Traditionally, The Journals print the first letter to Santa for the year on the front page of the next issue after receiving the letter, and before forwarding it to the North Pole.

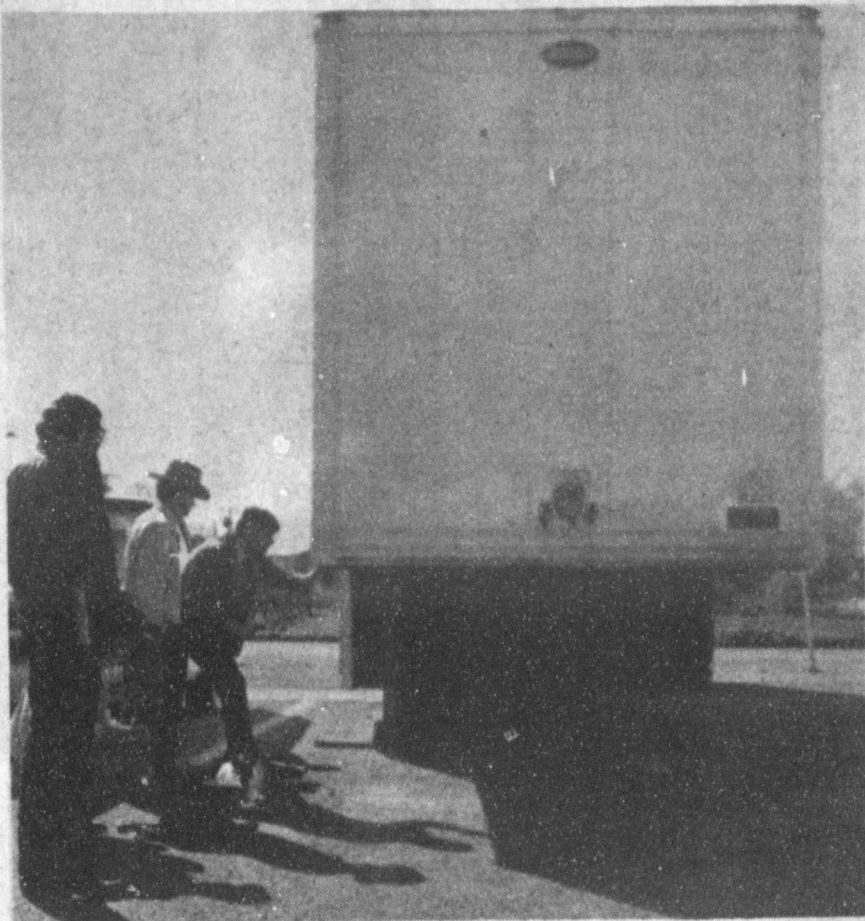
The following letter was the first, and was received in The Journal office around noon on Wednesday:

Farm Survival Meet Set To Aid Farmers

Five "down to basics" sessions of instruction to help area farmers and ranchers make the best of the agricultural economic situation will be featured December 17 in the annual South Plains Development Conference at the Lubbock Civic Center.

The sessions are designed to meet very real needs of agricultural producers in Bailey County, said Spencer Tanksley, county Extension agent.

"They will help you do a better job of managing, marketing a record keeping to obtain -- for you and your banker -- a clear picture of your situation," Tanksley said. He added that this is more necessary than ever if Bailey County farmers and ranchers are to survive the current crunch.

Indeed, "Managing for Survival" is the theme of the SPD Conference. It will begin at 9:30 a.m. and conclude at 3:00 p.m. The South Plains Development Program is a regional organization directed by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service to improve the economy and family life in a 20-county area.

U.S. Rep. Larry Combest (R-Tx) is scheduled to be the luncheon speaker. He is a member of the House Agriculture Committee.

Discussions at the program will key on financial practices, some possible solutions to

Former City Officer Hurt In Explosion

A former resident of Muleshoe, and 1970 graduate of Muleshoe High School, was seriously burned in an explosion at Bloomfield (N.M.) Refining Co. Monday night.

Thirty-three year old Cecil Cunningham, who formerly worked as a patrolman for the Muleshoe City Police Department before moving to New Mexico, is a patient at San Juan Regional Medical Center at Farmington, N.M. receiving treatment for second degree burns to his hands and face.

Bloomfield Fire Chief George Duncan said one explosion occurred about 8:25 p.m. (MST) Monday in an office of Bloomfield Refining Co. He said a second explosion ripped through the same offices at the refinery about 10 minutes later.

Cunningham, an employee of the Bloomfield Refining Co., is also a firefighter for the nearby community of Aztec.

The fire chief said there was no immediate estimate for the cost of the damages, but said the officer area was heavily damaged by smoke and fire. He also said Cunningham was "blown out a door," in the second explosion, and received his burns and injuries at that time. Also injured in the second explosion were four other persons, although none of the other four injured required hospitalization.

The injured man is the son of Hazel Cunningham, who operated 'Hazel's Stylette' in Muleshoe for a number of years before retiring and moving to Bloomfield nearly three years ago. He is a nephew of Mr. and Mrs. W.W. Wilson of Muleshoe.

Cunningham is married to the former Kathy Coker of Lazbuddie, and they are the parents of two daughters, Misty and Farrah.

THE Weather

What is the significance of the closeness of the lines on weather maps?
When the lines on the weather map in your newspaper are close together (these lines are isobars) that means pressure changes are great.
Isobars are merely lines connecting points on the map which have reported the same barometric pressure.
If the pressure differential is great, even over a short distance, winds, and probably stiff ones, are sure to be encountered. That means for all practical purposes, that the top of the great layer of gases surrounding the earth is extremely hilly, so that air rushes from high peaks into the valleys nearby at great speed.
This speed, or wind velocity, causes heavy wind. If the incline is not steep--the lines (or isobars) not close together--then the wind will flow more slowly, down a more gradual incline at the top of the layer of gas above you.
