS may mortgage or pledge its rights hereinder for security or obligations owing by SPS, and provided further, that a transfer could be made in a merger consolidation or re-organization proceeding to which SPS is a party or to a subsidiary corporation or affili-ate corporation of SPS or wherein SPS sells its entire physical assets. It is specifically recognized that under the Public Utility Regulatory Act, Chapter 39, Restructuring of Electric Utility Industry, it is enticipated that at some date in the future SPS will unbundle into a power generation company, a retail electric provider, and a transmission and distribution utility. At the time of such unbundling to comply with retail electric deregulation, the franchise granted herein will go with the distribution utility and the franchise fee thereafter will be zalculated as provided in Section III of this franchise. In the event of contemplated transfer of this franchise, under the terms of this section permitting transfer without con-

ent of City Council, SPS shall notify the City of Labbock of the contemplated transfer by written notice delivered to the City Secretary not less than sixty (60) days prior to accomplishment of any merger, consolidation or re-organization proceeding or transfer of its entire physical assets; and will provide the City Council an opportunity to confer with the proposed transference concerning proper acceptance of the terms of this franchise.

Prior to exercising any rights hereunder, any purchaser or transferee of SPS shall file with the City Manager a written acceptance of this Canchine setting forth an agreement to be bound by all terms and provisions hereof. XVI. Tree Trimming

To the extent that the City has authority to do so, it gives to SPS, during the life of this franchise, the right, license, privilege and permission to term thees upon and overhanding the streets, alleys, sidewalks and public places of City, so as to prevent the branches of such trees from coming in contact with the wires or other equipment of SPS. SPS agrees that it will fully protect and indemnify City from any and all claims, demands, actions, causes of actions, damages and expenses arizing becaus of such trimming by SPS under the provisions of this Section.

XVII: Notice of Default

It is further understood and agreed to by SPS that the franchise fee authorized herein shall form the basis for which any franchise fee is authorized and calculated according to state law after retail electric deregulation is authorized by the State of Texas in the region which encompasses the City of Lubbook. This includes, without limitation, Sections 33.008 (b) and 39(402(b) of the Texas Utility Code

All franchise fees that SPS fails to pay within the time period specified in this section shall bear interest according to the following formula: for the period January 1 through June 30, the prime rate last published in the Wall Street Journal ir the proceeding December plus two percent (2%); and for the period from July 1 through December 31, the prime rate last published in the Wall Street Journal in the preceding June plus two percent (2%).

IV. Pole Location.

Within the streets or other public rights-of-way of the City, the location and route of all poles, stubs, gays, anchors, licos, conduits, underground duct lines, manholes, and cables placed and constructed and to be placed and constructed by SPS in the construction and maintenance of its electrical lighting and power system in, within, through, or under the streets, alleys, or other public rights-of-way of the City shall be subject to reasonable and proper regulation, control and direction of the City, or of the City official to whom such duties have been or may be delegated.

All poles, guys or anchors crected by SPS shall be so set that they will not cause diversion of surface waters in any gutter or drain so as to cause damage to adjoining property, and so that the same will interfere as little as practicable with the ordinary travel on the streets, sidewalks and other public rights of way of the City; the regulation and control herein reserved shall it clude, without limitation, the right of the City to require SPS, at SPS's expense: to relocate its poles, lines or conduits so as to permit the following activities undertaken by the City on its behalf.

- The widening or straightening of any street, alley or public right-of-way located within the City.
- The closing, opening or relocation of any street, alley or public right-of-way within the City.
- The location or relocation of any water or rewer lines within the City. €.,
- The changing of grade of any street, alloy, curb or sidewalk within the City. d.

6. The construction and maintenance of parks and other public improvements owned by the City of Lubbock located within the City.

In all cases where SPS is required to relocate, change the route of or the position of the poles. lines of the conduits, the City shall provide thirty (30) days advance written notice to SPS specifying the new location, route, or position of the poles, lines, or conduits involved. SPS shall be entitled to be pave for its cost and expenses of any relocation, raising or lowering of its wires, toquired by the City, pursuant to this Section or Section V, only if such expenses or costs are reimbursable or payable to SPS or the City by the State of Texas, the United States or my governmental agency or subdivision of either, whether directly or indirectly. However, nothing herein shall impose any obligation on the City to pay such costs and expenses except to the extent it actually receives funds from the United States, the Strie of Texas, or any governmental agency or subdivision of either, for the reimbursement or payment of same. The provisions of this section shall not apply to improvements made by SPS on proveeasements purchased by SPS and recorded prior to any dedication of any street, alley or public way. In this latter event SPS shall be reimbursed its costs and expenses of relocating facilities."

C Temporary Relocation

SPS, on writter, reconsible request of any responsible person, firm, corporation or governmental authority, shall relocate, mise or lower its wires, where located on, in, or over the streets, alleys and other public ways of City, temperarily to permit construction work in the vicinity thereof, or to permu the moving of booses or other bulky strugtures. The expense of such tem-porary relocation, raising or lowering of such wires shall be paid by the benefited party or parties, and SPS may require the payment in advance, being without obligation to remove, raise or lower its wires until such payment shall be made, provided, howover, that no such payment shall be required of the City except as provided in Section IV. SPS shall be given not less then seventy-two (72) hours prior written notice to arrange for such temporary with changes.

VI. Excavation of Sidewalks

If it becomes necessary in furnishing electricity as contramplated under this franching, the City grants to TPS this right and privilege to take up pavements and sidewalks, if any, in and upon said streets, alleys and highways in said Cny for the purpose or making such excession and installation as may be necessary, provided however, that SPS shall not take up or excession any pavement at any time without first scenario, the written permission of the City Manager or his designated representative, which permission will not be intreasonably withheld; and provided further, that all excessions and installations so max^o shall be performed in such manner as will cause the least reasonable inconventence to the public, and SPS shall pro-uptly restors or cause to be restored to as good condition as before working thereen all such pavements, sidewalks, screets, alleys or highways excavated by it to the reasonable satisfaction of the City Manager or his designated representative.

VII. Waiver

If any of the facilities installed by SPS hereunder shall be in any respect damaged or injured by the City or any of its officers, agents, representatives, or employees, in connection with the performance of any work or repairs that may be done upon the streets, avenues, alleys and other public places of the City of Lubbock, Lot not metading work or repair, for or related to the City's numicipally owned electric utility, SPS shall not be entitled to prosecute or metading a claim against the City of Lubback for any such damage or injurchso austained by it, except where such damages are the result of willful acts or gross neg-Lyence of the officers, agents, representatives or employees of City, and and right it hereby waived, provided, however, this acc ion shall not apply where such property is damaged or injured as a proximate result of installing, maintaining or removing ity's equipment upon or from SPS's poles, or in or from SPS's ductimes, as provided in Section XI hereof.

VIII, City's Sovereighty

The City, by the granting of this franchise, does not storrender or to any extent lose, wrive, imperil or lessen the lawful nowers and rights now or horizontative vested in the City under the Constitution and Statutes of the State of Texas and under the Inarter of the City to regulate the rates for services of SPS; and SPS, by its acceptance of this franchine, agrees that all such awful regulatory power and rights as the same may be from time to ame vested in the City shall be in full force and effect and subject to the exercise theread by the City at the City's discretion. Notwithstending anything contained in this ordinance to the contrast, all work done in connection with the constru-

tion, repair, intriotenance and operation of all facilities of SPS is subject to the continuing police power of the City, and subject to the continuing police power of the City, and subject to the continuing police power of the city of t authority specifically surrendered by the City herein.

It shall he SPS's obligation laneander to furnish efficience pleasies! service to used subdards of the industry for the asea. SPS shall agree every slightle consumer in the franchine of SPS repedlets of cost, amount of usage, consumer deposits, return on investment, access and other reasonable factors. SPS chall not discriminate against any preson, corporation, firm, or association in the charge for such electrical current or in the pervice rendered upder like chiromataness. SPS shall not directly or directly grant any discount or rebate, or give things of value to openinyon the rate schedule as appropriate

The franchise rights and privileges hereinabove granted to SPS, its successors and assigns are and shall be at all times during the term and life of this franchise, contingent upon the faithful and punctual performance of and compliance with all acts, requirements and provisions of this Ordinance, and any amendment hereof, by SPS, its officers, agents and employees or its part to be performed, complied with and abided by, and if at any time SPS shall refuse or fail to keep, perform, comply with and abide by all and singular the acts, requirements and provisions of this Ordinance, or any amendment, within sixty (60) day from receipt of written notice from the City Manager acting by Order of the City Connell setting forth in detail the facts const tuting default of SPS and what is required to cure such default; and upon continued failure of SPS to keep, perform, comply with and abide by such acts, requirements and provisions of this Ordinance or any mendment or failure to cure the default se forth in such written notice, the City Council-may terminate, at its option, this franchise and all privileges and rights herei granted to said SPS. The notice herein mentioned shall be sufficient, if given to the Manager of SPS in charge of its main office in the City of Lubbock

XVIII. Removal of Dangerous Objects

The City shall have power at any time to require SPS to remove and abate at its own expense any installation or struc ture that is dangerous to life or property, and in case SPS, after reasonable notice, fails or refines to act, the City shall have the power using reasonable means and methods to remove or abate the same at expense of SPS, all without compensation of liability for dumages to SPS.

XIX. Severability

If any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause or plirase of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be uncon stitutional, void or invalid (or for any reason upenforceable), the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

XX. Right of First Refusal

In the event that SPS should desire to sell, market or advertise, for sale, SPS's distribution system within the corporat limits of the City, then, and in that event, SPS shall, prior to selling its distribution system to any unaffiliated third party, notify the City of the availability of SPS 's distribution system. The City shall, within thirty (30) days of the receipt of such notice provide SPS written notice of the City's intention to purchase SPS's distribution system. If the City provides SPS with written confirmation of its intention to purchase SPS's distribution system the City shall have an additional arxiv (60) days to Chercise the diligence and enter into a contract with SPS to purchase the entire distribution system belonging to SPS within the corpo rate limits of the City upon terms and conditions minually agreeable to the City and SPS.

XXI. Prior Franchise Repealed and Release

This franchise replaces all former franchise ordinances granted to SPS or its predevessors, which are hereby repeated which repeat is effective as of the time the franchise horein granted takes effect. There is specifically and particularly repeated effective as of that time, Ordinance No. 8341 passed by the City of Lubbock on the second reading July 22, 1982, granting to Southwestern Public Service Company, its successors and assigns, a menchise for a period of twenty (20) years, as amended by Ordinance No. 9329 passed by the City of Lubbock on the second reading, February 8, 1990.

The City and SPS further release, acquit and forever discharge the other party for any further claims or unresolved issue arising out of any audit conducted by the City regarding the prior franchise and the method of calculating the franchise fee for the period between the termination of the prior franchise and December 1, 2002, the effective date of new definitions to be use in calculating the tranchine fee under this franchine. However, nothing contained herein relieves SPS of their obligation to coninne to pay a franchise fee to the City under the serons of the prior finitchise antil the effective date of this franchise and as outtined in Section III above.

XXII. Final Passage Acceptance.
