White Cop Shoots, Kills Off-Duty Black Cop in Harlem

Harlem, N. Y. -A white dary officer in plainclothes who was chasing a robbery suspect in East Harlem last might. The victim, a recently married father of a 1-year-old and 7-month-old from Brooklyn named Omar Ed-wards, had been an NYPD officer for two years and patrolled housing projects as part of the Housing Bureau Impact Response Team. Police sources say that when Edwards left duty and went to his car around 10:30 p.m., he found his driver's side window broken and a man inside searching for valuables According to the Post, he called 911 before confronting

the thief.

After a scuffle, the suspect, Miguel Santingo, slipped away and Edwards gave chase with his gun drawn. As the two men ran down East 125th Street between First and Second Actween First and Second Av caues, a team of three other plainclothes officers came upon them in their car Police Commissioner Ray Kelly told reporters last night that the unnamed white officer who fired on Edwards is a four-year veteran of the de-partment, and be discharged six rounds from his 9-mil-limeter Glock, hitting him in

the arm and chest. One police source tells the Daily News, "This is always a black cop's fear, that he'd be mistaken for a [suspect].

Another source tells the Times that officers at the scene only learned that Ed-wards was NYPD "when scene only learned that Ed-wards was NYPD "when they ripped open his shirt in an effort to revive him and saw a Police Academy T-shirt." They then found a badge in his pocket, he died less than an hour latter at Harlem Hospital Center Po-lice are now investigating whether the officers identi-fied themselves or ordered fied themselves or ordered Edwards to drop his weapon before the one officer fired. The News's source insists they did identify themselves. yelling, 'Police! Stop! Drop it!' But when Edwards turned around to comply, the other officer opened fire. Santiago, the alleged car thief, was ap-

Twenty year-old by-stander, Maalik Lane, was at a nearby bus stop when he heard more than five gun-shots, telling the Times, "I saw police, up to 20 police cars I was, like, someone is having a shootout with po-lice. The bus driver said, 'Somebody shot the police' I teared for my life." Another

local tells the Post the scene after the shooting "was very chaotic. I heard a lot of police officers. They were hugging each other, and when I asked a cop what happened he said, 'Leave me alone." And the Daily News tracked down Edwards's mom at her Brooklyn home, where she said, "I'm burt that they took my son. That's my baby they took from me. And all I got was his last lug and kiss when he went to work [tomght] and he said, 'Ma, I'll see you when I

Mayor Bloomberg told reporters, "The police commis sioner and I just talked to Officer Edwards' widow, and the widow's father, who hap pens to be a 19-year veterar of the NYPD. We both ex of the NYPD. We both ex-pressed our condolences on behalf of the city. There is nothing you can ever say to bring back the deceased. While we don't know all the details of what happened tonight, this is a tragedy. Rest assured that we will find out exactly what happened here, and we will learn from it so it doesn't happen again."



Law Center wrote the follow-ing on 8/12/09: "The 1990s saw the rise and fall of the

"Patriot" movement, made up of paramilitary militias, tax defiers and so-called "sover-eign citizens" Sparked by a combination of anger at the federal government and the death of political dissenters at Rudy Ridge, Idaho, and Waco, Texas, the movement took off in the middle of the decade and continue to grow even after 168 people were left dead by the 1995 bomb-ing of Oklahoma City's federal building - an attack, the deadliest ever by domestic deadliest ever by domestic U.S. terrorists, carried out by men steeped in the rhetoric and conspiracy theories of the militias in the years that fol-lowed, a truly remarkable number of criminal plots came out of the movement. But by early this century, the Patriots had largely faded. weakened by systematic prosecutions, aversion to growing violence, and a new, highly conservative presi-

decade after largely disap-pearing from public view,

right-wing militias, ideologi-cally driven tax defiers and sovereign citizens are appear ing in large numbers around the country. "Paper terror-ism" - the use of property liens and citizens' "courts" to harass enemies—is on the rise. And once-popular mile. the conspiracy theories are making the rounds again, this time accompanied by nativist theories about secret Mexi-can plans to "reconquer" the American Southwest. One law enforcement agency had found 50 new militia training groups - one of them made up of present and former po-lice officers and soldiers. Au-thorities around the country are reporting a worrying uptick in Patriot activities and propaganda. "This is the most significant growth we've seen in 10 to 12 years," says "All it's lacking is a spark. I think it's only a mat-ter of time before you see threats and violence
