## Scott earns Tech's seventh All-America Honor of Championships

Senior finishes seventh in the 400M hurdles

SACRAMENTO, Calif. - On the final day of competition at the NCAA Championships, Texas Tech's senior hurdler Bryan Scott earned his second All-America accolade with a seventh-place finish in the 400M hurdles. The Lubbock native was the only Red Raider competing on the closing day of the national meet.

Scott clocked a time of 51.01, while LSU's Isa Phillips took the top spot with a run of 48.51. Scott adds the All-America title to his 2006 400M hurdle honor, when he finished eighth in a time of 50.69.

In final team standings, the Texas Tech women tied for 10th with 23 points, earning the team's top finish in school history. The squad was led by a firstand second-place effort by

Taking the women's title was Arizona State with 60 points, finishing seven points ahead of LSU. Big 12 members Texas A&M and Texas finished ahead of the Red Raiders, with the Aggies placing fourth and the Longhorns sixth. On the men's side, Florida State defeated LSU for the championship trophy, winning 54 points to 48. Texas finished as the top conference member as the Longhorns placed

guaranteed to all Americans. The Wikipedia encyclopedia defined "freedom of speech" in the following concept. "Freedom of speech is being able to speak freely without censorship. It is often regarded as an integral concept in modern liberal democracies. The right to freedom of speech is guaranteed under international law through numerous human rights instruments, notably under Article 19 of the Universal Declaration of Sen. Obama's pastor. Concern- Human Rights and Article 10 of the European Convention on Human Rights, although implementation remains lacking in many countries. The synonymous term freed of expression is sometimes preferred, since the right is not confined to verbal speech but is understood to protect any act of seeking, receiving and imparting information or ideas, regardless of the medium used.
